AIR FORCE GENERAL WILL ADDRESS EXES LUNCHEON

Gen. B.A. Schriever, an important figure in U.S. development of missiles and the surge toward space, is guest speaker for the Slaton Ex-Student Reunion set here Saturday, July 3. The four-star general, who is a Slaton ex himself, is presently commander of the Air Force Systems Command, Abilene.

Gen. Schriever attended Slaton schools in 1918-20 and is related to W.J. (Bill) Klattenhoff, president of the Ex-Students Association.

As commander of AFSC, Gen. Schriever is responsible for research development, procurement and production actions required to place a complete aerospace system in operational use.

German-born, Texas-reared Gen. Schriever immigrated to the U.S. in 1917. After his father was killed in an industrial accident in San Antonio, the family moved to Slaton in 1920. His mother and eight years old, his mother and brother lived here from November 1918 to June 1920.

Graduating from Texas A&M in 1931, he started his military career that same year when he accepted a reserve appointment in the field artillery. Entering flight training at Randolph Field, the future general earned his wings and commission as a second lieutenant in the Army Air Corps Reserve in 1933 at Kelly Field.

After assignments to several bases, he went on inactive reserve status and accepted a position as a pilot with Northwest Airlines. Re-entering the service in 1936, he achieved the rank of major and served at Wright Field, then in 1941 entered Stanford University to earn a master's degree in astronomical engineering.

In June 1942, Major Schriever joined the Bomb Group in the Southwest Pacific. He participated in several campaigns. From 1946 to 1949, he was assigned as Chief of the Scientific Liaison Section under

The Deputy Chief of Staff, Gen. Schriever graduated from the National War College in 1950, then returned to USAF headquarters as Assistant for Development Planning. 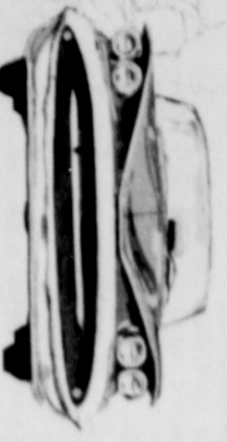
