



Texas To The Rescue

The plight in Korea of three Marines from Louisiana is distressing beyond words. The two sergeants and a corporal are in a platoon commanded by a Texan, who flys a large Texas flag in front of his command post. This leads passersby to greet all platoon members with "Hi, Texas!"

The three Louisianians write their Sen. Russell Long, complaining of the "indignity" of being mistaken for Texans. They want a Louisiana flag, a big one, and right now. But the Senator is having the dickens of a time in finding one.

Texans can well understand the humiliation suffered by anyone mistaken for a Texan yet unable to claim, in fact, that he is one. Simply humility calls for relief of these three close neighbors. Governor Shivers should at once ask our Legislature to extend the eastern boundary of Texas, for the duration at least, to include the Bayou State. Our Lone Star Flag is a mantle big enough to enfold the less fortunate under its protecting efflugence.

Retirement Looks Best To Youth

Retirement Looks Best To Youth

Retirement looks rosy only from a distance, according to an insurance survey which was discussed Wednesday at an old-age institute at the Episcopal Church of the Incarnation. The report on attitudes toward retirement was made by Dr. Evelyn M. Carrington, professor of psychology at Texas State College for Women in Denton.

She was the main speaker at the all-day meeting sponsored by the Dallas County Mental Health Society.

Dr. Carrington said that a major insurance company in a recent poll of its policyholders learned:

1. One-third wanted to work as long as they could.
2. One-third would like to "ease up" in later life to have time to do some of the things they always wanted to dobut ont quit altogether.

3. The others said they really looked forward to retiring. But these, significantly, were almost all young people.

"It is easy to say at twenty that you want to retire at sixty, for that seems a long time off. You are not likely to say the same thing at fifty-five."

She suggested as one solution to the fast-growing problem of unhappy oldsters a better preparation for retirement.

"Maybe when you retire you plan to write that book, or grow a wonderful garden, or paint. But you can not wait until retirement to start. You should learn something of writing or gardening or painting as you go along."

She scored the popular belief that old age is synonymous with degeneration. She cited Gen. Douglas MacArthur and Bernard Baruch as stellar examples of the contrary.

"We must discard that feeling of resignation—that attitude of being old and there's nothing we can do about it."

Dr. Carrington suggested that young and middle-aged adults might learn a lesson from youngsters in getting along happily with older people. Children usually get on well with the old folks, notably their grandparents.

Last year, Dr. Carrington reported, there were eleven and a half million Americans over sixty-live, and this is expected to reach twenty-two million by 1988.

Old age, said Dr. Carrington, does not necessarily change people but only accents their original sualities.

"If you're generous, you grow more so; if you're stings, the years increase the stinginess; a friendly persons gets friendlier, and an isolated individual keeps more and more to himself." —The Dallas News.






