## Lee Cockrell On "County Leadership" <br> Nevrs Relcase $\$ 6$ Feiruary 12, 1998

Years ago you could find people at home during the day, early evening, or on week ends. Now everyone works just to make ends meet. I will continue to send my campaign messages to the voters in news releases. Years ago the average income tax was $15 \%$. Now it is about $40 \%$. I have a question for you. If the church makes it on $10 \%$ donations, why does the government need $40 \%$ ? Our churches have businessmen as money managers, could be the answer. They are much better managed than the government. The people can take back government, a precinct, a county, and one distriet at a time. The public has to care enough to go vote.

County governmert goes back to England over 2,000 years ago. Carson County was created in 1876 from the Baxer Territory and became an organized county in 1888. My great-grandfather Garrison settled on several thousand acres near Pantex in 1891. He dug a 350 ' well in 1892. My other great-grandfather Ingrum settled in southwest Carson County north of Washburn in 1896. They were both county leaders. They served when asked to.

In the 1890's a county judge was selected by the residents. The residents also selected assembly men, now called commissioners to represent the public. They met one day each month without pay. Their duties were to hire a tax assessor-collector, hire a school teacher, hire a sheriff, and hire someone to maintain the roads and bridges. The county judge set the selaries and managed the county business. He still does. Now the Carson County judge sets salaries, proposes a budget, and decides how two million dollars ( $\$ 2,000.000 .00$ ) each y ar will be spent. The judge's job as county manager and budget
director is a very important job. He also proposes tax increases.
Ail of the heretofore mentioned jobs are now elected. At one time all county jobs were filled by civic minded citizens without pay. Now most of your elected officials are just looking for a job or a better job than the one they have. Polls show that very few people now run for an office because they want to serve, contribute, or even have cause. The jobs are all about money. Hey, I am just telling it like it is

The 26 cents per month surcharge would not be billed to customers who receive ELC. However, customers who receive ELC and pay less than the maximum $\$ 3.50$ a month residential ELC charge or less than the maximum $\$ 7$ business ELC charge will have to pay the additional 26 cents per month charge.
Expanded Local Calling wąs created in 1993 by Texas egislation that requires telephone companies to provide toll-free calling between small towns that share a community of interest such as a school or hospital district. The legislation allows telephone companies to recover costs not paid through customer charges by ecoving a surcharge to all other customers in the state who do not receive the ELC service or who do not pay the do he maxi allowed under state law is $\$ 3.50$ per line for residen customers and $\$ 7$ per line for business customers.
Southwestern Bell estimates that the 26 cents per month per line charge will recover the $\$ 27$ million annual cost of providing ELC service that is not recovered from ELC rates
If approved by the PUC, the monthly statewide surcharge of 26 cents per line per month will begin with the April, 1998 billing cycles, with an agreement to refund all or part of the charge if the PUC does not approve it.
