There are a number of laws that apply to reckless driving. This is a very good reason to have a mobile phone. It would be helpful if you can keep the vehicle in sight or keep the vehicle in sight or

direction in which the direction in which the vehicle was traveling.
The reckless driver can be reported to any police agency by simply dialing 9-1. 1 on your mobile phone. Once located by police, the driver can be stopped and charged with following too closely, cutting in after passing, failing to signal, as well as reckless driving. In the most cases the reckless driver is usually the drunk driver, which guarantees trip to the county jail.
