## Loula Wall, Cecil Culver Named Groom Day Celebration Fiesta 90 Queen And King

The Groom Day Committee named Loula Wall and Cecil Culver, Oueen and King of the
Fiesta 90, Groom Day Celebration.
Both Loula and Cecil have been long-time residents of Groom contributing to the success of the community around them.
Loula Wall was born on Nov. 8, 1897 in Antelope, Texas. Her family moved to Jacksboro in 1900 where she went to school. Loula married Jim Wall of Jacks boro in 1915. After living in Jacksboro for ten years, the couple moved to Groom to live closer to Jim's mother live closer to Jim's mother, Jim's father died when he Jim's father died when

Loula is a survivor of her husband and both of her children.

Cecil Culver was born October 29, 1903 in Whitesboro, Tex, where he Whitesboro, Tex. where he He married Norene He married Norene Ragsdale in August of 1924. In 1929, Norene gave birth to Cecil, Jr. That same year, Cecil moved to Groom to accept the assistant casmier position at the State National Bank. Some of Cecil's duties were building a fire in the basement furnace every morning and bringing in a fresh bucket of water; there was no indoor plumbing. Three people worked in the bank with work hours being 7:30 a.m. until 5 or 6:00 p.m. Everything went fairly well until the depression set in around the early thirties. Those years were difficult because there was no money to lend to the customers. Toward the end of the thirties improvements were noted.
In 1932, Cecil was elected cashier and managing officer of the bank, elected a

The indictment returne Thursday by a Carson Kenneth Grand jury name Kenneth Glenn Milner Panhandle on a charge of murder in connection with the Friday the 13th shooting death of Frankie Gasper Garcia, a 17 -year-0ld Panhandle High School student.
Milner was indicted on two charges of attempted murder in the stabbing of Jimmy Britten of Groom and in the wounding of Panhandle High School principal Ken Williams during the early hours of July 14.
Sources have confirmed to The Pampa News that the grand jury was convened in the case less than a week after the murder and assaults because of what one termed "an iron-clad case, complete with confessions." Investigators contend that Garcia was shot as an occult sacrifice in a decaying barn located next to an banlocated next to an aban
doned farm house northwest of here known to local youth of here known to local youth Earlier this week, Carso Earlier this week, Carson David McCoy said "We're David McCoy said, "We re looking at the possibility of shooting death.

Britten was stabbed at his home about $1: 30$ a.m. Saturday, a few hours after Garcia day, a few hours after Garcia
was shot to death. He was was shot to death. He was
treated at a local hospital and released the same day. About two hours later, officers said, Williams was shot twice through the door of his home.
Williams, formerly the assistant principal at Horace Mann Junior High School and baseball coach at Amarillo Palo Duro High School, was wounded in the abdomen and leg. He was listed in satisfactory condition at Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo Thursday.

District Judge John T. Forbis of Childress issued a gag order in the case earlier this week, restricting law enforcement agencies from releasing information pertaining to Milner's activities.
But he designated McCoy as official spokesman for the case.
Steve Sherwood, who graduated from Panhandle High School with Milner las year, said Milner was open about his involvement with the occult.
It wasn't a secret, he told people about it," Sherwood said. "He told a group I was in that he worshiped the devil."
Milner had no prior criminal record, Panhandle police said, but they noted that an officer helped talk Milner into climbing down from the city's water tower from thee years ago when he three tened suicide.
threatened officials said no Court officials said no attorney had been Milner, yet to defend Mrer, preventing him from being arraigned on the three charges. Appointment of an attorney should come wit a week, Forbis said.

Cecil Culver was born October 29, 1903 in Whitesboro, Tex. where he graduated from high school. He married Norene Ragsdale in August of 1924. In 1929, Norene gave birth to Cecil, Jr. That same year, Cecil moved to Groom to accept the assistant cashier position at the State National Bank. Some of Cecil's duties were building a fire in the basement furnace every basement furnaceing in fresh bucket of water; there fresh bucket of water, there was no indoor plumbing. Three people worked in the bank with work $5: 30$ being 7:30 a.m. until 5 or 6.00 p.m. Everything went fairly well until the depression set in around the early thirties. Those years were difficult because there was no money to lend to the customers. Toward the end of the thirties improvements were noted.

The indictment returned Thursday by a Carson County grand jury names Kennty grand jury names Kenneth Glenn Milner of Panhandle on a charge of murder in connection with the Friday the 13th shooting death of Frankie Gasper
Garcia, a 17-year-0ld Garcia, a 17-year-0ld
Panhandle High School student.
Milner was indicted on two charges of attempted murder in the stabbing of Jimmy Britten of Groom and in the wounding of Panhandle High School principal Ken Williams during the early hours of July 14.
Sources have confirmed to The Pampa News that the grand jury was convened in the case less than a week after the murder and assaults because of what one termed "an iron-clad case, complete with confessions."
Investigators contend that Garcia was shot as an occult sacrifice in a decaying barn sacrifice in a decaying barn
located next to an abandoned farm house northwest of here known to local youth of here known to local you
as "the haunted house."

Earlier this week, Carson Earlier this week, Carson County District Attorney David McCoy said, "We're looking at the possibility of shooting death hooting death.
Britten was stabbed at his home about $1: 30 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Saturday. a few hours after Garcia
was shot to death. He was was shot to death. He was
treated at a local hospital and released the same day. About two hours later,
officers said, Williams was shot twice through the door of his home
Williams, formerly the assistant principal at Horace Mann Junior High School and baseball coach at Amarillo Palo Duro High School, was wounded in the abdomen and leg. He was listed in satisfactory condition at Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo Thursday.
District Judge John T. Forbis of Childress issued a gag order in the case earlier this week, restricting law enforcement agencies from releasing information pertaining to Milner's activities.
But he designated McCoy as official spokesman for the case.
Steve Sherwood, who graduated from Panhandle High School with Milner last year, said Milner was open about his involvement with the occult.
It wasn't a secret, he told people about it," Sherwood said. "He told a group I was in that he worshiped the devil." devil.
Milner had no prior criminal record, Panhandie police said, but they noted that an officer helped talk Milner into climbing down from the city's water tower three years ago when he threatened suicide
Court officials said no attorney had been appointed yet to defend Milner, preventing him from being arraigned on the three charges.Appointment of an attorney should come within a week, Forbis said.
