Henderson discovered 791 pounds of marijuana among a load of apples. The estimated street value the marijuana is \$514,150.00. James Powell, 30 of Morrisville, PA was arrested and taken to the Gray Co. Jail. He was enroute from Yuma, Arizona to Everett, MA.




