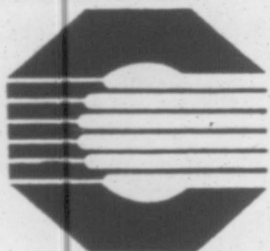

SENIOR CITIZEN MEETING

The Senior Citizens of McLean had an interesting meeting in May. Terri Adams from the Pampa Nursing Center spoke about Alzheimer's disease and the special secured unit available at the Pampa Nursing Center. Adams told the group that an estimated four million Americans have Alzheimer's disease. Alzheimer's disease is a degenerative brain that has no cure. Doctors do know that it is not caused by a vitamin deficiency or lack of oxygen. Researchers are not sure what caused the disease and diagnosis is only about 80 to 90

percent accurate.

Common symptoms to look for are recent memory loss, not the kind we all suffer from such as where the car keys are, but things such as what the car keys are for.

Difficulty performing familiar tasks such as cooking or bathing, using the wrong words in a sentence or forgetting simple words, poor judgement, mood swings, personality changes and loss of initiative are also symptoms of Alzheimer's. If you suspect any of these symptoms a doctor should be consulted.

Those that care for an Alzheimer patient must be sure to care for themselves too. Stress is a huge factor for the caregiver. Emotional symptoms may include depression, anger, guilt and feeling overwhelmed. Financial changes are also a big factor for the care giver. When these stressors get to be too much it may be time to choose a nursing center.

Families are encouraged to compare nursing facilities and may receive a check list by calling Terri Adams at the Pampa Nursing Center at 806-669-2551, ext. 23.

Trinity Baptist Church's Vacation Bible School finished up last week with a visit from Zacchaeus on Thursday night and a hamburger cook-out and presentation

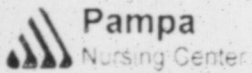
for the families on Friday night. Eighty-seven students participated and thirty-five adults. Average attendance was 60 for the five nights. Because the

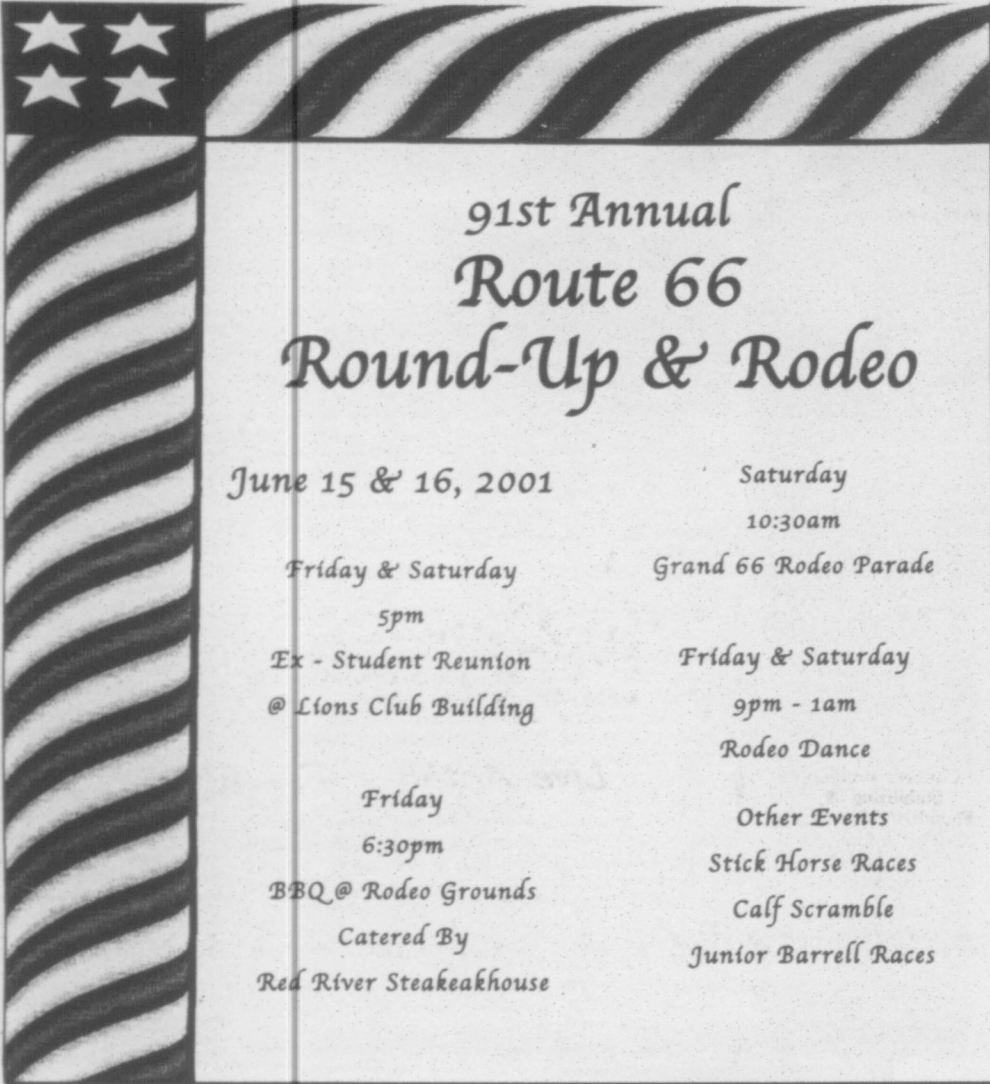
