

Difficulty performing familiar tasks such as cooking or bathing, using the wrong words in a sentence or forgetting simple words, poor judgement, mood swings, personality changes and loss of initiative are also symptoms of Alzheimer's you suspect any these symptoms a doctor should be consulted.

Those that care for an Alzheimer patient must be sure to care for themselves too. Stress is a huge factor for the caregiver. Emotional symptoms may include depression, anger, guilt and feeling overwhelmed. Financial changes are also a big factor for the care giver. When these stressors get to be too much it may be time to choose a nursing center.
