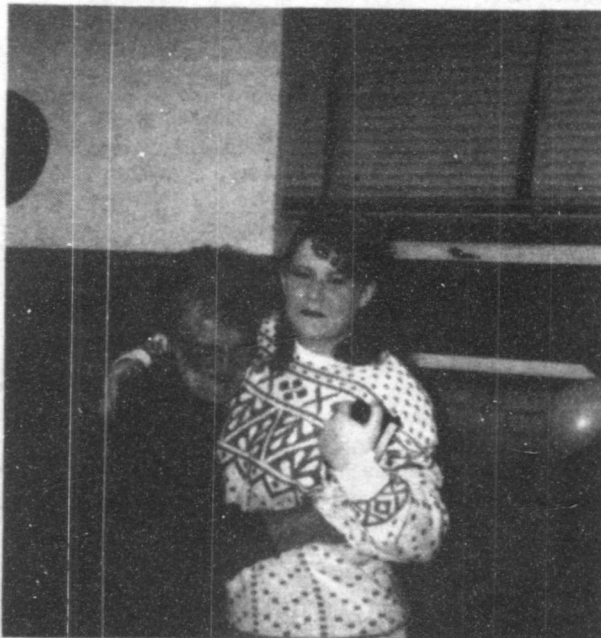
It was a very successful night; and we hope that the secret granddaughters put as much happiness and enjoyment into each grandparent's life as they did ours!

## Tax Protests Not Apparent, Supreme Court To Decide

As the deadline approaches, local property owners are still wondering whether or not to pay CED tax assessments which may be ruled unconstitutional.

County Tax Appraiser Dianne Lavake said in an interview on Monday, "Collections appear to be slower. We will know a lot more about it at the end of the month."

In order for tax payments to be protected if the C.E.D.'s are found unconstitutional, taxes must be paid under protest which means that a lawsuit must be filed.

County Clerk Sue Person stated, "At this time no one has filed such a suit in Carson County."

Many big businesses and property owners seem to be the ones filing suit in other areas. When a suit is filed the moneys paid are tied up in litigation and cannot be used.

Superintendent Ken Sweatt said "That would really hurt us if very much of our money was tied up in the courts."

The question no one can seem to answer is what happens if the Supreme

Court finds the CED's unconstitutional, and like a good citizen, one has paid their taxes before the deadline of January 31st. Will your money be refunded? Will you owe again for taxes for some new system of dispersal?

Lavake (County Appraiser) said on the matter of refunds. "No, your money has most likely already been spent on teacher's salaries, etc. It would not be refunded because it's been paid voluntarily."

Superintendent Sweatt stated that he did not feel that a property owner would be required to pay again.

There are many unanswered questions on this matter. It is an unprecedented situation because there is no example to compare it with. Most schools are operating on the assumption that the courts

will settle this and they will stay in operation just like always.

It is rumored that the Supreme Court will rule on this matter about February 4th, just after the deadline to pay property taxes.

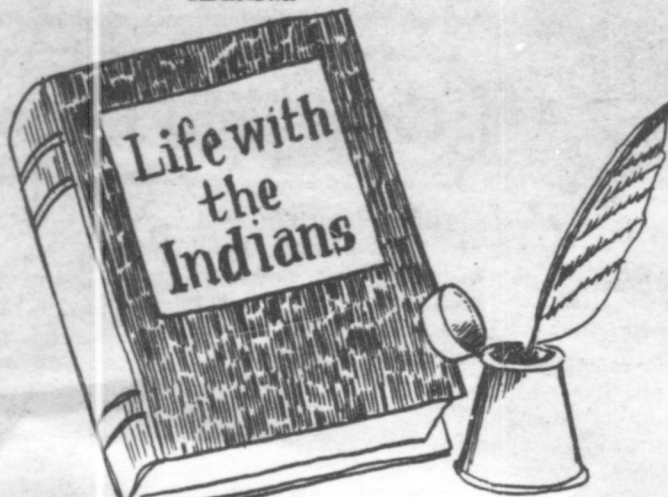

# Amarillo Using More Water Than Alloted

Persons attending the Board of Directors Meeting in the Panhandle Ground Water Conservation District office Wednesday, January 22, 1992, included Amarillo city officials, manager John Ward, utilities director Ron Freeman and hydrologist Ron Harden and approximately twenty concerned Carson Co. landowners.

Amarillo's city well field is located primarily in Carson County. The city's allotment is 4.7 billion gallons of water per year. In 1990, the city used about 20 percent more than that

and exceeded its allotment by more than 25 percent in 1991.

After a lengthy discussion, both sides agreed that a fair and equitable solution could be reached without taking the issue to court. Both groups agreed to work together during the next two months to develop a workable depletion plan.

C.E. Williams, District Manager, said the Board would like to see Amarillo use 100% of their Lake Meredith water and also develop their currently owned water rights in other areas so the city would not be using the water beneath neighboring wells. The newly proposed depletion rule will be the starting ground for the talks. This new rule is based on the volume of water calculated

off the saturated thickness.

"We'd like to help develop a reasonable rule that will benefit all," Mr. Ward said. "The Board has indicated it would like to see us develop other water rights. We need a plan that will give us enough time to do that."

"The water table in that area has the greatest draw-down of any area in Texas," said John Spearman, board president. "We've been concerned about this for some time."

The Board said it only wants to be fair and is trying to get Amarillo to spread its water usage around, a measure that would be good not only for the neighboring landowners, but also for the city, because it would extend the life of that water field.



"I want the sheriff's office and its department to have the respect of all people from pre-schoolers through senior adults," Brown said.

"We of Gray County are proud of our new jail. The criminals and the probation violators can now be dealt with more swiftly. On the other hand, the new jail has also caused great expense to our 1992 budget with a depressed economy and declining population, which puts a heavier burden on its residents. I believe in 'cut in spending' and will serve as conservatively as possible."

Brown said that he has many workable ideas that can be held accountable.

"We only need vehicles for those on duty, which would cut back at least half the present number. Uniforms can be a more modest expense along with being purchased locally. Everyone knows that teamwork works. With more citizen involvement

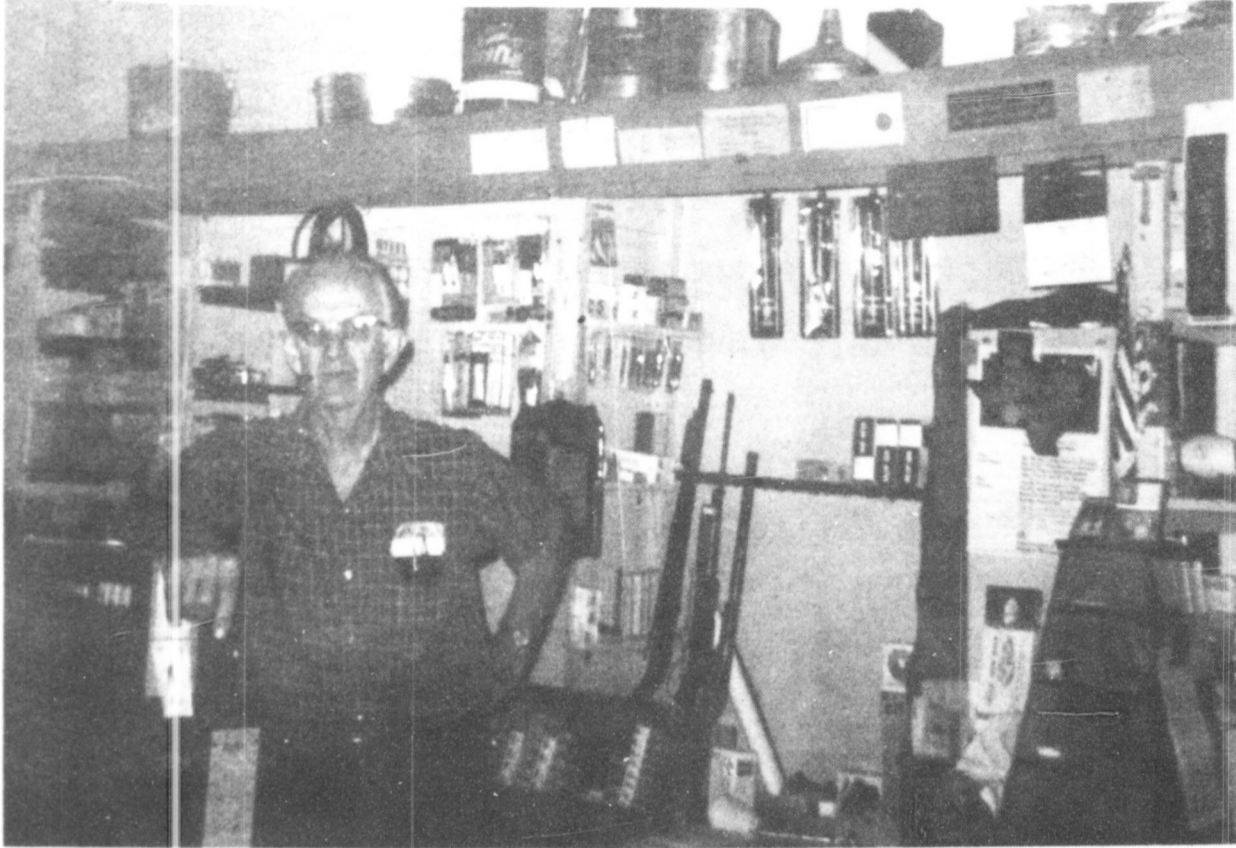
