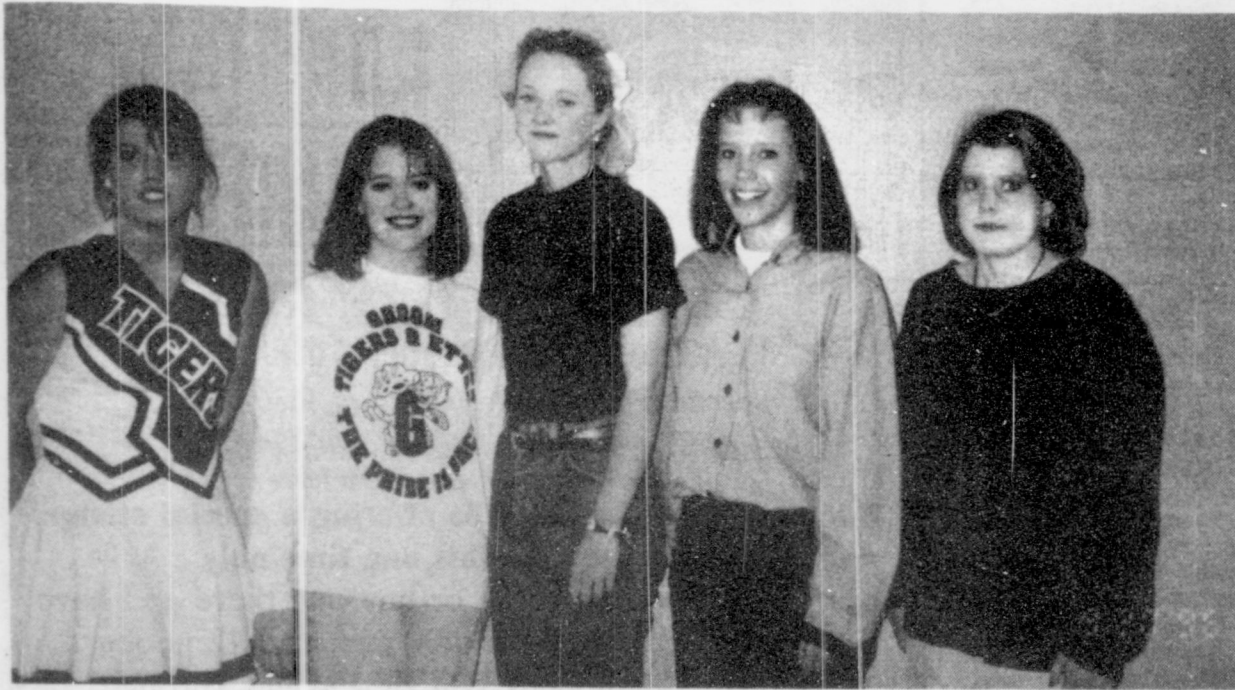

## Route 66 To Celebrate 70th Anniversary In Groom, Oct. 10th

The fabled Route 66 highway which ran from Chicago to Santa Monica, California is celebrating its 70th Anniversary with a run to the heartland.

"Some people say the halfway point of Route 66 is Adrian, others say it's Vega, so we decided to have the main celebration between

them at Landergin, which isn't even on the map," said George Rook, president of the Route 66 Association. "We're especially pleased because all eight states on Route 66 are working together on this project."

"Drivers will start at one end in Chicago and at the other end in Santa Monica

and meet at the middle on October 11th, Rook said.

Groom will have its own celebration on Thursday, October 10th in front of the mural downtown. A program commemorating the 70th Anniversary will begin at 9:30 A.M. Part of the celebration will include a "mobile Post Office" offering a special stamp cancellation honoring Route 66 in Texas. The "mobile Post Office" will be parked by the mural from 8:00 A.M. - 12 Noon. Groom's

cancellation will read "Repair and Care Station" in memory of the 16 service stations and garages who repaired and maintained the tourist's vehicles, and all the care that was given by the hospital and the local townspeople to meet the many needs of the Route 66 travelers.

## Oct. 16 Set To Begin Expanded Calling

Wednesday, October 16 is a date that Groom residents have long waited for. That is the day that Groom will be able to call Amarillo, Pampa and Panhandle just like it was a local call. As you may already know Groom can already call White Deer like a local call.

G.T.E. phone customers need to re-program their speed dialers using only the 7 digit phone number. That is the local number without the 1 or the area code.

People in Amarillo, Pampa and Panhandle will also be able to call Groom the same as a local call.

Unless a GTE customer subscribes to GTE's touch call service, those who own push button phones will need to set to "pulse" on the tone pulse switch.

The local expanded calling was passed by 70% of phone customers who returned ballots last year. Rates for the service are \$3.50 per month for

residential phone services and \$7.00 for businesses.

With the new improvements and updates on Groom's phone system several other services will now be available.

- Call Waiting - This service alerts you that another person is calling you when you are on the phone. You can take the call, or not, as you wish. By pressing the hook-switch, you can switch between callers.

- Three Way Calling - Talk to two different locations at the same time.

- Call Forwarding - Have your home phone call forwarded to another number.

- Automatic Call Return - Automatically dials last call received, even if you don't know who was calling.

- Calling Number Identification - Identifies the phone number of persons calling before you answer See Calling, pg. 5

## J.V. Tigers Trounce Chillicothe Eagles

The J.V. suited up only seven players for the game with Chillicothe and gave an outstanding effort in the victory. After a scoreless seesaw defensive battle for three quarters Groom scored midway through the 4th quarter on an 18 yard touchdown to Wade Ritter from Dean Fields. Evan Crowell added the extra point run to give the Tigers a 7-0 lead. Chillicothe scored later in the quarter to cut the lead to 7-6, but the Tigers stopped the extra point run attempt leaving the score 7-

6. The Tigers were able to halt the Eagles once again and controlled the ball until the very end of the game when one more valiant effort by the Tiger defense stopped the Eagles in their tracks and preserved the victory.

Wade Ritter was the leading rusher for the Eagles with nine carries for 62 yards. Evan Crowell had nine carries for 47 yards. Wyatt Weinheimer was the leading tackler for the Tigers followed closely by Crowell and Ritter. Michael Stephens provided excellent blocking on offense and contributed mightily on defense along with Chris Ollinger, Fields and Justin Homen. The next J.V. game is Thursday, October 3rd at McLean.

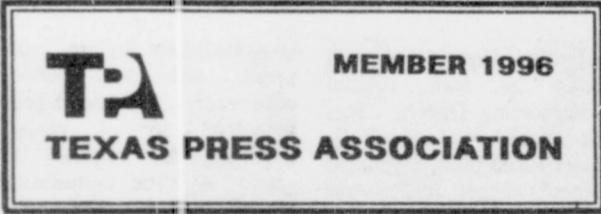

Kennard located a vehicle in  
Skellytown which was later  
reported as stolen from  
Borger. The Borger Police  
Department is currently  
investigating the case.

Our officers assisted the  
Texas Highway Patrol at the  
scene of a one car vehicle  
rollover west of Panhandle  
on Friday evening. A

Midland woman and her  
young daughter were  
transported by ambulance to  
Amarillo for examination.

Our department is  
investigating two unrelated  
reports of child abuse. One  
investigation focuses on a  
Fritch residence and the  
other is located in  
Panhandle. Both cases deal  
with allegations of physical  
abuse and neglect.  
Children's Protective

Services in Pampa is  
assisting in the investigation.

We are assisting White  
Deer City Marshal Tam  
Terry in the investigation of  
a criminal mischief case  
which occurred at the White  
Deer Cemetery.

Due to increasing  
complaints regarding  
reckless driving and near  
accidents in residential  
areas, our department will  
be focusing on traffic  
enforcement in Groom,  
Skellytown, White Deer, and  
Fritch. Deputy Jeff Oldham  
will be the primary officer in  
our traffic enforcement  
program and will have his  
patrol car specially equipped  
with radar, video recording  
equipment and a portable  
breath testing unit.

We currently have  
fourteen men and one  
woman incarcerated in the  
Carson County Jail. Five  
persons are charged with  
Possession of Over 50  
pounds of Marijuana, one  
for Possession of Heroin,  
one for Possession of  
Cocaine, one for Child  
Endangerment, two for  
violation of Probation or  
Parole, three for Auto  
Theft, one for a Motion to  
Revoke/Failure to Appear  
and one for Sales &  
Distribution of Narcotics.

A Carson County man  
who had been stopped by  
Panhandle Police for a  
traffic violation was found  
to be wanted on narcotics  
charges out of Arizona.  
The subject is being held  
pending extradition to  
Arizona to face the charges.

A California man who  
had skipped bond on drug  
possession charges in Carson  
County was recently

arrested out of state. The  
subject was one of two men  
arrested with a large  
quantity of drugs in their  
possession. The other  
subject was killed in a drive  
by shooting in Los Angeles  
last year, but the main  
suspect remained at large.

Due to a suspicion of his  
involvement in organized  
criminal activity in the  
Oklahoma City area as well  
as in California, the suspect  
gained the attention of the  
U.S. Marshal's Service  
Fugitive Task Force. Mr.  
Tayoun Bell of Los Angeles,  
California is now resting  
comfortably in Birmingham,  
Alabama in the custody of  
federal officers. We look  
forward to having him visit  
us again after the U.S.  
Attorney's Office has  
finished with him.

Our department assisted  
the Texas Highway Patrol in  
the pursuit of a stolen  
vehicle Saturday evening on  
Interstate 40. Troopers  
Gary Davis and Jeremy  
Wallace arrested one man  
after he lost control of his  
stolen vehicle on an access  
road near the 94 mile

Unauthorized Use of a  
Motor Vehicle and Evading



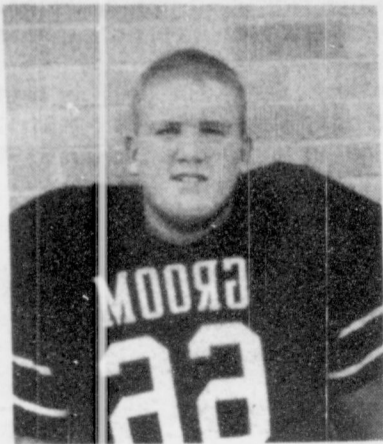

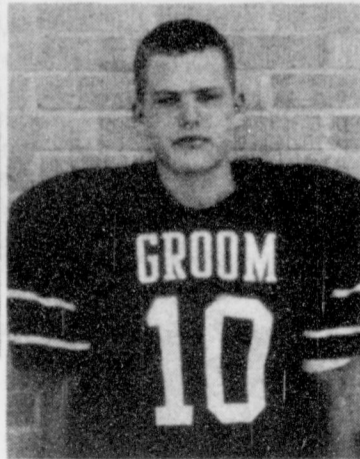

# As The Interstate Turns.....

We have been busy the last couple of weeks. Trooper Jeremy Wallace's first full week on the road found him helping to work a two vehicle fatal accident on Sept. 11. This accident occurred at FM 2373 and US 60. This intersection is one of the worst in the Texas Panhandle.

On September 20 Sergeant William Schneider of Borger ran a license plate on a car on IH-40. The 1995 Acura was reported stolen out of Los Angeles, CA. Troopers Gary Davis and Jeremy Wallace stopped the car and arrested an 18 year old male from California. The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office would not extradite the subject so he was filed on in Amarillo Federal Court for Interstate Transportation of a Stolen Vehicle.

Later Troopers arrested a truck driver on IH-40 for DWI and he was placed in jail at Panhandle.

On September 21, Troopers worked a truck tractor, semi-trailer roll over at the 88 mile marker on IH-40. The driver was going too fast on the north access road and turned over on the sharp curve. The driver was issued a citation for Unsafe Speed.

On September 26, Troopers drove upon an unreported accident west of Groom. The driver was speeding and drove off the curve and wrecked. The

accident occurred around 2:30 a.m. and Troopers suspected drinking involved. The driver showed up with a wrecker. Citations were issued for speeding 83/55 and For Failure to Report Injury Accident.

On September 28, Troopers were involved in a pursuit of a vehicle on IH-40. The pursuit started at the 109 mile marker and went west towards Conway. Just west of Conway, the driver ran off IH-40 at over 80 MPH and almost wrecked on the access road with Troopers Davis and Wallace in hot pursuit. The chase continued on for several miles on the access road until the driver failed to make the curve. The vehicle stopped after going up the overpass embankment and down the other side. The driver, a 17 year old male from Yukon, Oklahoma was arrested for DWI and Fleeing. Troopers found out that the driver had taken a large amount of pills and he was taken to Northwest Texas Hospital in Amarillo.

On September 29 a Panhandle resident was arrested for DWI on FM 293 just inside Panhandle. He was placed in jail at Panhandle.

Also I have noticed a lot of expired license plates, inspection stickers, and in some case's no plates or stickers at all. So get things fixed and up to date. To the kids in school with vehicles, drive the posted

speed limit and don't see how fast you can leave school and get back. I heard several complaints on some driving, so slow down, obey the law and we can just wave at each other as we pass. If you do not have a drivers license, do not drive, period. It is against the law.

Also with the speed limit raised, please watch out when driving IH-40. I have

written many tickets in the past several months for 90 plus speeds. In one five-day period I had six tickets over 100 MPH and three in the 90 MPH range. So look when you change lanes, because somebody might be going so fast they rear end you. Truck speeds have also picked up. Speeds range from the mid seventies to the low nineties. So look out! Until next week drive carefully.



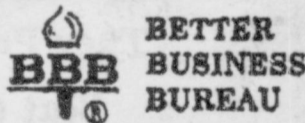
