

Carson Co Sheriffs Report

The week of June 22, 1992 had Carson County deputies investigating a case of endangerment to a child, a wild party, an incident involving a minor driver of a motor vehicle, a gas driveoff and a shots fired call, all in Groom.

Deputies investigated two incidents involving drivers operating on the wrong side or in wrong lanes of state and interstate highways. In one case the driver of a rental truck nearly ran into the side of a restaurant in Conway.

Deputy Ray Davis is credited with the arrest of a fugitive from California who was driving a stolen vehicle

at the time of his arrest. The suspect was originally stopped for a gas drive-off and later found to be a fugitive.

Carson County deputies, Texas Highway Patrol and Panhandle Police assisted the Amarillo Police Department in a search for

two suspects involved in the armed robbery of an Amarillo grocery store.

All Carson County deputies, as well as Highway Patrol Officers, and police officers and firefighters from a number of area towns were dispatched to Fritch to assist in a search for victims and crowd control after tornadoes destroyed a number of homes in the Hutchinson and Carson County areas of Fritch. A total of 1000 homes were damaged with 200 homes totally destroyed. Eight persons were injured, one seriously injured and hospitalized.

Sheriff's Department personnel were involved in 24-hour coverage of the area to assist victims and to prevent looting of residences.



Local Cowboys Relive The "Good Ole Days"

On the North Fork of the Red River - For eight area cowboys, home on the range is more than a song.

In a grove of hackberry trees just a 10-minute ride from the North Fork, David Crockett and his crew of cowhands camped for a week in June with a covered chuckwagon, three tepees, eight horses and a week's supply of chili, steak and cornmeal.

Crockett, 50, learned to rope, ride and fix fence as a teenager on the Morse Triangle Ranch. He organized the week-long camp-out with a special interest in passing on working cowboy traditions to the youngest members of the crew.

Using their Gray County campsite as a base, the "chuckwagon gang" rose around 5 a.m. each day, ate sourdough biscuits, eggs and sausage cooked in Dutch ovens on a wood fire, saddled up and rode a few miles to round up and 14 and 12 year old sons, Seth and Sy, for the week of work and camaraderie on the former Triangle Ranch. But he has spent years teaching them the ways of the range.

"There just aren't that many people that can do it anymore, and do it right," said Brown, who wears a long, brown mustache. "If you can do it, and do it the way it ought to be done, you've got an edge."

Brown's hand brushed the front of his western shirt.

"There's just a feeling down in there, he said. "If you've earned your spurs, you know.

"And with David inviting these boys out here, that's all we've got. If we don't show 'em, it's going to be gone."

Joined by other neighbors using modern pickups and horse trailers, the group helped brand, vaccinate and earmark calves on the Denworth Line Camp ranch for two days and on the Gething ranch for two days. Then they worked Crockett's own cattle on the North Fork for a day before moving to his place for a few more days of branding.



Corinne Trimble's Son Norman Passes Away

Norman R. Trimble, a retired executive of Ashland Oil, Inc., died Wednesday, June 24, following a stroke the day before in Fort Myers, Fla. Tremble, 70, was vice president of Human Resources for Ashland when he retired in 1982.

"We were shocked to learn of the untimely passing of Norm Trimble, Richard said Spears, senior vice president for Human Resources and Law. Trimble was very active in professional and civic organizations during his years in Ashland. He was a

director of Associated Industries of Kentucky, and served on the board of Junior Achievement of the Tri-State from 1971 through 1974. He was metrochairman of the National Alliance of Businessmen's Association in 1975 and also was president of the Bellefonte Country Club that year, having previously served as a club director since 1972.

Trimble is survived by his wife, Janis; a son, Gary; a daughter, Lin (Mrs. James) Hamer; his mother, Corinne Trimble of McLean; and six grandchildren. A memorial service was held 2 p.m. Saturday, June 27, at Fort Myers Memorial Garden.






