At presstime, incumbents Mike Britten and Roslyn Watson have filed for re-election. Britten is the current county commissioner and has served in this position for four years.

Roslyn Watson was elected to fill the unexpired term of the late Lloyd Sterling in 1990.

Tuesday, December 3rd was the first day for county hopefuls to file for the offices of County Commissioner, County Tax Assessor-Collector, Sheriff, and County Attorney.

At presstime two incumbents have filed to run for their current positions another term.

City-Wide Man Hunt Lands Pair In Carson County Jail

Groom was the scene of a frantic search Saturday night after an unidentified man and woman sold a gun to a local person at Texas Red's Truck Stop. The person who bought the gun became suspicious and contacted the Carson County Sheriff's Department.

After being questioned by Deputy Ray Davis one of the suspects was taken to Max Wade's J.P. office to sign a consent to search warrant.

"He was cooperating until that point," stated Carson County Sheriff Terry Timmons. "He was not under arrest at that time." The suspect fled the office and was finally located at Texas Red's a short time later.

Timmons stated, "He may be connected with recent robberies in the Groom area. It looks like he has been all the way to Las Vegas and back."

The suspects, Jeffery Scott Maulton, age 30 and Jane Shavers, age 43, both of South Pittsburg, Tennessee, were arraigned on one count each of possession of stolen goods. Bond was set at \$5,000.00 cash or \$10,000.00 property.

Neither suspect was able to make bond and are currently in Carson County jail. Several stolen guns and

coin collections were found in their possession.

Timmons stated that the pair will most likely have burglary charges filed against them for a crime committed in Amarillo sometime Tuesday.

"They are our number one suspect in the burglary of the Brooks home in Groom" said Sheriff Timmons.

Timmons is in the process of recovering some stolen goods from Beckham County in Oklahoma that may be connected with the case.

Several law enforcement units helped with the search. They were, along with several Carson County units, the Highway Patrol and the Armstrong County Sheriff's Department.

There will be a Private Applicator Training and Testing on December 9, 1991 according to Danny Nusser, Carson County Extension Agent. The training will be conducted from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at the Groom Community Center in Groom.

At 1:00 p.m., Levon Harmon with the Texas Department of Agriculture will provide testing for Private Applicator Certification. Producers must go through the required training before they can take the test.

There is a \$50 fee which you must send to Austin with your license application. The license is good for 5 years and can be renewed if the private applicator meets CEU requirements (15 CEU's in 5 years).

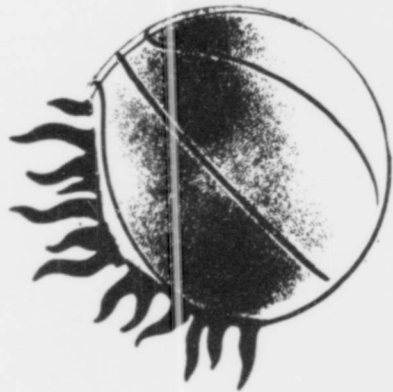

On November 26th the High School girls team played Allison at Allison and were defeated 56-47.

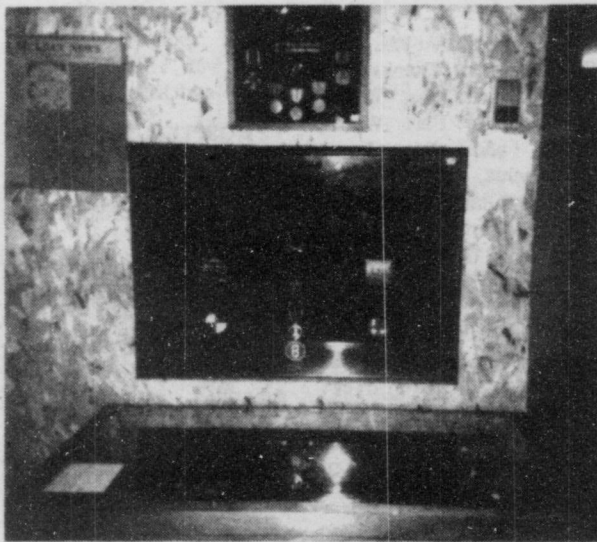

FmHA Disaster Loans Available

Gray County was declared eligible for Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) disaster emergency loans on October 21, 1991.

Generally, that means that farmers who have lost at least 30% of their production due to the drought, freeze, high winds and insect damage which occurred between January 1, 1991 and June 1, 1991, are eligible for FmHA loans. Proceeds from crop insurance and the farm program are taken into account when determining eligibility. FmHA is urging farmers who are interested in receiving an emergency loan to get their applications into FmHA as soon as possible to avoid the backlogs and to speed up the process. The FmHA office is located at 321 Sully street in Clarendon. Telephone (806) 874-3552 for more information.

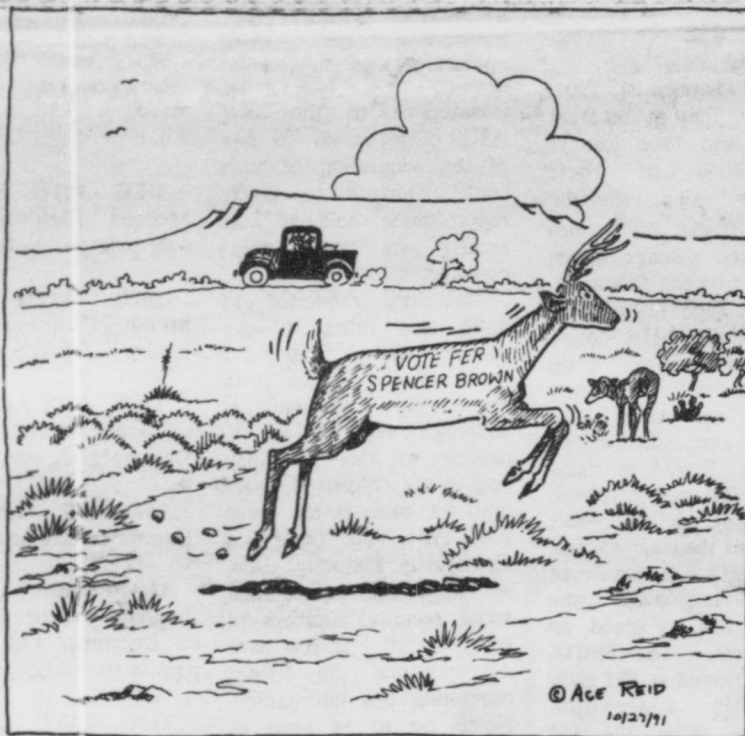

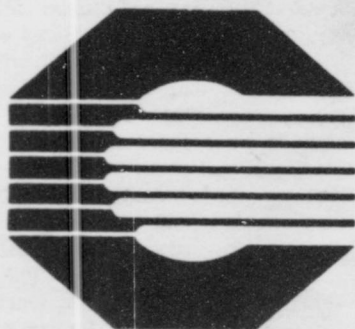

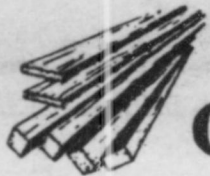

DISPOSAL OF FARM AND RANCH WASTE TO BE ADDRESSED

What will happen to farm and ranch waste when all of the small local landfills are closed?

What about disposal of used motor oil, chemical cans, tires and batteries from farms and ranches in the area?

What will be done with household wastes from homes outside of town?

How do current state and federal regulations on waste disposal affect farmers, ranchers, and rural residents?

According to John Crowell, Coordinator with the North Rolling Plains Resource Conservation and Development Area in Pampa, "It is time we address these issues and develop opportunities for farmers and ranchers to dispose of wastes properly and conveniently."

The North Rolling Plains RC&D Council is working with County Extension Agents and the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission to address this problem.

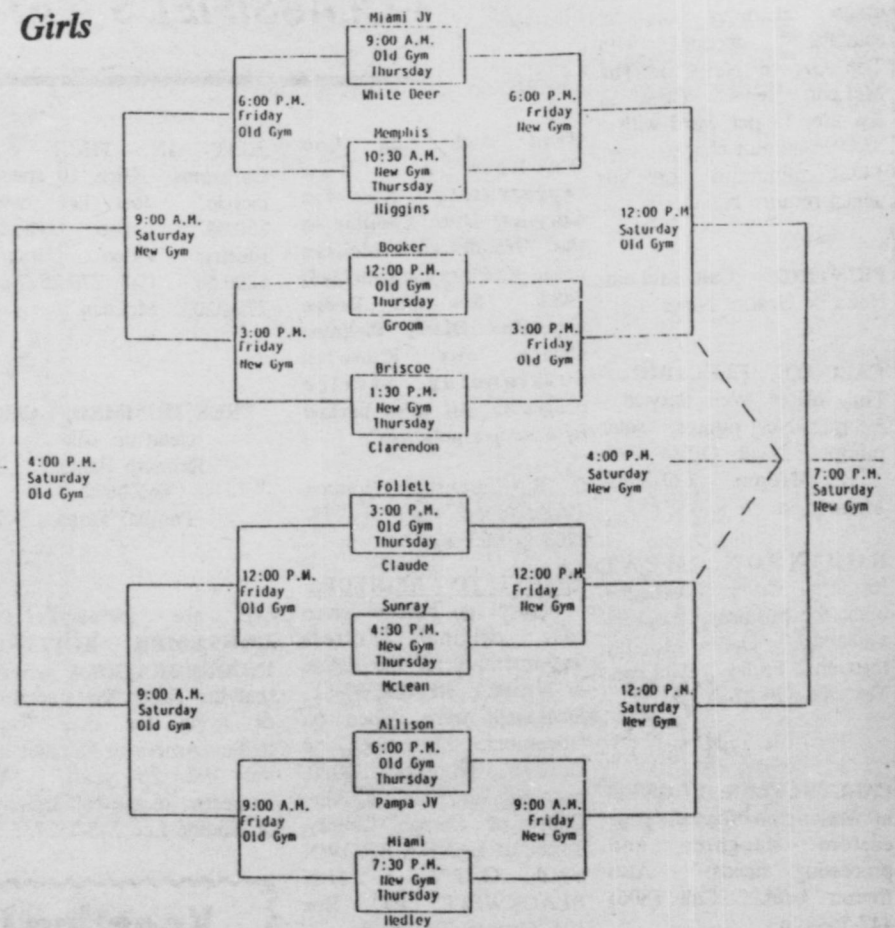
A rural waste "Task Force" is being formed in the area to discuss the potential problems and search for possible solutions. The first meeting is scheduled in December.

"People who live in cities and towns will have dumpsters to dump their trash in, and it will be hauled off for them. But what about the families who live outside of town?" asked Crowell. "In these meetings, we will discuss ways to make waste disposal available to our neighbors who live in the country."

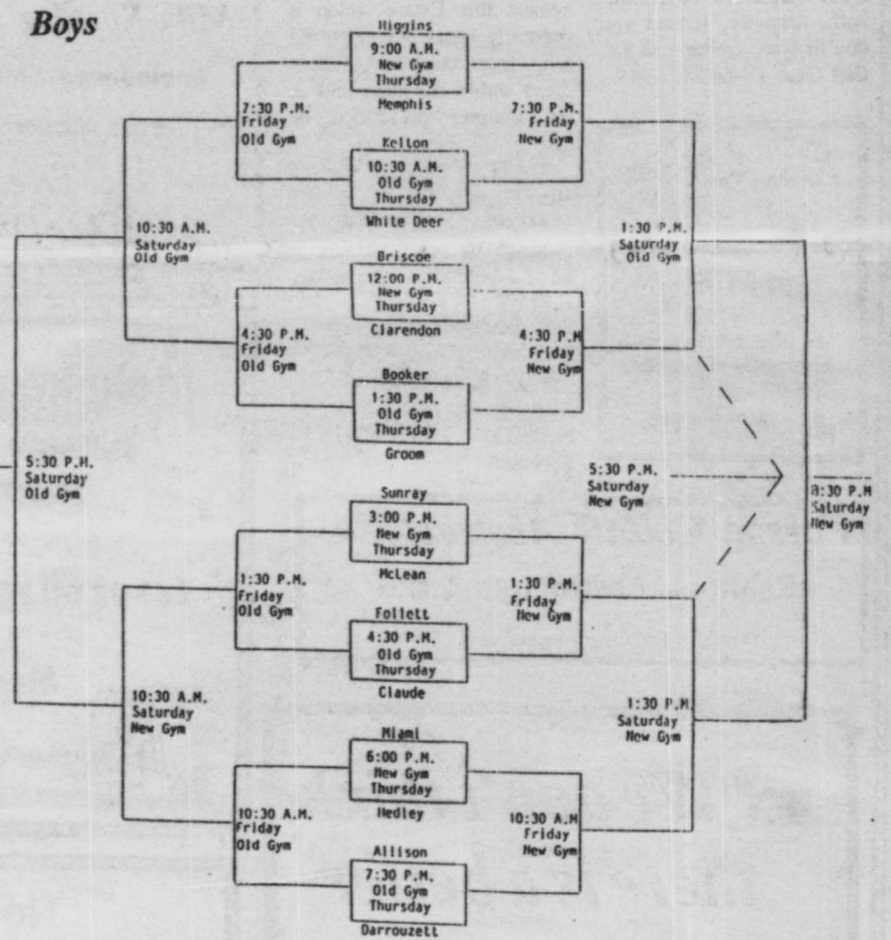
