TEXAS AND SUCH SERVICE OUTSIDE THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF MCLEAN, TEXAS PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE, PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS THEREOF IN CONFLICT HEREWITH: AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION.
The minimum charge per month for customers in the city limits of McLean will be $\$ 10.00$ each month from 0.1 mcf . All mcf's over that will be $\$ 1.50$ per mof each month over what the city will pay per mef from it's supplier

The minimum charge each month for customers outside the city limits will be $\$ 11.00$ each month from $0-1$ mef. All mef"s over that will be $\$ 1.50$ per mef each month over what the city will pay per mef from it's supplier.
These charges will be effective beginning November 1,2000
The rate that will be charged for the month of October will be $\$ 6.48$ per mef.
