The ACT is only given in 13 state in September - Arizona, California, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Maryland, Neveda, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas and Washington. The ACT Assessment is given 5 times per year in all 50 states and in the number one college entrance exam taken by high school students in 25 states. There are four sections to the exam: English Reading, Math, and Science. The ACT Assessment was taken more than 1.7 million times last year . by college-bound students.
