Mr. Hannon began the Su perintendent Report with an update on the prigression of Technology. Se reral ittems have been received and he reported thet Matt McCabe was do ng a good job getting all the new computers and eq uipment instailed.

including Update 78. The updated policy is also available online.
Mr. Hannon discussed the Student Code of Conduct that he had prepared from the TASB version. Hz clarified several questions from the Board. Mr. Hannon had also prepared an Acceptable Use Policy to be signed, which explains the proper use of computers and technology equipment at school. The Board then went over the Employee and Student Handbocks. These documents were much easier to understand than they had been in prior years atter Mr. Hannon spent several hours of preparation in order to cut redundancy and to make the policies easier to understand.
