


# Methodist Church Celebrates 100th


The Congregation was treated to several beautiful displays of times gone by. on display that was made in 1926 by Frankie Upham



The Board held a hearing about the same matter few months ago which few months ago which was met with a negative from from those The Board response attending. has agreed to revisit the issue with more knowledge of how the tax will work and how it will benefit the school.

The tax would be levied on all cars, pickups, motorcycles (if registered), boats, travel trailers, motor homes and airplanes. Farm tagged vehicles will not be exempt. According to Superintendent Kevin Noack, if the tax had been passed a few months ago, it would have enabled the Board to pass a balanced budget this year. As it was, a budget with a \$90,000 deficit was approved with funds coming from the reserve fund balance. With that balance at
