



district play-offs. Don't miss the action as the Tigers and Tigerettes battle for the district crown.







Many times I have traveled the hour to Amarillo only to find that the sale item I went after has been sold out or is not available in the right size. Maybe it's silly but I don't usually call to check because I figure why pay for gas and a phone call too.

How many times have you called a place of business and they answer, "Hello, this is Dr. X's office, can you hold?"

Click! The next thing you know you are on hold for 15 minutes.

Now, I wouldn't have called if I didn't need to speak with them so I'm

faced with the dilemma of holding or hanging up or trying again.

Local dialing to Amarillo and Pampa will also make Groom much more attractive to businesses that might be looking to relocate.

If you make 1 or 2 calls a month to doctors, businesses or family I just don't see how you can pass this up. The most it can be is \$3.50 a month. Even though you may not make that many calls a month now, just think of all the calls you could make if you knew that's all it would cost.

Most of us with children spend a lot more a month. It would directly help us tremendously. Indirect benefits will help the whole town. I, again, hope you say yes to this proposal.

Tree Seedlings Now Available

The McClellan Creek Soil Water Conservation District is now taking applications for tree seedlings to be delivered in March. This conservation tree program enables farmers, ranchers, and rural landowners to obtain trees at nominal cost. The program's aim is to encourage landowners to plant effective wind-barriers to protect buildings, cropland, feedlots, and control erosion.

The trees are available from both the Texas Forest Service and the Colorado State Forest Service. Species available include evergreens such as Austrian Pine, Colorado Blue Spruce, Afghan Pine, Arizona Cypress, Eastern Red Cedar, Ponderosa Pine, Pinion Pine, Rocky Mountain Juniper, Scotch Pine, and White Pine.

Deciduous trees available are Shumard Oak, Desert Willow, Aromatic Sumac, Honeylocust, Mulberry, Nanking Cherry, Native Plum, Osage Orange, Russian Olive, Sandcherry, Nanking Cherry, Caragana, Cotoneaster, Honeysuckle, Green Ash, Hybrid Cottonwood, Golden Willow, Hackberry, and Lombardy Poplar.
