EDC Monument Committee Discusses Options

The McLean EDC was
called to order November 21
at 6:00 p.m. by President
Reyna with following
members present: Mary
Dwyer, Betty Morgan,
Lavon Watson, Laverne
Back and Jim Reyna. Others
present: Mindy Reeves,
Delbert Trew and Larry
Wallace.

Invocation was given by
Delbert Trew.

Minutes of November 7
meeting were read and the
balance in Clean-Up Fund
was corrected to read
\$2,883.56. Minutes were
approved as corrected.

Treasurer's report
showed a balance in general
fund of \$12,290.63, the
Clean-Up Fund of
\$2,383.56 for a total of
\$14,674.19.

OLD BUSINESS

1. The matter of the logo
on the banners was
discussed. Jim will find out
what the cost will be of our
own logo on the black and
gold banners rather than
using the current logo which
was designed for the
centennial. He will present
the exact price at December
19 meeting.

2. Mary Dwyer moved to
reconsider the motion passed at
November 7 meeting for the
purchase of 40 flags to be
flown on Railroad and First

Streets. Lavon Watson
seconded. Motion carried.
The poles are not available
as was originally thought.
Jim will check on how many
city owned poles are
available.

3. The Monument
Committee reported no
response from the public on
our flyers asking for
suggestions or input for a
monument. One suggestion
for a covered pavilion in the
park was received, however.
The committee had asked
Delbert Trew to present
some of his ideas for a
monument.

Delbert stressed that 300
million dollars is being
spent on I-40 from Texola
to Amarillo for benefit of
tourists and of that, twenty
million is being spent west
of Alanreed and about two
million in Shamrock restoring
the Route 66 icon. McLean
needs to take advantage of
being on Route 66. He
suggested a City Directory
be placed on east bound and
west bound routes through
town—one near Post Office
and the other near the Elvis
Presley mural. He hoped the
EDC could help with the
cost of raising the Cactus
Inn sign which is the best
known and oldest
Route 66 icon in McLean.

compartment in the rear
containing 66 pounds of
cocaine.

After transiting the Suez Canal from the Mediterranean Sea after its month-long operation in Kosovo (Dynamic Response '02), Acuna's unit shifted location from the US Sixth Fleet Area of Responsibility to that of the US Naval Forces Central Command/ US Fifth Fleet in the Indian Ocean and Arabian Sea Area.
