





#### Last Britten Child Found

Perhaps the healing can begin for the Dr. Robert Britten family with the recovery of the body of 8 year old Benjamin, who was lost with his father and two brothers on December 14, when the group was duck hunting. All four most likely died of hypothermia when sudden winds capsized their boat on Lake Meredith.

Robert Phillip Britten, age 11, was the first found on December 14, 1996. The father, Dr. Robert Britten was found later in the day. It was not until March 1 that 9 year old Patrick Carl was found.

Finding Benjamin will bring a close to this tragedy for family, friends and many who have shared their pain.

The neck and neck race came down to 2/100th of a second difference between 2nd and 3rd place. Ritter, at the last moment, dove to the finish line, giving himself a skinned chest and a bloody nose. He was

awarded the Silver Medal in ceremonies on Saturday.

Justin was a Regional qualifier in the 400 meter run, the 800 meter run, the 1600 meter relay, the long jump and the triple jump. He qualified for the State meet in two events, the 400 and 800 meter runs.

## Ritter Wins Carr Academic Scholarship

Justin Ritter from Groom High School has been awarded a Carr Academic Scholarship at Angelo State University for 1997-98.

Over 300 Carr Academic Scholarships for 1997-98, ranging in value from \$1,500 to \$6,000, have been awarded to qualified high school seniors. During the current year approximately 900 students from throughout Texas and the nation, as well as numerous foreign countries are attending Angelo State University on Carr Academic Scholarships.

As a general rule, students must rank in the top 15 percent of their high school class and present either a combined math and verbal score of 1140 on the SAT 1 or a composite score of 25 on the ACT.

Supported by a growing multi-million dollar trust established by the late Robert G. and Nona K. Carr of San Angelo, the undergraduate scholarships may be renewed annually by the University for students who maintain the required academic record. During a four-year course of undergraduate study at ASU, Carr Academic Scholarships can be worth from \$6,000 to \$24,000.

Local residents are advised that the basement area of the courthouse will be available to residents during a Tornado Warning. Individuals should enter through the north doors and the handicap ramp on the west side.





#### Wheeler Now A Local Call

GTE Telephone Operations will extend local calling for all customers in Wheeler telephone service area, beginning May 20, 1997. Under the plan, all calls to and from McLean will be local calls.

"Prior to the start of Extended Local Calling, each call between these areas was billed separately as a long-distance call, and customers would see a longdistance charge per call on their monthly bills," said Danny Ferguson, Area Manager - Customer Operations, Plains district.

"Now, these calls are equivalent to local calls, and all customers in the towns having the new Expanded Local Calling (ELC) must now dial all seven digits, both for local calls and ELC calls," explained Mr. Danny Ferguson.

The implementation of this seven-digit service may require modification to some telecommunications

equipment such as fax machines, speed calling, PABXs, key system, automatic dialers and other equipment that may restrict or automatically dial longdistance numbers.

Customers are not required to take any action to take advantage of the new service offering. Once extended calling is operational, it will no los be necessary for customers to dial "1+" before the number when placing calls between these communities, but you must dial all seven digits for local and ELC calls.

This is a result of balloting which took place in the Wheeler telephone service area under the rules of Senate Bill 632 and the Public Utility Commission Rule 23.49 (c). Under those guidelines, certain communities were allowed to petition for extended tollfree local calling to nearby communities.



## **Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures**

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about:

· the value placed on your property · any exemptions that may apply to

 the cancellation of an agricultural appraisal

· the taxable status of your property the local governments which should

be taxing your property

any action taken by the appraisal district that adversely affected you. Informal Review

If you with to have an informal review of your property with our staff, please contact our office at 537-3569 or come by 102 Main St., Panhandle, Texas

Review by the Appraisal Review Board If you can't resolve your problem informally with the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protes) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present evidence about your case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at 102 Main St., Panhandle, Texas 79068.

Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

District Court After it decices your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. If the appraisal district has appraised your property at \$1,000,000 or more, you must file a notice of appeal with the chief appraiser within 15 days of the date you receive the ARB's order.

#### Deadline for Filing Protests with the ARB\*

Usual Deadline

On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later).

Late protests are allowed if you miss

the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause.

Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information. Special Deadlines

For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.

The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or holiday.
