The nationwide survey of investors, conducted by Penn, Shoen \& Berland Associates between January 17 and 22, 3002 , indicates that more than seven in 10 ( 73 percent) investors who have worked for a public company say they have received stock options or other types of stock comers. More than half ( 53 per cent) of investors who have worked for a public company say they currently hold com pany stock or stock options. Of those holding employer stock or options, 50 percent say that employer stack and optionis now represent a larger percentage of their total financial assets than five years ago compared to 21 percent who say that the percentage of their financial assets held in employer stock and options has decreased over the past five years. Twenty-four per cemployer stock now nerpesent more than 10 percent of the value of their investment value of theios inestment portionos. market and the highly visible

collapse of Enron, it should not be surprising that investors are becoming more aware of single stock risk. ## NOTICES OF APPRAISED VALUE TO BE SENT TO PROPERTY OWNERS

State law requires county appraisal districts to notify property owners about changes in their property's value. Around May 15, the Carson County Appraisal District will mail property owners letters showing their 2002 proposed appraised value.

Donita Davis, chief appraiser of the district, reminds property owners that the letter of appraised value is not a tax bill

Davis emphasized the importance of this letter and the key information that it contains. "If an informal agreement cannot be made with the appraisal district, the property owner has the right to appeal to the Carson County Appraisal Review Board on any disagreement with the property's value, exemptions, ownership, and other areas," she said The notice includes instructions on how and when to file a protest and a protest form.

What should a property owner carefully review? "Look at the proposed value for 2002," Davis said "The letter states the land's value and any improvement value for the property for the current year." The letter also includes current year information on exemptions granted on the property. It provides last year's value, also.

Letters to property owners will also include "estimated" taxes. These taxes are based on the new taxable value and the taxing unit's tax rate from the prior year. Final tax amounts may vary from the "estimated" amounts.

Davis asks property owners to check the legal description and mailing address to be sure there are no mistakes. "If the letter has an old address, please let the appraisal district know. The post office forwards mail to a new address for a short time, and tax bills do not go out until October," Davis added.

A property owner is responsible for informing the appraisal district of the correct mailing address. and is also liable for additional penalties and interest on a tax bill that is not paid on time.
