Karen Babcock Wins High Jump—

Groom Tracksters Place 2nd At Own Relays Last Weekend

Over 1500 students, athletes and fans attended the Groom Area Track Meet over the weekend. Area schools were divided into two divisions.

Panhandle boys won the Large School Division with 199 points, followed by Highland Park 118, Booker 113, Claude 80, White Deer 21, and Gruver 20. Panhandle girls also took the overall honors with 197 points, Highland Park 159, Booker 121, Claude 48, and Gruver 35.

In the Six Man division the McLean Boys won with 150 total points followed by Groom with 94, Follett 89, Miami 76, Panhandle JV 72, Lefors 46, Highland Park JV 26, Higgins 1 and Adrian and Allison with 0.

Groom and Miami girls ran a tight race with Miami squeaking past Groom by 2 points with a final of Miami 147, Groom 145, Follett 135, McLean 37, Lefors 34, Panhandle JV 33, Higgins 30, and Adrian 1.

In the Junior High Events, Boys, Highland Park won with a score of 129, followed by 8th grade Gruver 116, Booker 100, 8th Grade Claude 72, Groom 53, Miami 47, McLean 18, Lefors 5, Follett 2 and Higgins 1.

Also participating were Allison and Adrian.

In the Junior High girls division 8th Grade Gruver scored 182, 8th Grade Claude 103, Groom 66, 7th Grade Gruver 61, Booker 53, Miami 33, Highland Park 25, 7th Grade Claude 22, Lefors 19, Adrian 10, Higgins 8 and McLean 5. Follett and Allison also attended.

Carson County Felony Warrants Filed On Pair After High Speed Chase

Two Amarillo men are being held in the Potter County Jail on theft charges stemming from the March 18, burglary of a residence in Fritch. The two men, Jason DeWayne Maloney and Peter Julius Jensen, were arraigned before a Potter County Justice of the Peace on Friday on felony warrants from Carson County and bond for each man was set at \$100,000.

Maloney and Jensen attempted to elude Potter County Sheriff's Deputies who were attempting to stop their vehicle Thursday afternoon. The suspects vehicle struck a passing car when they attempted to run from the deputies, but both suspects were captured before they could go very

far on foot.

The vehicle that Maloney and Jensen were driving was found to have over twenty weapons inside. These weapons were identified as the weapons stolen in the Fritch burglary.

Investigators from the Carson County Sheriff's Department, Potter County Sheriff's Department, Amarillo Police Department and the Federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms are working together to determine which other burglaries these subjects have been involved in. Officers are also working to determine the identity of other suspects in a rash of burglaries in Carson, Potter and Randall counties.

Groom School Leads In Technology

In conjunction with Texas Public School Week, Groom teachers will get the chance to show off their latest addition to teaching aids, the new computer system that each have in their classrooms.

Elementary students work on the Writing to Write Program, Math and Touch Typing.

The Writing to Write Program is a very innovative teaching tool that goes hand in hand with the Writing To Read Program. As you may remember the Writing to Read Program was implemented several years ago teaching students in Kindergarten and First Grade the fundamentals of phonetic spelling using the computer as a tool for creativity as well as reinforcement.

The Writing to Write curriculum is designed to help children develop, analyze and articulate their own ideas. Their thoughts

made visible, coherent and communicative. Rather than teaching a series of discreet rules that focus on a particular word or sentence skill, "Writing to Write" defines writing as a problem-solving activity in

which students observe, define, describe, create, compare, narrate or persuade their readers and therefore teaches students a series of strategies to solve the writing problems at hand.

"Writing to Write" teaches the students the basics of seeing themselves as real writers with real goals, teaching organization and sequential manner in the course of the program.

Candra Holland and Shawn O'Dell students in Mrs. Davis' 2nd grade class said that they really liked the programs and the computer.

Shawn said, "I don't spend so much time writing it all out..."

Candra agreed saying "We spend more time learning the right way and working with computers is fun!"

Cassie Ashford and Wyatt Britten, partners sharing the computer screen said that although they like the Write to Writing Program but their favorite is "Touch Typing", a program designed to improve their keyboard skills.

"It has games to play" said Wyatt. Cassie added, "The Math (program) is fun, too!"

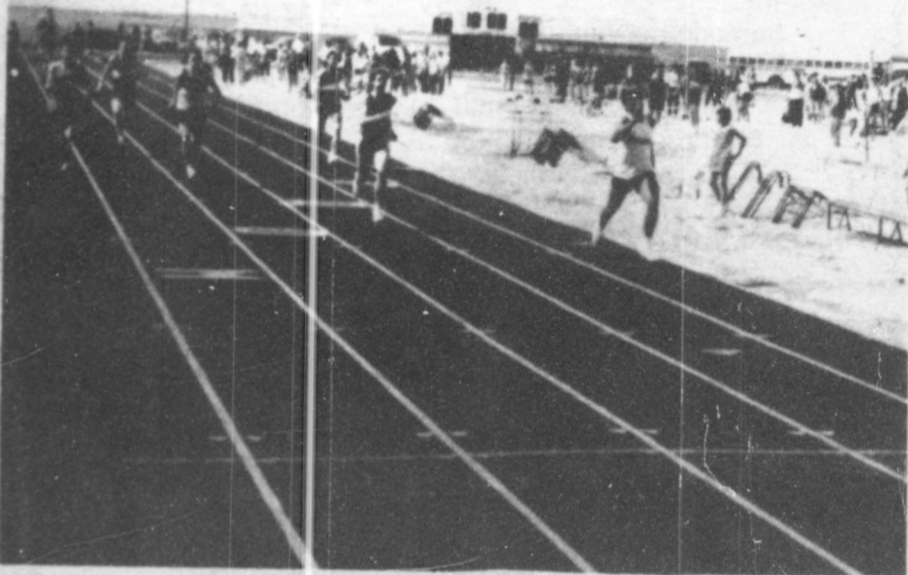

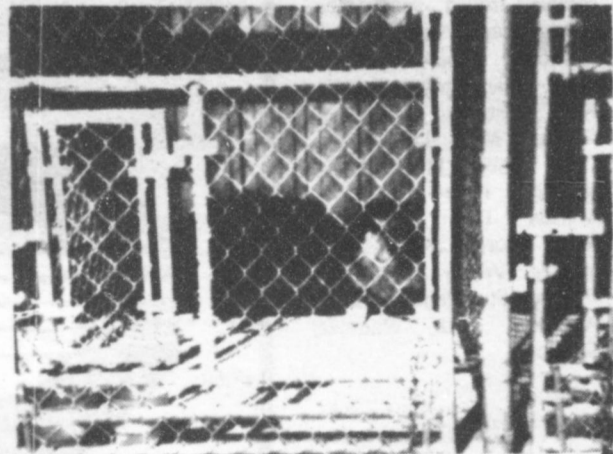

Free Seminar Offered By Coronado Hospital

Coronado Hospital will sponsor a free seminar featuring speakers James Dunn, MD, and James Kendall, MD, on March 28 at the Pampa Chamber of Commerce building at 1:30 p.m. Those wishing to attend should pre-register by calling Deborah Musgrave at 665-3721, extension 222. The seminar "A Sinus Solution" will focus on explanation of the causes and treatments for sinus disease. Dr. Dunn, an otolaryngologist (ear, nose, and throat), will discuss sinus disease in general and detail various corrections for the problem, including an endoscopic surgical solution.

Dr. Kendall, who is director of anesthesiology at Coronado Hospital, will discuss the key role of anesthesia in the delicate nasal surgery.

"For years patients who suffered with chronic sinus inflammations and infections were treated with pills or sprays. The disease itself was vaguely defined, and no serious intervention was considered. Some people suffered for years with headaches and other miserable symptoms."

He explained that sinus infections, or osteomeatal disease of the sinus, are caused by several mechanical factors. "There

may be a crooked nasal passage or an engorgement in the nose. Dust and allergies can cause the membrane to swell, and the result is all too familiar to those who suffer with the headaches and pain," Dr. Dunn said.

When sinus surgery was done, it was brutal, Dr. Dunn noted. "The surgeon was forced to use hammers and chisels, and the patient was left with bruises, blood loss, some scarring, and a great deal of pain," he said.

"The new method we will include in our discussion is an outpatient procedure, and uses a new technique developed in Switzerland

and Germany," Dr. Dunn said.

"The purpose of the surgery is to open the narrow places in the nose so the swelling from irritants won't allow the sinus to block off," he explained. "The surgery only takes about 45 minutes, and requires a precise coordination between the surgeon and the anesthesiologist for best results." After the surgery, the patient usually spends about two hours in recovering before going home.

The recent arrival of a Zeiss surgical microscope completed a new set of

surgical equipment at Coronado Hospital for the special procedure, Dr. Dunn said. "The equipment is similar to that used in arthroscopic surgery for knees and the laparoscopic surgeries in the abdomen," he explained. The series of endoscopes, some no larger than half the thickness of a pencil, are used primarily in delicate surgeries to correct problems with the sinus.

Dr. Dunn had practiced in Denton for 21 years before coming to Pampa last spring. Certified by the

American Board of Otolaryngology, he is a member of many professional organizations. He completed his undergraduate work at the University of Texas in Austin. He finished his degree in medicine at Southwestern Medical School in Dallas.

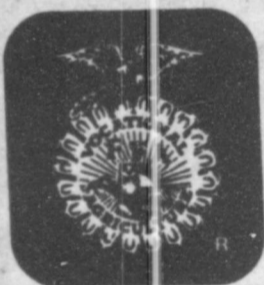
