Maggie Trejo left the Lubbock City Council last Thursday after serving over nine years on the Lubbock City Council. Mrs. Trejo was the first person of Mexican decent, man or woman, to serve on the before-at-large system of electing its members.

Lubbock went through lengthy and expensive lawsuits trying to maintain the racist system at taxpayers expense. Mrs. Trejo, however, was elected to the first council after the federal court ruled at-large systems were unconstitutional, along with Black Councilman T. J. Patterson.

Lubbock's alleged reasonings for the long expensive fight was "Lubbock would have the Chicago Ward style system of electing city officials and would create ward bosses, corruption wide scale, patronage and everything that goes along with so called Ward politics. How wrong they have been. First, you have to look at Lubbock vs other cities, and the kind of citizens in both and it is easy to see the differences.

Maggie, as well as T. J., has done an admirable job in a positive and constructive manner for their districts as well as for the total city by being a part of leading Lubbock into the 21st Century in a good, sound, positive manner and helping set a tone for our surrounding sister cities without the hassle and expense Lubbock went through and offers a special note to Slaton, the southern suburb of Lubbock.

Maggie has the dedication and the experience to serve even more people on a much broader scale. She has served former State Representative Froy Salinas, the Lubbock City Council, and many other community, civic, and political organizations. "In Opposition With LISD's 5-2 Plan" Local Attorneys Submit Memorandum And Exhibits To The Justice Department!

The Southwest Digest learned this week that attorneys, including Maria Luisa Mercado and Daniel H. Benson, both local attorneys, submitted a memorandum and accompanying exhibits to Susanna Lorenzo-Giguere, Voting Rights Section, Civil Rights Division of the United States Department of Justice.

Their package, which was dated June 14, 1993, gave comments on Lubbock Independent School District 5-2 Redistricting Plan Preclearance Submission. In this, they commented on this plan which was submitted by LISD Board of Trustees on May 18, 1993.

In their memorandum, these attorneys came up with the following conclusion: "For the foregoing reasons, we respectfully urge the Department of Justice to deny, again, Section 5 preclearance to the submitted 5-2 plan of the Lubbock Independent School District, and approve only a plan consisting of seven single-member districts, like that offered in Appendix C.

The memorandum was also

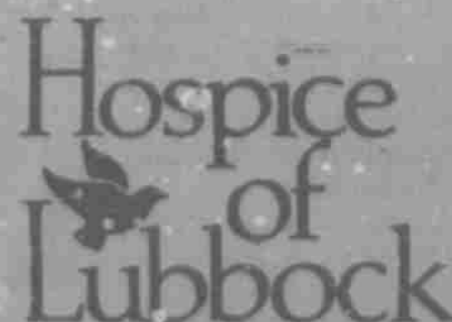

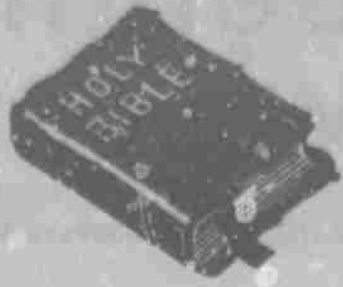
