CHICAGO (AP) - The Rev. Jesso Jackson apologized Wednesday to Barack Obama for making a "regretfully crude" comment about the Democratic presidential hopeful during what be thought was a private conversation three days ago.

Jackson said the "hurtful and wrong" comments Sunday came in response to a question from a follow quest during a break from toping "Fox & Friends." The guest asked about speeches on morality Obama has given at black churches.

Jackson said at a news conference that he had replied that Obsum's speeches can come off as speaking down to black people and that there were other importrust issues to be addressed in the community, such as unemployment, the mortgage crists and the mumber of blacks in prison.

Lubbock Health Salmonella Update

The City of Lubbock Health Department received notification from the Department of State Health Services (DSHS) Region One office on 7-11-08 that there are a total of five office lly confirmed cases of a bacterial infection called Salmonella, serotype Saintpunl in Lubbook County that are related to the current mationwide outbreak.

There is not a cluster of cases cases do not have a common source of exposure. Two of the five cases were most likely exposed during out of town trus-

As of July 10, 2008 at 9:00 pm, CDC says there have been 1090 confirmed cases in 42 states, District of Columbia, and Canada. New cases continue to be diagnosed, as well as known cases being confirmed. Illness onset dates range from April 10, 2008 to July 1, 2008.

Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) investigators have added a recommendution regarding jalapeno and Sermo peppers to their recommendations for tomatoes. Many of the most recent cases nationwide are known to have comsumed peppers and tometoes or tomatoes. FDA and CDC offilocations in the nation, in an attempt to identify the source of the infections.

CDC continues to recommend that commers limit their tourate consumption to specific types and specific sources. These include cherry tomatoes; grape tomatoes, tomatoes sold with the vine still attached, tomatoes grown at home; and red Plum, Round and Roma tomatoes from specific sources listed at the FDA website below.

In addition, CDC recommends that until health officials know that the conteminated product or products are no longer on the market, persons with incremed risk of severe infection, including infants, elderly persous, and these with impaired immune systems, should not est raw jalapeno peppers or raw serrano peppera. Other persons who are concerned and who want to reduce their risk of Salmonella infection can take similar precautions. Consumers should be aware that new jalupone peppers and raw tomatoes are often used in the preparation of Fresh salsa, guncamole, pico de gallo, filling for tertillus, and other dishes. 





COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) -Residents of a mostly black neighborhood in rural Ohio were awarded nearly \$11 million Thursday by a federal jury that found local authorities denied them public water service for decades out of racial discrimina-



John Referre is easil rigids altorney based in Washington, D.C., who represented the residents, said the jury lessed hours of testimony and size limiteds of pages of documentation over the seven-week trial.

"This verdict vindicates that this /treatment) was because of their race." he said "The jury agreed with that and simued a verdict based on a full airing of the facts."

Ohio Attorney General Nancy H. Rogers mid sho was plensed.

"This decision speaks firmly about the exportance of treating citizens with equal respect, regardless of race," she said in a statement.

Plaintiff Frederick Martin said the long wait was worth it.

He and his sine siblings shared two tabs of water between them on both nights when he was growing up. He left Cool Run, built on a fermer coal mine, in 1970 so his children wouldn't have to endure the same Eving conditions, he said.

"Today I feel that we are really blessed, to know and to see justice being mer," Martin said. "And to see, regardless of who we are, there is a price to pay if you discriminate against people."

The plaintits' attorneys successfully argued that the decision not to pipe water to the plaintiffs was racially motivated, painting a picture of a community with a history of segregation. Black residents of Coal Run Road were denied water over the years while nearby white neighbors were provided it, they and

Landes countered that about half of Muskingum County residents are not tied into the public water system even today. Among those without it are county commissioners, judges and other promisent officials, he said.

Zanesville has about 25,000 residents on the edge of the state's Appalachian region. One in every five families is below the federal poverty level, and the unemployment rate in Muskingum County in May was 7.4 percent. The national unemployment rate that month was 5.5 percent.

Actor Dennic Haysbert likes to believe his portraval of David Palmer on Fox's hit show "24" as the first African-American U.S. president may have helped pave the way for Barack Obman's bid for the White House.
