The Dunbar Panthers were unable to snork out the fire and brimstone of the Amarillo Dragons in a non-district game last Saturday night in Lowery Field, as they lost by a decision of 33 to 26.

Don Shanklin, a 160 pound Senior halfback, carried the pigskin over the goal line four times and ran a two point conversion.

With the Dragons holding a 19-14 edge at half time, Shanklin gathered in the second half kickoff, did a little

gear changing, and scooted 84 yards down the left side line for a touchdown.

Henry Planks, Joe Newman, and Clarence Hawkins were responsible for the points of the Panthers.

Amarillo scored a total of 390 yards, including 14 first downs, while the Panthers measured up 248 yards with the pigskin, with 12 first downs.

Dunbar will play host to Odessa this Saturday night, October 10th at Lowery Field.

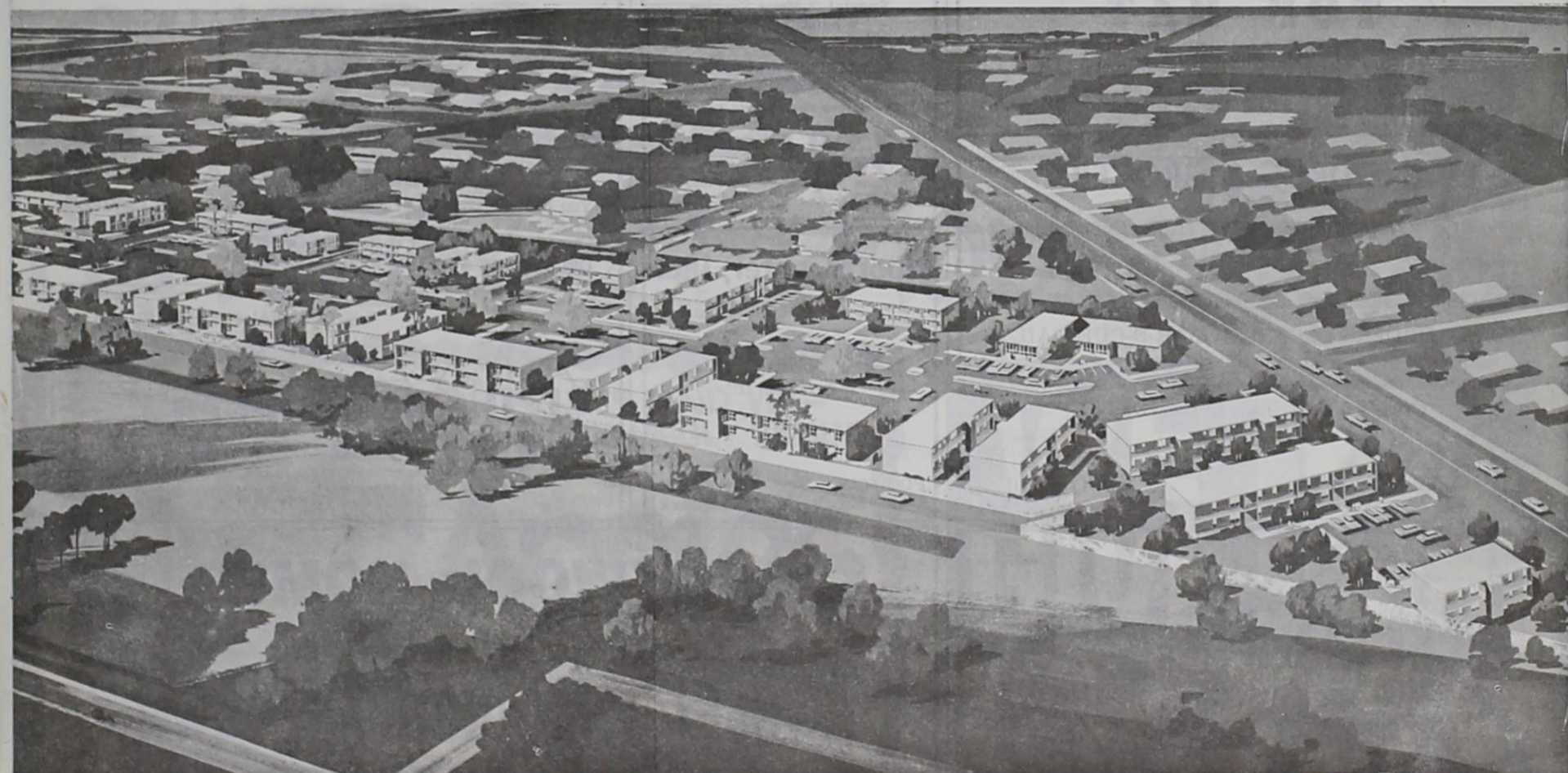
panded faculty of Booker T. Washington High School. She is Mrs. Ida Johnson, a native of Marshall, Texas.

Supporting facilities consist of schools, parks and playgrounds, screening fences, and a proposed fire station.

Dunbar Junior - Senior High School, Ella Iles and Wheatley Elementary Schools provide \$1,380,232 as non-cash grants-in-aid toward the overall cost of the project.

Booker T. Washington Park will be enlarged, a neighborhood park in the vicinity of 28 Street and Juniper Avenue will be developed, and improvements to Mae Simmons Park and Swimming Pool will provide additional recreational areas.
