Lydon B. Johnson, a native Texan, has assumed the burdens of the presidency on last Friday night, only hours after the assassination of our youngest president, and in an immediate flurry of activity won a pledge of bipartisan congressional cooperation.

Our new Cheif Executive won his pledge of cooperation from Democratic and Republican congressional leaders at a brief meeting shortly after his appointment as President.


