Clarence H. Priestly Named Assistant Principal at Ella Iles



Clarence Howard Priestly has been named as assistant principal at Ella Iles Elementary School and will begin work in that capacity in August. He has been a classroom teacher in Lubbock Public School system since 1959. His promotion is the result of the resignation of Mrs. Mae D. Simmons who was principal of Ella Iles for 14 years. Former Assistant principal, Charles Brown was named principal.

Lubbock is making history, Clarence was born here, reared and received his primary education here and since his college days has married, begun teaching here and is now one of the leaders in our community.

Clarence, the youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Carlton Priestly, was born on March 1, 1930. He began school at the regular time and age. May of 1946 he graduated from Dunbar. He attended Huston Tilotson College at Austin where he received his B. A. Degree, majoring in Biology. After College he spent two years in the army. In 1953 he began his first job as teacher in the public schools at Shallowater, Texas, under Mrs. Rosanna Harris, who was indeed an inspiration to his efforts as a teacher the six years he worked there. In 1959 Clarence received a Master of Arts Degree in Educational Administration from the University of Colorado, Boulder, Colorado. In 1959 he was hired by the Lubbock School system and began his work in September of that year. Clarence Priestly said, "During my three years at Ella Iles, no person has been of any greater help to me as a classroom teacher than Mrs. M. D. Simmons." (Continued On Page 4)
