New Social Security Explained

According to John G. Hutton, district mana* ger of the Social SecurityOffice, "The Social Security amendments signed into law on last Friday by President Johnson constitute a major milestone in the Social Security system.

Hutton said that the provisions of the new law affect virtually all persons in the Lubbock area either directly or indirectly. However, until further information is provided by the local office to the people of the Lubbock area, there is no action Social Security beneficiaries, persons over 65 or the general public need take at this time. "Specific informat ion about filing claims for the different benefits provided by the new legislation will be released this week," he went on to say. 

Loris is a graduate of the Booker T. Washington High School, and received her Bachelor of Science degree in Biology from Prarie View A & M College in May.


