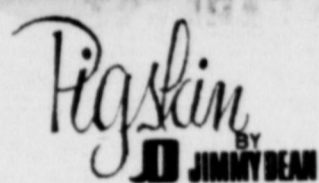
### Pampered Lady Beauty Shop Now Open

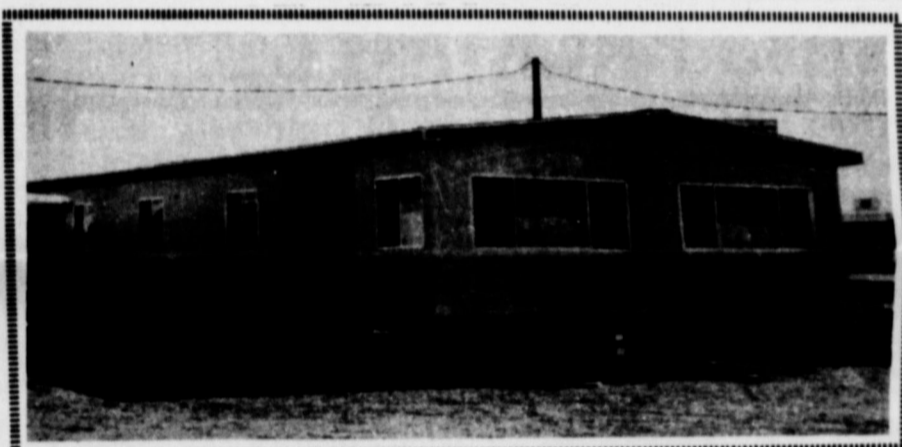

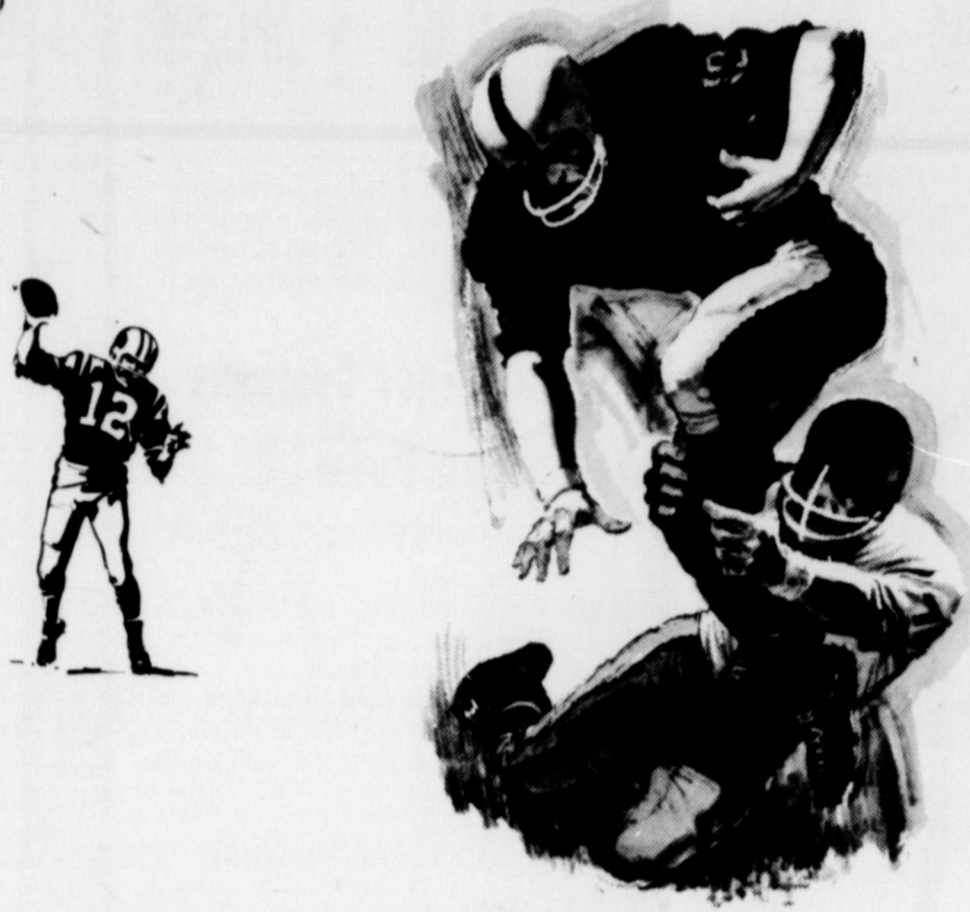
Skull and Crossbones awards went to; Lupe Flores, Randy Latham, Del Davis and Randy Bills.

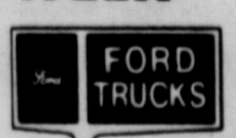

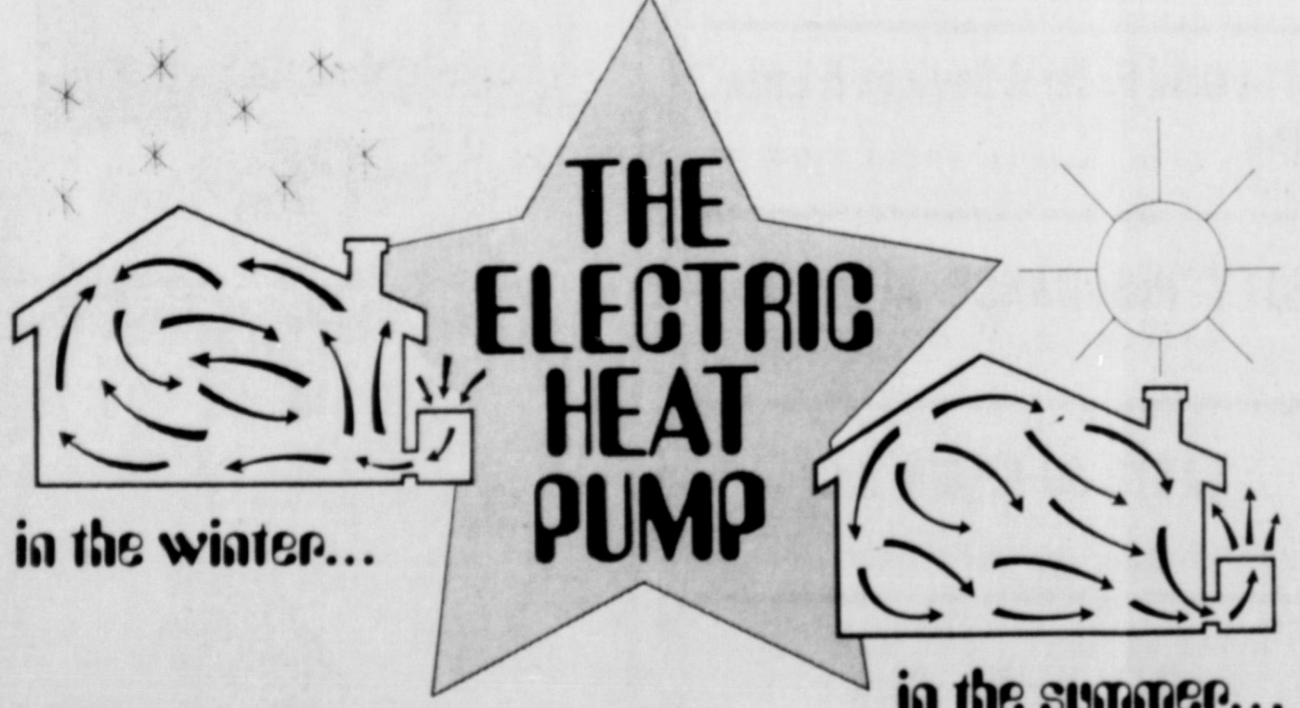
