PREVENTING BREEDING
Thousands of children and adults die every year from diseases carried by the fly. Typhoid plaint, cholera, intestinal disease and frequently death follow close house fly.
The control of the fly menace comes at the top of the list of which should be applied by every city and community in the State. The most effective measure ng . Flies breed in filth, and about eight days are required to complete a life cycle. During her life time of several months, on house fly lays from 600 to 1000 eggs. Thus it can easily bee seen
that in a season which usually be gins in the spring of the year, the lescendents from one fly number countless thousands.
To eliminate flies the breeding places must be destroyed. Manure piles, garbage, and other orgnic
filth furnish the requirements of warmth, moisture, and feed necessary for the propagation of
the fly. Flies should be kept from contact with food or drink or utensils in which such food and drink are prepared and served. Likewise they should be kept from access to privy vaults where they pick up the infections, which they later spread to humans by contact with the food and drink
