



# State legislators lower D.W.I. threshold to .80

AUSTIN — The Texas House last week voted to lower the legal intoxication threshold to a bloodalcohol level of .08.

Advocates of the legislation, SB 114 by Sen. Mario Gallegos, D-Houston, point to the fact that in 1997 Texas led the nation in alcohol-related traffic deaths with 1,748. made by a licensed lender. Of those deaths, 379 involved drivthe present legal limit of .10.
