The American Cancer Society predicts 2,900 new cases of melanoma in Texas for 1999, third behind Florida and California.

Recommended steps to protect you and your children:

- Use a sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or higher.
- Limit or avoid exposure to the sun's strongest ultraviolet rays during 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- When outdoors, cover as much skin as possible with a hat that shades the face, neck, and ears. Also, wear a long-sleeved shirt and long pants.

On Sunday, May 23rd, an afternoon performance will begin at 3:00 p.m. followed by an old fashioned country picnic in the school's courtyard.

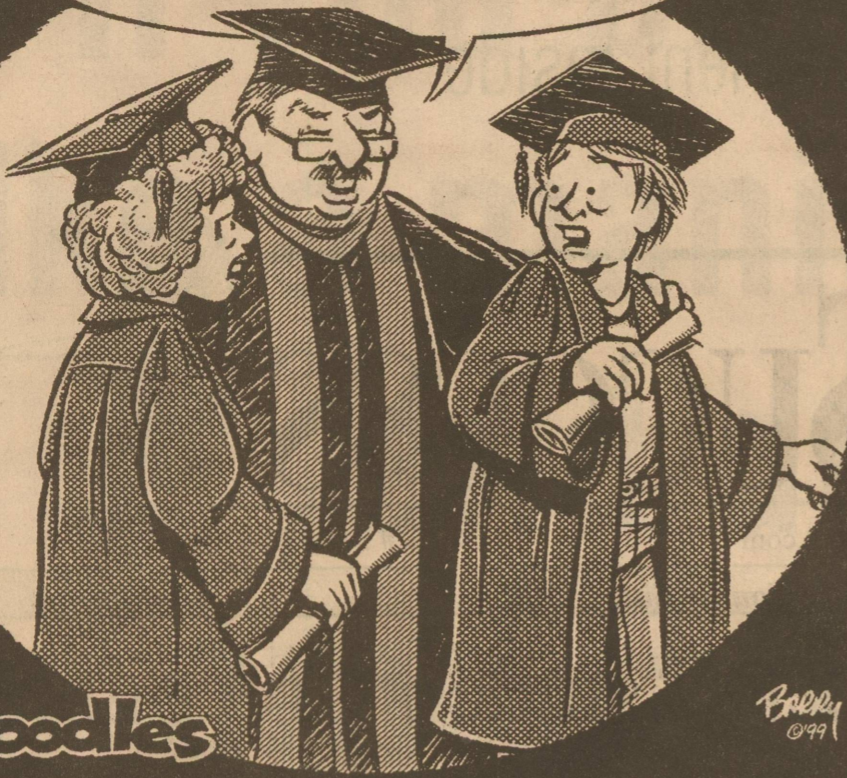
Tickets for the two Saturday performances are only \$5 while the Sunday show, including a picnic with southern fried chicken, is only \$10 per person.

State legislators lower D.W.I. threshold to .80

AUSTIN — The Texas House last week voted to lower the legal intoxication threshold to a blood-alcohol level of .08.

Advocates of the legislation, SB 114 by Sen. Mario Gallegos, D-Houston, point to the fact that in 1997 Texas led the nation in alcohol-related traffic deaths with 1,748. Of those deaths, 379 involved drivers with blood-alcohol levels under the present legal limit of .10.

The alcoholic beverage industry has argued that lowering the blood-alcohol standard will penalize social drinkers and that instead, more should be done to curb drunken driving, not drinking and driving.

Rep. Scott Hochberg said, however, that lowering the limit is not aimed at the social drinker. "It is not a glass of wine with dinner," he said. "It is a significant amount of alcohol."

If Texas lowers its blood-alcohol standard to .08, the state stands to receive \$12 million in federal highway grants.

But money does not seem to be at issue. Hochberg, who sponsored SB 114 in the House, said, "If it wasn't the right thing to do, I don't think we should have done it for the money."

Cornyn Sues Payday Lenders

Attorney General John Cornyn last week announced the filing of lawsuits against "payday" lenders.

Defendants include EZ Cash and Quick Cash of the Rio Grande Valley, and Cash Today, which has stores statewide.

"Businesses that break the law will not be tolerated — especially those that prey upon people most in need of help," Cornyn said.

Texas law caps the interest rate that may be charged on small, short-term loans at 10 percent, unless

made by a licensed lender.

Payday loans are short-term loans made by unlicensed lenders for up to several hundred dollars at extremely high annual percentage rates ranging from 650 percent to 850 percent.

Payday loan-businesses typically lend to consumers who live paycheck-to-paycheck or those who may not qualify for mainstream forms of credit.

Tobacco Money: How to Use It

Senators are showing they want to make sure that Texas' \$17.3 billion settlement with the tobacco industry is put to good use, according to a Senate news release.

The Senate last week approved Sen. Bill Ratliff's committee substitute for HB 1678, which would set aside \$500 million of the settlement into a permanent fund.

Earnings from the fund could be used to pay for tobacco education and enforcement, public health programs, emergency medical services, trauma care and rural health facilities.

Other Highlights

- According to a report published by the *Austin American-Statesman* last week, records released by the Texas Education Agency show that school districts can't account for about 55,700 seventh- through 12th-graders who left Texas schools in 1997-98.

- Former prisoners of war from

Texas, including recently released soldier Steven Gonzales, would get a free public college or university education under legislation sponsored by Sen. Eddie Lucio Jr., D-Brownsville.

- Dallas investor Tom Hicks and San Antonio attorney Tom Loeffler resigned last week as members of the University of Texas board of regents. Replacing them are Houston attorney Patrick Oxford and Houston businessman Charles Miller.

- The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs has approved more than \$15 million in grants to build Texas state veterans homes in Temple and Floresville. The long-term care facilities are for Texas veterans needing skilled nursing attention.

Odessa on Ice

The Music City Mall in Odessa has a number of stages where magicians, storytellers, singers and dancers perform. "We wanted people to feel like they had left Odessa for a while and gone on some kind of thrill trip," says mall manager Barry Marks.

The most unique thing about the mall is its first class, regulation-National Hockey League-sized ice skating rink. "The mall owner asked his granddaughter what she wanted to see in the mall. She said an ice skating rink."

They did some research and discovered there was not a sheet of ice within 300 miles of Odessa, so they built the facility. They even bought a new Zamboni to keep the ice in good shape. Barry says they use it in area parades to advertise the ice rink.

When ice skating in Odessa first began, crowds poured in. "We had to let 300 people on the ice at one time," says Barry. "And 300 more would be waiting to skate." The mall ran public service announcements on radio stations to tell listeners the best times to come skate.

"It was really something to see Bubba on ice," says Barry. "Somebody who would ride a wild bull had a new challenge with ice skates."

The Music City Mall ice arena has 1,500 pairs of skates to rent. "We have a shop and offer skates for sale," says Barry. "We sell a lot of them because people have taken to the ice real good and want to keep improving. You wouldn't believe how many talented skaters we have here in Odessa. Professional ice skaters teach people how to maneu-

Students heard at Congressional Hearing

Like all other parents in America, members of the House Judiciary Committee, including myself, want to know why the deadly rampage at Columbine High School in Colorado happened.

Preparing for a recent Judiciary Committee hearing on youth violence, I used my Internet web site to ask high school students from throughout the 21st Congressional District for their comments. Responses poured in via e-mail and fax. Generally, the high school students said the institutions of family and schools are in disrepair.

Students frequently described their daily school environment as being filled with tension and conflict between different groups of students, often including verbal and physical confrontations characterized by hate and fear.

"I think there is way too much hatred in our schools," wrote a San

a young woman from West Texas. Many talked straight about families and parental responsibility.

"This sort of anger does not accrue overnight," wrote a 21st District student via e-mail. "It starts at home." Another said: "Parents can be the biggest factor in preventing another tragedy."

Two final student comments are telling: "Most of the time when parents ask us youth who we look up to most, we say superstars or actors. If you look really hard, you will find out that really deep down inside we look at our parent more than any other person."

And, "Families that are family-oriented need to be the people that step up and take the students that are hurting in their arms. The Littleton kids were victims of a dying society that was built around 'I' instead of 'us'."

I thank these young people for sharing their feelings and good thoughts. I have made all their comments part of the official hearing record.

Antonio student. And from the Hill Country: "I can walk down the halls of my school and even though it is a small school I can still feel the coldness that some of the kids

have toward each other."

Students repeatedly wrote that they wanted teachers and school administrators to do more to create a school environment in which fear and harassment do not rule the day.

"I believe that teachers, with administrators, need to have a little more interaction with those that are not in the 'Popular Group,'" wrote

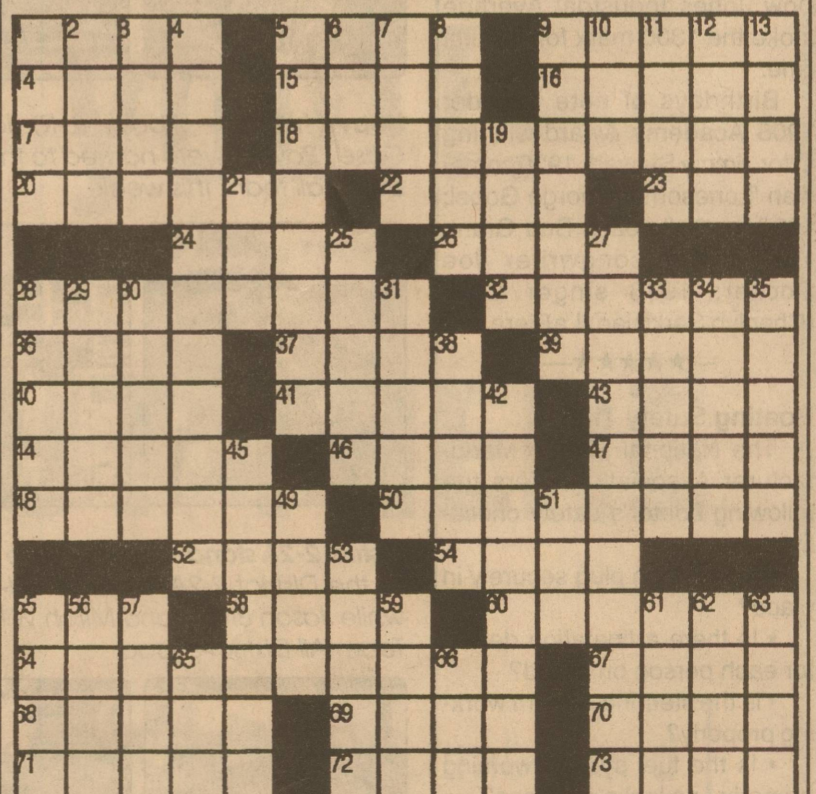

a bachelor's in business administration and a jurist's and doctor's degree in 1950.

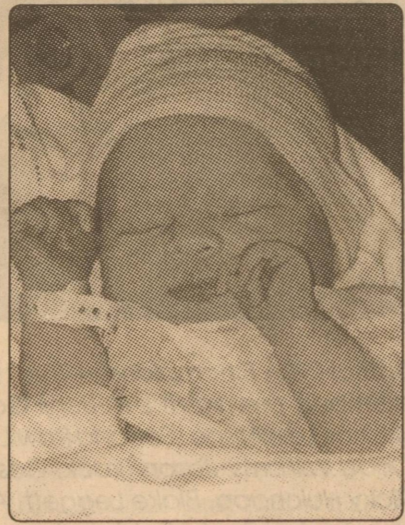

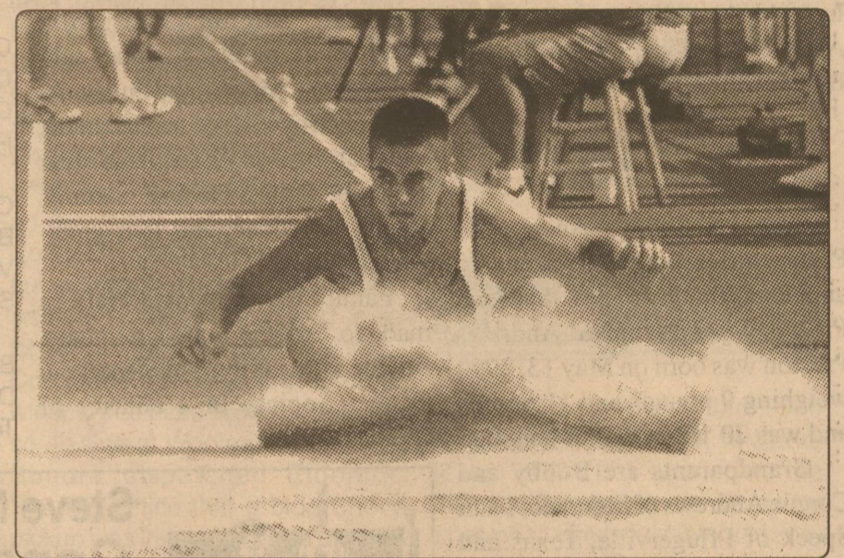

The time has come...controlling the Pecan Nut Casebearer

One of the most important infesting insect pests of pecan is the pecan nut casebearer. It is found in all pecan growing regions of Texas and southeastern New Mexico. Casebearer Larvae tunnel into nutlets shortly after pollination, often destroying all nutlets in a cluster.

The adult casebearer is a gray to almost black moth about 1/3 inch long. A ridge of dark scales fol-

lowed by a band of lighter color runs across the forewings. Moths are active only at night, when they mate and lay eggs on pecan nuts. Each female lays 50 to 150 eggs during her 5 to 8 day life.

Eggs are oval, flat and tiny, just large enough to be seen with the unaided eye. When first laid, eggs are greenish-white or white. Tiny red spots soon appear on the egg, giving it a pink color before hatch. Casebearer larvae are olive-gray to

jade green and grow to about 1/2 inch long.

First generation Casebearer eggs are typically deposited on pecan nutlets soon after pollination. Eggs hatch in 45 days. Young larvae crawl to nearby buds to begin feeding, leaving empty white egg shells on the nut. The tiny larva feeds for a day or two on a secondary bud at the base of a compound leaf before it enters the pecan nut.

Larvae generally tunnel in at the base of the nutlet. Silk and black frass (excrement) are often visible outside infested nuts.

Casebearer larvae feed for about 4 to 5 weeks, depending on the temperature. Full grown larvae then enter the pupal stage inside the nut. The moth emerges 9-14 days later. There can be up to 4 generations of the Casebearer during one

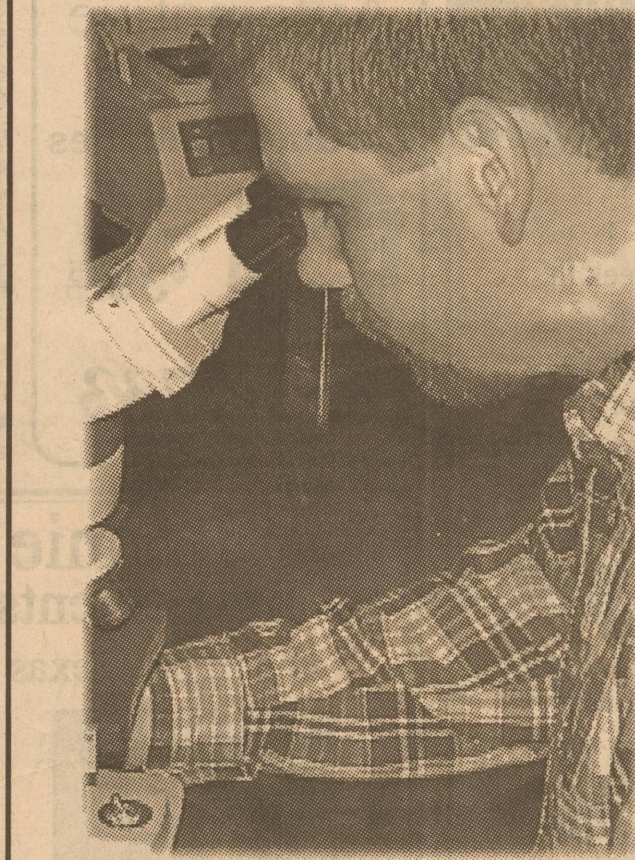

Controlling pecan nut casebearer

The key to controlling the pecan nut Casebearer in timely applications of the pesticide. Recent reports indicate moth catches using pheromone traps. Following moth catch, inspection of nutlets for egg lay is vital. Scouting for the eggs will aid you in determining the most optimum time to spray for the casebearer. It must also be pointed out that sometimes numbers do not reach economic thresholds and treatment would not be warranted. In simplified terms, don't spray just because you see one egg. Local reports indicate that it is time to spray for the 1st generation of pecan nut casebearer.

The selection of a treatment is

also very important. There are several insecticides available on the market for the control of pecan nut casebearer. There are also some B.T. products on the market that do well for the backyard tree situation. Always remember to read and follow the label directions that come with each pesticide.
