## Westbrook Bond Election Passes

Westbrook School District voters Saturday approved a \$400,000 bond issue to finance a building program for the school.

Taxpayers voted 79 for and 17 against the proposal, while non property owners voted 13 for, none voting against.

Westbrook Superintendent L. M. Dawson said "I'm glad to see a lot of people voting in the election". He estimated 250 voters in the district.

This gives the final go ahead on arrangements already made by the Westbrook School Board to issue the bonds. First South-

west Company of Abilene was contracted by the board to serve as financial advisor on the school bond issue.

Bonds will be retired over a nine and one-half year period at the rate of \$40,000 per year. No increase in taxes or in the tax rate base is needed, Dawson had said in statements before the election. The present rate of 35¢ per \$100, based on 25 per cent of actual market value, gives the district a valuation of \$7,000,000.

Half of the \$400,000 issue will be used to build a new auditorium of 6,638 square feet and 398 seats, including dressing rooms with restrooms and public restrooms in the lobby area.

The remaining half of the money will be used to remodel the existing building and add 1,300 square feet to the office area of the school. Included in remodeling plans are a new heating and air conditioning system, carpeting throughout, new ceilings, renovation of restrooms and added library shelf space.

The school board has not finalized plans, but is working with architect Don Hampton representing the architectural firm of

Hampton and Welch of Sweetwater, on plans for the building and remodeling.

Dawson said that the community has shown a lot of interest

in building two tennis courts on the east side of the school, with an additional shaded picnic area for summer play and relaxation.

## McKenney Quits School Board

Rex McKenney, former school board member for Westbrook School, recently resigned from the board.

McKenney said that he submitted his letter of resignation for several reasons. He said that Westbrook doesn't need the 398 seat auditorium projected in a building program for the school. He also said that he doesn't agree with the idea of issuing bonds to finance the building.

"I just think that the school should be run like a business", he said.

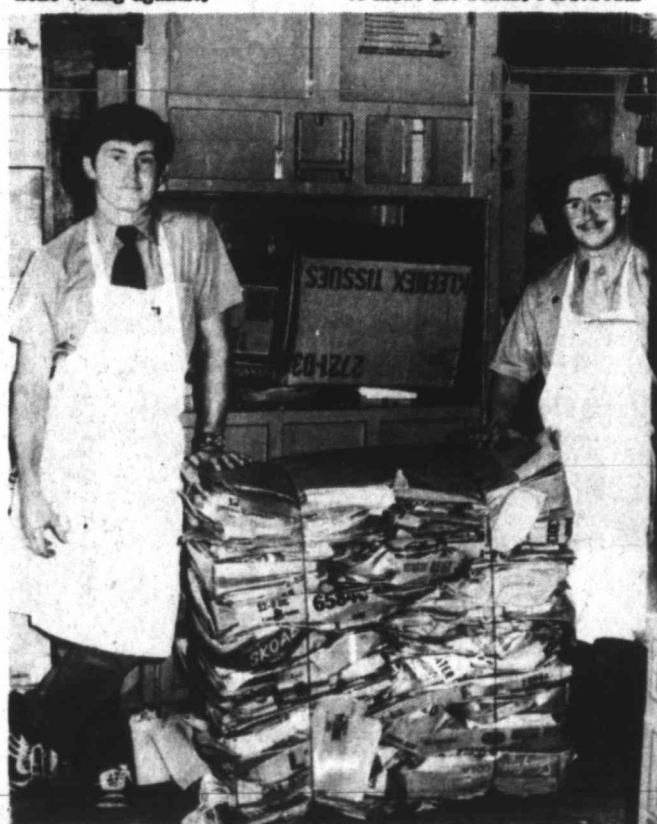
In explaining his statement, McKenney said that the \$280,000 to \$285,000 which the district will receive in revenue this year should be a sufficient amount to run the school and do any necessary repair to buildings.

As one final reason for his resignation, McKenney added that his daughter, Joyce, graduated this year from the school and he no longer has a child attending Westbrook School.

Westbrook Superintendent L. M. Dawson had no comment on McKenney's decision other than to say that McKenney seconded the motion that the bond election be held.

Dawson also said that the spot left vacant by McKenney's resignation would probably be

filled by an appointment by the board sometime in the near future.



### To Be Recycled

## Rabies Clinic Set Tuesday In Loraine

Tuesday from 1 to 5 p.m., a veterinarian will be at City Hall in Loraine to give vaccinations against rabies to dogs within Loraine city limits.

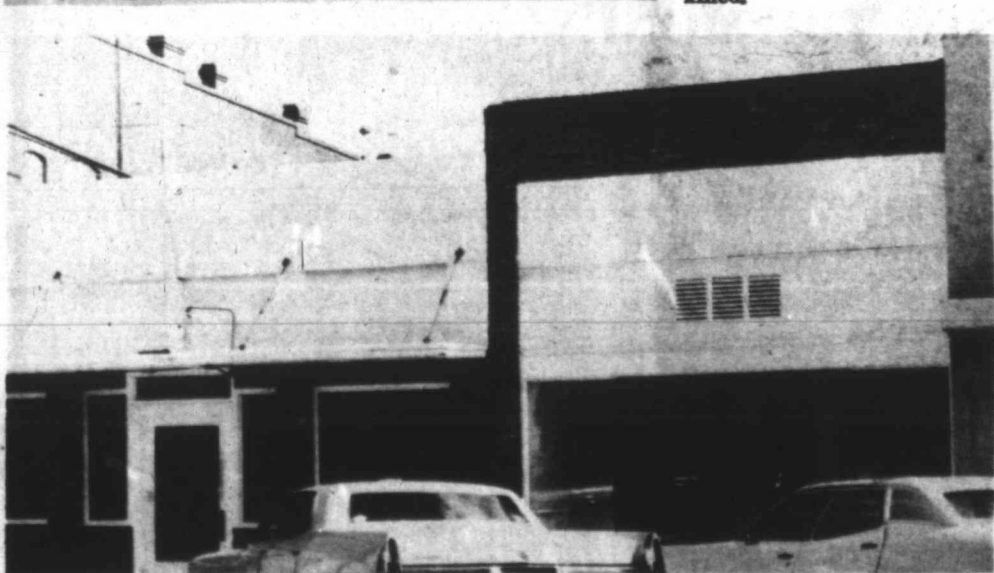
The Rabies Clinic is being held in order to help dog owners comply with a city ordinance requiring rabies vaccinations and dog tags for dogs

within the corporate limits. In a recent city council meeting, members of the council voted to enforce the dog ordinance.

Dog tags may also be purchased from the city secretary at the same time. Cost of the tags is \$1.50 each. Proof of vaccination must be given to the city secretary before tags can be issued.

The law reads "any dog running loose in the city limits must have rabies shots and must have city tags, or they will be killed".

The ordinance also provides that any owner of a dog in violation of the law will be fined \$7.50 per day the dog is loose. The owner is still liable for the fine for each day the dog runs loose even though the dog is killed.



### Downtown Facelift

The Record's circulation department has recently been moved from the main office on the north side of 2nd Street to the building next to Mode O'Day on the south side of the street. Loyce Jones is circulation manager for the Record and needed the additional space. The building

Tax Equalization Board for Loraine will meet at City Hall Tuesday, beginning at 9 a.m. Persons owning taxable property within the city limits and having questions concerning their taxes are invited to attend the meeting of the Board. Board members are C. C. Hamilton, John H. Preston and Everett Henderson.

Taxes within the corporate limits are set at \$1.50 per hundred dollars of evaluation. Real estate property is based on 65 per cent of actual market value. Personal property is based on 50 per cent of the market value.

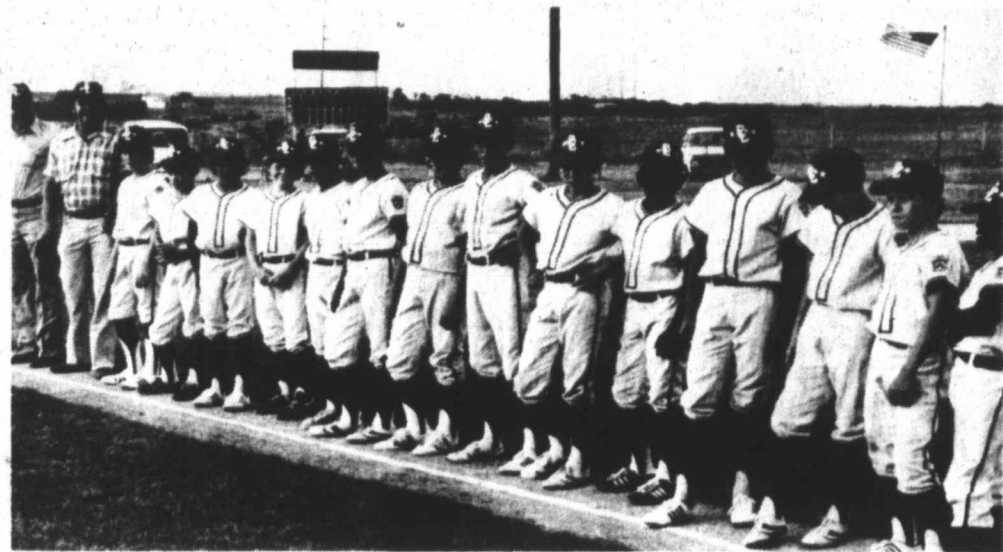
Steve Taylor will direct the music program.

and taught evangelism courses for two years at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth.

Lowery holds a Master of Divinity degree from the seminary and is presently working toward his doctorate.

He is a native of Aiken, South Carolina and his father has been pastor of a church in South Carolina for 30 years.

Lowery attended Samford Un-

iversity in Birmingham, Ala. before coming to the seminary in Fort Worth. He has written two books, "How To Be Happy and Stay Married" and "A Sleeping Giant--Today's Church".

He also holds the Stella Ross award for outstanding scholarship in evangelism.

Taylor has served for more than 26 years in the music evangelism field. He has par-

ticipated in 850 revivals, 650 evangelistic concerts and 164 evangelism and Bible conferences.

He is a native of California now living in Greenville, South Carolina.

For the past five years, Taylor has been chairman of music for the conference of Southern Baptist Evangelists. He has made four record albums and is under contract to Rainbow Recordings.

## Tanker Needed For Rural Areas

Members of the Volunteer Fire Department demonstrated the department's newly modernized water tanker at Colorado Livestock Auction Saturday for the benefit of county farmers and ranchers attending the sale.

Contributions are being solicited from farmers and ranchers for the purchase of another tanker and letters were mailed out to most of the county residents asking for donations. Kent Gentry, Fire Chief for the volunteer firemen's group, explained that the 1,300 gallon tank truck is especially effective in fighting grass fires and rural fires.

The 6-wheel drive tanker can be used in rough areas and has sufficient pump pressure to operate three fire hose nozzles, as well as being able to draft its own supply of water. It has been repainted from ar-

my green to white and decals identifying it as a department truck have been placed on the sides.

The cost for buying another truck and equipment will amount to about \$3,500 to \$4,000, Gentry said, and a number of people have shown interest in helping with the purchase.

## "Don't Panic" Advises Vet

Colorado City Veterinarian J. D. Williams Jr. said that there's no use to panic about the possibility of anthrax infecting county cattle herds.

According to Dr. Williams the disease is confined to an area centering around Falls County, south of Waco.

He said he had received two letters concerning anthrax vaccine, one from the United States Department of Agriculture Research Center in Austin and one from the Texas Animal Health Commission.

The letters informed him that no vaccine against anthrax would be available for the county as all available vaccine is being sent to the Falls County area.

"There's no use to panic about this", Dr. Williams said, "because if I find any evidence of the disease, I'll contact the government offices about getting vaccine here".

The counties receiving the vaccine are Falls, Milam, Robertson, Leon, Freestone, McLennan, Limestone and Bell. The order from the Texas Animal Health Commission was directed to all manufacturers of Sternes spore vaccine and to

all distributors, dealers and veterinarians in Texas who handle the vaccine.

Anthrax is a deadly animal disease that has killed 200-300 head of cattle in Falls and Limestone counties. The disease is caused by a bacteria that produces spores which can lie dormant in alkaline soil for years.

Animals eat or inhale the spores and become infected with the killing disease, death quickly following.

Land which has had an outbreak will be more likely to have another in the future since the anthrax spores remain dormant in the soil.

Burning the dead bodies of animals which have died from the anthrax infection is the most effective way of insuring that more germs will not get into the soil.

Since the right conditions are necessary, it is almost impossible to predict future outbreaks. But where there cannot be an outbreak can be identified, since the spores cannot live in acid soil.

Dr. Williams said that a couple of cattle have died in Mitchell County in the past from the dread disease but that it was some years ago and confined to an area near the Colorado River.

Current quarantine regulations require a period of 42 days after vaccination before cattle can be moved. The quar-

antine will last 21 days after the last anthrax-confirmed death in the area.

## Jackson Dies In Iatan

Tom Jackson died Saturday morning, suffering an apparent heart attack at his home in northwestern Mitchell County.

Jackson was brought to Rot Memorial Hospital but was dead on arrival.

Funeral arrangements are incomplete at Kiker-Seale Funeral Home.

Survivors include his wife, Theresa, of the home, and three sons, W. R. of Dallas, T. L. of Lovington, N. M., and Bill of Colorado City. Surviving also are seven grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

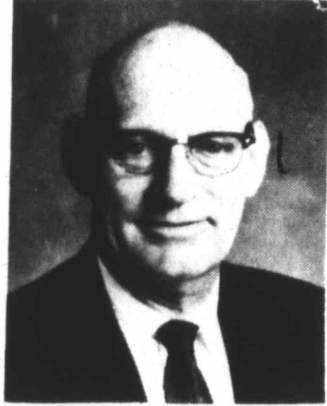

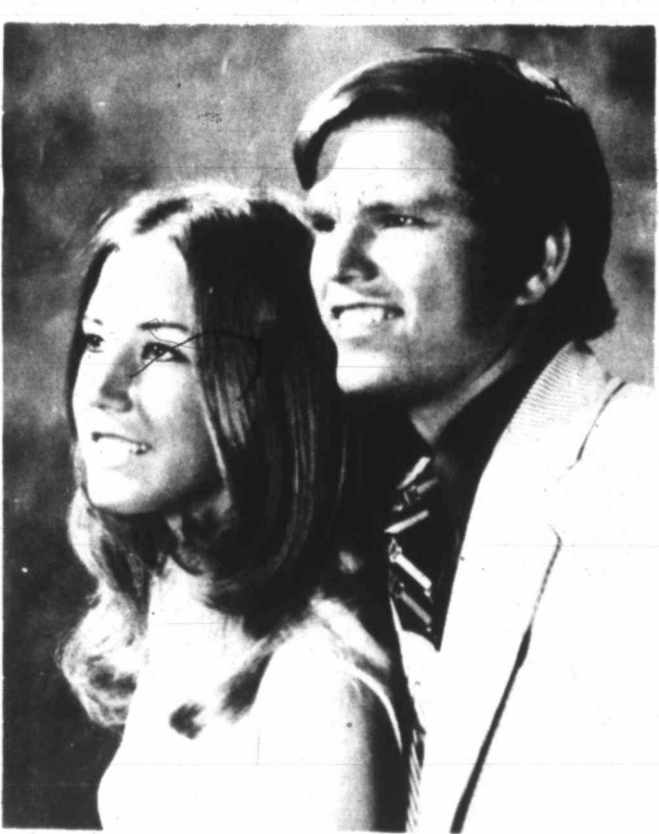
He is a retired Lt. Col. in the U. S. Army Reserves, a member of the Gatesville Lodge of Masons and Shriners and a member of the Baptist Church.

That same drought also hit the other smaller lake, but it had no effect upon its water level. It remained constant and it continued to pour out a liquid wealth to the city in abundance.

This is the way it is with the Holy Spirit in the life of a born-again child of God. For some Christians, the fruits of the Spirit that Paul describes in Galatians (5:22-23) barely exist in their lives. The spiritual level of their lives is at an all-time low. They are unable to meet their own spiritual needs much less help a babe in Christ with his needs. Then, not very far away are Christians who, like the small lake fed by the natural spring, are always spiritually full. Their cup is running over with an abundance of God's Spirit and their lives are fresh, clean, and as sparkling as spring water. They are like those that Jesus referred to at Jacob's well where He said, "But whoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life."

Jesus said in the Gospel of John, "I am come that they might have it more abundantly." Now--why are the lives of some Christians virtually empty having only a small trickle of the Holy Spirit while there are others whose lives are full and bubbling over with the Spirit of God? Jesus gives us the answer to this question in John 15 when He told His disciples that in order for them to bear

fruit they must abide in Him, and He in them. Being in Christ and abiding in Christ are two different matters. We are "in Christ" because of our salvation experience and by the grace of God, but we abide in Christ by personal desire and preference. Just as we must desire God to save us and to cleanse us from our sins, we must also desire to yield ourselves to Jesus and make Him not only our Savior, but our Lord and Master as well.

Luke tells us in the Book of Acts that a person receives the Holy Ghost (or Holy Spirit) when they repent of their sins and by faith, receive Christ as their Savior. In other words, God's Holy Spirit comes into the life of a believer when he is truly saved! Do you remember when you were truly saved? You were also filled with the Holy Spirit of God! A problem that exists today in the lives of many believers is that they tend to rely upon the apostolic experience at Pentecost rather than upon the apostolic teaching of the word of God. DO NOT TRY TO PATTERN YOUR LIFE OR YOUR EXPERIENCES WITH GOD AFTER THE LIVES OR EXPERIENCES OF SOMEONE ELSE! FOLLOW WHAT THE BIBLE TEACHES. There was only one "Pentecost" but there has been and there will be literally millions of true salvation experiences in which people will be filled with the Holy Spirit of God. Therefore, if you are saved, you are also filled with the Holy Spirit - yet your life may not show it. If this is the case, your problem is not receiving the Holy Spirit but yielding to what already exists in your life.

Paul and other apostles simply took this great biblical truth for granted as shown to us in I Corinthians. . . "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Holy Spirit of God dwelleth in you?" Beloved, Jesus desires that YOUR life be full and abundant. Yield unto Him, abide in Him, and out of your belly shall flow rivers of living water.

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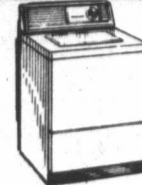

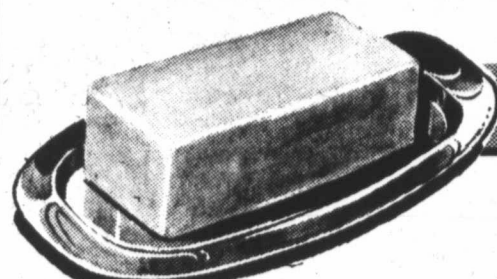

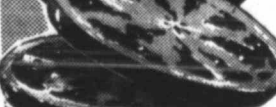
