I have served as Secretary of the Mitchell County Hospital Board since its inception. In those twelve to thirteen years, our hospital and its services have grown almost beyond recognition. This, I believe, has been possible because of two basic factors, the leadership of Charles Root and the availability of tax dollars.

In that time many problems have been met and conquered: the problem of improving our physical plant and obtaining highly trained personnel so as to qualify under Medicare; the problem of making expensive improvements and changes to meet the ever-changing Medicare requirements; and the problem of securing physicians for our county.

Although these and other problems have been solved, there will be other serious problems in the future for our hospital. Governmental regulation will become stricter, decreasing our income and increasing our costs. Inflation in the medical field is sky rocketing. And it will always be a problem to attract the sufficient number of qualified medical personnel that we

Election Day Set Saturday

Saturday is Election Day for Colorado City, Lorraine and Westbrook city councils and school boards and the Mitchell County Hospital Board of Directors.

By law, a voter may, if he so chooses, vote for one candidate only even though more are slated on the ballot. This, in essence, strengthens your candidate's chance of winning and weakens all other candidates' chances. Voters have been urged to support only the candidate or candidates he knows and trusts.

Polls will open at 7 a.m. and close at 7 p.m. Voting for the Colorado City Council candidates will take place in City Hall. Election judge is Sue McGuire, assisted by Margaret Oyer. Clerks will be

Judy Ritchey and Ann Nobles.

A total of 18 absentee votes have been cast for the five candidates. Candidates listed in the order in which they will appear on the ballot are Nina K. Crout, J.O. Dockrey, incumbent Jesse Munoz, Mac McKinnon and Odie Wise. Mayor Marion Bassham and

Councilman Loyd Ledbetter both have expiring terms but have declined to seek reelection.

The curriculum room of the administrative building will be the polling place for the Colorado Independent School Board election. Voting will take place See VOTE Page 12

Weather Seminar Draws Big Crowd

Mitchell County turned out in force for the weather spotters' seminar held in the Civic Center Monday evening with more than 50 persons attending.

School, city, county and utility company officials joined with the entire sheriff's department, city police, volunteer fire department, Lorraine police and volunteer fire department, Westbrook VFD and members of the local CB Club to hear a presentation given by Dave Harmon of the National Weather Service.

Two films were presented which depicted a tornado strike and the type weather which

spawned tornadoes.

"I really learned a lot from the films," Deputy David Ginkinger said. He explained the films had indicated what specific weather factors to watch for when conditions are right for a tornado.

"If it is at night, we were instructed to watch for flashes of light which could be caused when the tornado knocks down power lines. We are also told to watch the clouds when the lightning illuminates the sky for a funnel cloud," he said.

Deputy Linda Owens stated she had learned that a tornado normally comes from a "wall See WEATHER Page 3

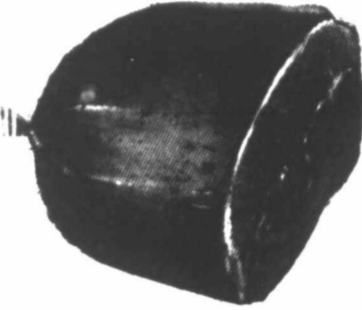

Examples were given during the meeting of five towns. Three of the towns had early warning systems and used weather spotters who moved outside the storm and also followed behind the storm.

"In the two towns without early warning systems, more than 30 persons were killed. In the three towns with warning systems, only about five persons lost their lives," Ginkinger said.

One point that Ginkinger noted in particular is that a weather spotter must be a person who is free to remain stationary for extended periods of time and therefore local law enforcement personnel are not the best choice for those spotters.

"If a tornado hits, we are going to have to move immediately to the area the storm has destroyed to try to help," he said.

Mrs. Owens, who is dispatcher for the sheriff's department, noted a major factor in any emergency situation is communications. She reported this was

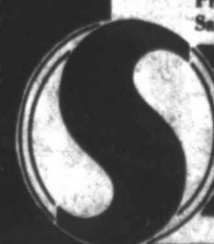

Thieves Hit Six Vehicles On V F W Parking Lot

Six vehicles parked on the parking lot of Veterans' of Foreign Wars Saturday night were broken into and numerous items were stolen, according to Colorado City Assistant Police Chief Jerry Cowin.

At about 12:45 p.m., calls began to come into the station reporting the thefts.

A 1978 Ford pickup had about \$175 in tools stolen out of the back. Another pickup, on which the doors were reportedly locked at the time the pickup was left and were still locked when the owner returned to the vehicle, had a C.B. Radio valued at about \$90 stolen from it.

The owner of a 1976 Ford pickup reportedly left his vehicle with locked doors and returned to find the doors unlocked and a .22 caliber rifle stolen. The gun was valued at about \$89.

A 1978 Ford pickup was broken into through a side vent window. A CB, valued at about \$120, was taken. The damage to the vehicle was about \$75.

taxes in the state. The district will establish values for all property in the county and each taxing entity will use that value in their tax collections.

Curtis Latimer, head of the Mitchell County Tax Appraisal District, said he recently attended a meeting in Abilene and was told that the first four things the district needs to do is:

- Appoint a chief appraiser.
- Secure space for operations.
- Furnish the facility.
- Appoint a board of equalization.

Burt was hired contingent on approval of County Commissioners of his serving in the two positions and using county space for the operations of the tax appraisal district.

The hiring of Burt was recommended by a committee that reviewed applications. After their recommendations were heard at the meeting Tuesday night, Burt was phoned and asked to come to the meeting, which he did.

Burt said he could take on the duties along with his other work as much of the two duties will be the same. He said he could do so with very little extra help.

He noted that if another office had to be set up, it would double the expense, expense which will have to be met on a pro rata basis by each taxing body in the county.

Eventually, Burt said he would hope to go with a computer service and that would require the employment of a computer operator and one other person.

He said that currently, his office is handling all pieces of property in the district. He noted the need for new aerial maps and Latimer pointed out that the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS) office is currently working on getting new maps and there may be a chance to coordinate this effort to save money.

Burt said he plans to seek bids from appraisal firms soon to get the county re-evaluated in order to get the new evaluations into effect for the tax rolls for 1981.

When asked about possible space for the office, Burt said more space will be needed than what he has now.

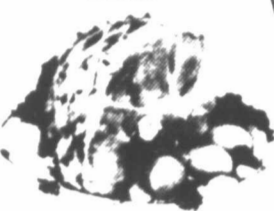

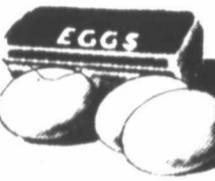
