BREAKFAST—Grapes, cereal, cream, salt codfish balls, corn meal muffins, carrot marmalade, milk, coffee. LUNCHEON—Chicken soufflé, creamed lettuce, arachis rolls, baked pears with chocolate sauce, milk, tea. DINNER—Roast loin of lamb, fried potatoes, grilled tomatoes, macaroni of vegetable salad, peach parfait, milk, coffee. Chicken Soufflé. One and one-half cups milk, 2 tablespoons butter, 2 tablespoons flour, 1/2 cup stiff bread crumbs, 1 scant teaspoon salt, 1 tablespoon minced parsley, 1-1/2 teaspoon pepper, 1-1/2 cups finely chopped cooked chicken, 2 eggs. Melt butter, stir in flour and slowly add milk, stirring constantly. Season with salt and pepper and add bread crumbs. Bring to the boiling point and cook two minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from the fire and add parsley, yolks of eggs well beaten and chicken. Mix thoroughly and fold in whites of eggs beaten until stiff and dry. Turn into a buttered baking dish and bake forty minutes in a slow oven. Serve at once in the dish in which the soufflé was baked.

U. S. WORKING FOR PEACE ON TARIFF

EMPLOYMENT OF FLEXIBLE PROVISIONS IN ACT SEEN AS RELIEF

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Oct. 3.—The study of the published French tariff note received Saturday tended today to strengthen the impression held by Washington officials that employment of the flexible provisions of the American tariff act, as suggested by the French, might answer their complaints against excessive duties.

Use of the flexible provisions, by which the President can raise or lower tariff duties based on the difference in costs of production here and abroad, appeared to be all the French note requested in connection with it being a basis for treaty negotiations which would give the United States as favorable treatment as any other nation in French markets.

At the state department it was said authoritatively that this arrangement was ready to investigate comparative production costs, without, however, pledging itself in advance of the result, and also to study existing administration of plant quarantine laws, the pure food act and even the prohibition act as far as it might discriminate against French goods.

Note Conciliatory

The French note, while containing much argument of controversial nature, was said officially to be conciliatory. The hope of the administration that way, may be opened to negotiation of a commercial treaty was tempered, however, with concern over the status to be given American goods in French market during the interim. They now are burdened with the maximum French tariff rates in certain cases and it was felt here that pending completion of a treaty American exports should be subjected to less severe levies.

Proposed Reciprocity

France rejected the original American request for negotiation on the basis of a most favored nation treaty, proposing instead a reciprocity—the also rejected at that time the American request for restoration of the tariff status of American goods prior to the French decree of August 20 pending ratification of such a treaty.

The counter French offer was a 50 percent reduction of maximum rates during the negotiation, which officials here hold would have left American products at serious disadvantage in competition with German, British or other goods that take the French minimum rate.

On that basis the French 50 percent cut proposal is wholly unsatisfactory to the Washington government, and unless a more favorable temporary arrangement can be worked out for the treaty negotiation period, a clash on that point conceivable could interrupt the most conciliatory of the diplomatic conversations evident today.

Drafting of the American answer is in progress and Secretary Kellogg anticipates that it will be sent to Paris in a day or two.

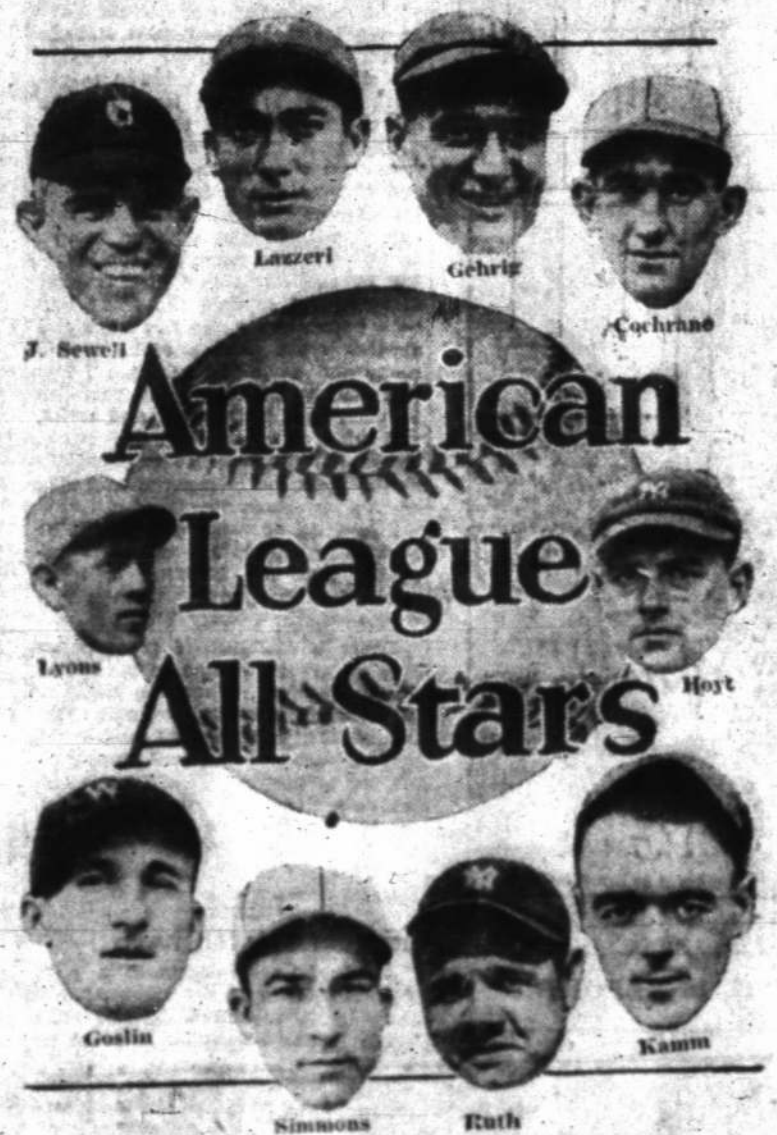

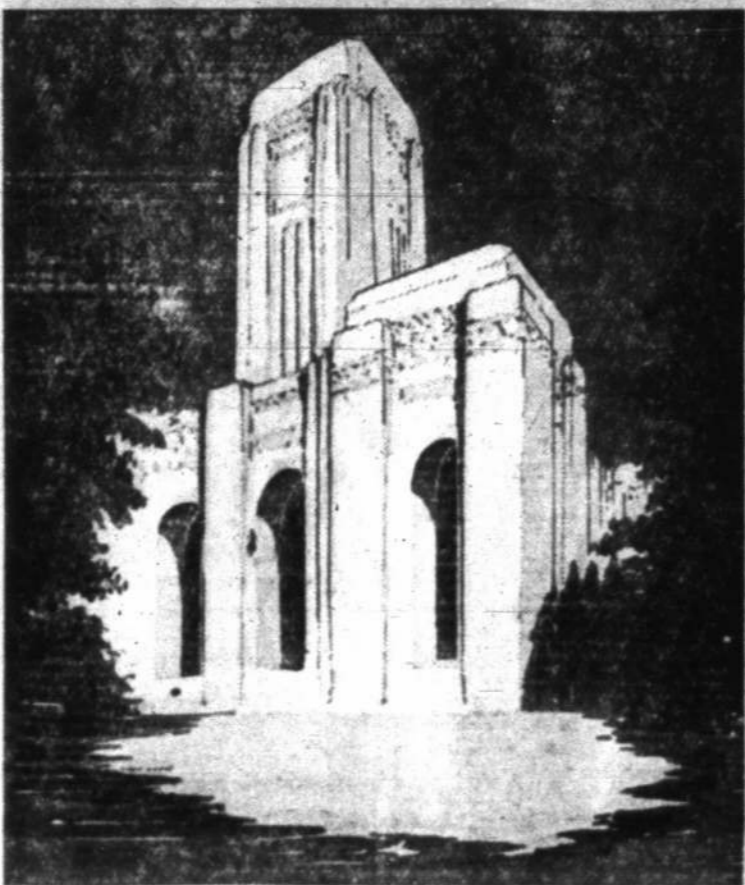

STREET RAILWAY MEN IN MEETING

SEVERAL SCORE DELEGATES ATTEND CONVENTION AT CLEVELAND

(By Associated Press) CLEVELAND, Oct. 2.—Texas street and interurban railway men here to attend the American Electric Railway association convention opening today have been gathering information on new styles in cars and methods of operation to be put into effect when they return to Texas.

Several dozen Texans from Dallas, Fort Worth, Houston, San Antonio and El Paso and other Lone Star cities are in attendance. They spent most of their time today examining the exhibits which cover the latest display of electric railway equipment ever congregated in one place.

Two New Cars Seen Two new cars, one purchased by the Northern Texas Traction System of Fort Worth and the other by the Houston Electric company, are among the interesting exhibits. They represent the latest work in comfort and safety and are being studied by the railway men from other cities who wish to see the progress being made in Texas transportation.

Leaders of the business state the street car and electric interurban have held their own the last year, having carried about 16 billion passengers.

The bus problem has been about settled by adoption. Almost 400 electric lines are operating in excess of 8,000 buses in accordance with electric cars.

Electric railway men declare that the bus is useful in coordinate service, and the practice in such cities as Dallas, Houston and San Antonio and Fort Worth, where buses are used by the car companies, is cited as the best method in this regard.

Outstanding Problem The outstanding problem before the industry, said by those attending the convention, to be the private automobile. How to induce the car owner not to use his motor in competition with the public transportation system has given the industry many anxious hours.

The three points which the industry is stressing in its sales efforts, which include expenditures of \$4,000,000 a year in advertising, are economy, speed and comfort of electric cars and buses.

The magnitude of the industry represented at the convention can best be appreciated by the following statistics: Capital invested, \$4,000,000,000; passengers carried annually, 16 billion; cars in service, 35,000; miles of track, 43,000; buses used, 8,000; miles of bus service, 15,000; annual income, \$1,000,000,000; employees, 300,000.

NEW ZEALAND ACTS TO SAVE WHALE

MAMMOTH ANIMALS FACE EXTINCTION, DECLARES GOVERNMENT

(By Associated Press) WHANGAMUMU, New Zealand, Oct. 2.—Whales are decreasing in numbers so rapidly that they will be as scarce as sailing ships in a few years.

The New Zealand government has limited the number of whaling ships in its waters in an effort to conserve the world's stock, which is now mostly in the Ross sea.

A century ago whaling in New Zealand waters was at its height and around 1825 the only whaler in the dominion—were those at the many whaling stations around the coasts of South and North Islands.

Since then the Ross sea has been nearly fished dry of whales, and now only one firm is permitted to go whaling in Ross sea and Antarctic waters. The concession is held by a Norwegian firm which pays \$1,000 per month and a royalty of 50 cents per ton on whale oil obtained. It has three whalers, small fast vessels each equipped with a "torpedo" harpoon, and a "juicy" ship of 12,000 tons equipped as a "whale factory".

In the last three years whale oil production has been increasing. Down in the Ross sea the 12,000 tonner "factory" produced 211,640 gallons of oil in 1924, a year later 1,286,000 gallons and last year more than 1,500,000 gallons. These quantities form 99 per cent of the world's supply of whale oil.

There are still one or two whaling stations in New Zealand home waters around Cook Strait and North Auckland, but the whales there are small, known as "humpbacks," whose chasing and capture is becoming less of an industry among the crews of government whalers than a first-class sport with a thrill.

The hump-back, though small, is as strong as a sea elephant, and slippery. Harpooning a Cook Strait whale from a gun of-board a bobbing motor vessel needs nerve and an accurate eye.

The jury, which had been out several days, in the Whaley and Jones versus Lemons and Hankins case, was unable to reach a decision yesterday morning and Judge Mulligan discharged them. The case involved the settlement of a boundary dispute on certain Hockey county land.

SCHOOLBOYS MAKE \$250,000 ON FARM

2,648 ENROLLED FOR CLASS WORK IN ILLINOIS NET SUBSTANTIAL SUM

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Oct. 2 (AP)—School-boy farmers, in vocation agricultural classes in Illinois high schools, last year earned more than \$250,000 from their projects.

The students are required to raise a small plot of grain or being an animal to maturity, as a practical demonstration of the theories taught them, before they are given credit for their work.

Out of 2,648 boys enrolling for the projects, 1,320 raised animals, 1,115 raised a crop of grain and 212 engaged in non-financial ventures. Their total earnings amounted to \$250,000.

Eleven standard grain projects including the growing of alfalfa, barley, corn, garden produce, oats, potatoes, soy beans, sweet clover, rye, wheat and orchard, netted \$113,569.19, or an average of \$101.31

FIVE BREAK PRISON

Daring Prisoners Saw Way Through Two Barracks at Galveston Last Night

GALVESTON, Oct. 2 (AP)—Five prisoners, escaped from the county jail here tonight by sawing their way to liberty through a steel cage and later through a half inch steel roof plate.

The jailbreak, which was one of the most daring ever perpetrated in this section, was discovered at 8:15 o'clock by Pat Guard, Joe Meyers and J. W. Trammell, when making a check of the prisoners.

Immediately on discovery that the men escaped, both jailers rushed to the roof of the four story building, to find that their prisoners had finally escaped by means of ropes made from their cell mattresses.

WATCH MAYOR WALKER

New York Executive Was At All Times "Shadowed" During His Recent Journey Abroad

NEW YORK, Oct. 2 (AP)—Statements emanating from friends of Mayor James J. Walker, to the effect that during his recent trip abroad, he was under constant surveillance were corroborated today by the chief executive himself.

His friends, wrought-up over the matter, have intimated that the "shadow" was employed by political enemies seeking to discredit him, but Mayor Walker refused to comment on this.

OKLAHOMA BANDIT RIVALING KIMES

ELMER INMAN EVADES HAND OF LAW FOR MANY MONTHS

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., Oct. 2.—By virtue of successful evasion of the law for many months Elmer Inman is Oklahoma's latest uncaptured and unofficial bandit king.

Inman, 35, has been popularly dubbed the successor in public interest to the dapper and youthful Matthew Kimes, who has been condemned to die for murder, but to the unscrupulous eye of the law he is just an escaped convict.

Inman's elopement with the daughter of a penitentiary warden, a brief attempt to reform and two subsequent and spectacular escapes from custody have set him apart from the run of unimaginative outlaws.

Ten years ago Inman was a clerk in a jewelry store at Arkansas City, Kan. For embezzlement from the store he was committed to the Kansas penitentiary at Lansing.

Because of his excellent behavior he became a trusty and was appointed as chauffeur to Warden J. K. Coddling. The notorious convict captured the heart of Lavona Coddling, the warden's daughter, and in the belief he would reform she eloped with him in 1911.

Inman soon became involved again in difficulties with the law, however, and his wife divorced him. Two years ago he was arrested for robbery of a jewelry store at Ardmore, Okla. With Ray Terrill, an alleged member of the Kimes gang of bank robbers, he broke jail and escaped.

Coming to Oklahoma City, he purchased a suburban truck farm in partnership with Alvin Sherwood and for more than a year posed as a gentleman farmer. Neighbors were surprised when Inman and Sherwood, who had gone under assumed names, were arrested while robbing a clothing store.

Inman and Sherwood were convicted, but on their way to prison last spring they leaped through the window of their train and escaped.

The outlaw, who is about 30 years old, usually presents a spry appearance. He has expressed a preference for death to further imprisonment. It was believed by Wichita police was Inman, but a dead hand was identified later as a former associate.
