MIGHT HAVE MADE MILLIONS

Many Valuable Inventions of Government Employees Are Given to the People.

Considering the relatively poor salaries Uncle Sam pays in Washington, the government certainly has made some splendid investments—not to say obtained bargains—in many of its employees.

This is especially in reference to valuable patents and discoveries made by men in the departments, the use of which costs the government and the public nothing.

It is the unwritten law that a government employee shall not make any money out of his inventions. The government and the people at large therefore reap a valuable harvest of inventions each year which cost them nothing and add immeasurably to the public wealth and comfort.

One of these inventors is Dr. Marion Dorset, biochemist of the bureau of animal industry. He is the man who first isolated the germ that is responsible for cholera in the hog. Then he invented a serum to combat it. Doctor Dorset protected his processes by patents and then turned them over to the public. But anyone who chooses is at liberty to manufacture and use this serum without paying a penny of tribute. It is an absolute antitoxin. It is estimated that this discovery of Doctor Dorset is saving the nation about \$15,000,000 a year in this one branch of its food supply.

Doctor Dorset is also the inventor of a secret ink used by the government in stamping meats that have been passed upon by the federal inspectors in the packing houses. Prior to Doctor Dorset's discovery the government was paying a private firm \$60,000 a year for metal tags for the same purpose. The ink is far more effective for it puts the stamp into the meat itself. It cannot be transferred. Doctor Dorset receives a salary of \$2,500 a year.

Logan W. Page, director of the office of good roads in the department of agriculture gave to the world not long ago an invention of a waterproof cement which is of great structural value in the building of locks and dams. It has played an important part in the construction of the Panama canal. It is so valuable to many large industries that its inventor could have sold it easily for a great sum of money. A cement is produced that will make an otherwise porous structure watertight. Floors covered with this cement are damp-proof.

"Dedicated to the public" are the four words inscribed at the head of the patent issued three years ago to Maj. George Owen Squier, assistant chief signal officer of the army signal corps. His invention is revolutionizing the existing system of telephone communication. He might have sold it for a vast sum, but he gave it to the world for nothing. And there are others.

MAY OMIT STATE FUNCTIONS

Friends Believe Social Life of Wilsons Will Be Private During Coming Winter.

The cancellation of all social engagements at the White House this winter, since the death of Mrs. Wilson, is prophesied by those familiar with conditions and the personal of the presidential family and its connections. While an official announcement on the subject may be made for some time the belief prevails in well-informed circles that all the great state functions which would have been held had the mistress of the White House lived will be canceled and that what ever there is of a social nature will be private, the president following his disposition of inviting a few friends to be with him.

The suggestion has been made by a few that it might be difficult to do away with the diplomatic reception and the dinner to the diplomats given every winter, but on the other hand it is declared that there is no more reason why the diplomats should receive special attention in view of the circumstances, than others.

There has never been much inclination on the part of the present occupants of the White House to make the social life there a feature, and the opinion seems to be widespread that the Wilson family will have nothing of a public nature the coming winter.

Miss Margaret Wilson, the head of the White House since the death of her mother, cares little for the social side of life, her friends say, and her efforts for a long time to come will be directed toward filial watchfulness and care of her father as well as cooperation with him in plans he may make for the uplift of mankind.

Marlin S. Nichols

The subject of this sketch was born in Arkansas February 7, 1862. When ten years of age he came with his parents to Texas, and located in Erath county, which was his home for a number of years. Later removed to Cisco, Eastland County, where he was married in 1885 to Lily O. Linn, and continued to reside there for seventeen years. He was converted in a Presbyterian meeting at Cisco in 1887, and immediately joined the Methodist church and has continued a faithful and true member ever since. In 1906 he moved with his family to Ft. Worth, and in 1907 removed again coming to Kimble county where he lived until his death.

Ever since uniting with the church he has been an active working member. While in Eastland County he served as Sunday School Superintendent for a number of years. He was steward there for some years. For the past several years he has been a steward in the Junction M. E. Church and was recording steward at the time of his death. He was a man of staunch, outspoken convictions combined with which was an iron determination to carry out those convictions in what he believed to be right—let the cost be what it would. His life was an open book. He was a man and a Christian soldier all that the term implies. For fifteen years he has been a true sovereign in the W. O. W.

On Monday evening, November 2nd, 1914, he calmly sank to sleep, and when he awoke it was to see the smile of his Savior in the home of the redeemed.

As delegate to Annual Conference Brother Nichols, with his pastor Rev. C. W. Rylander had just returned from the recent meeting of the conference in Austin. Brother Rylander's last pastoral act in Junction before leaving for his new charge was the conducting of the funeral services of his friend and brother which services occurred at the home of the deceased at five o'clock Tuesday afternoon. After talk by the pastor the body was taken in charge by the W. O. W. of this place, who paid their last respects and conducted to the Junction cemetery where interment was made.

Several brothers and sisters, one son and one daughter, preceded Brother Nichols to the bright beyond. He leaves a wife and one son, Clarence Nichols of this place, and three sisters and five brothers are among the bereaved. 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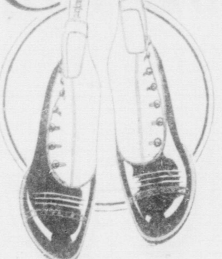

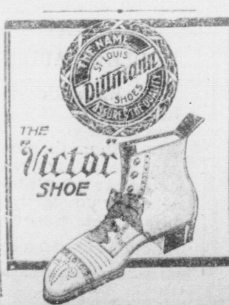

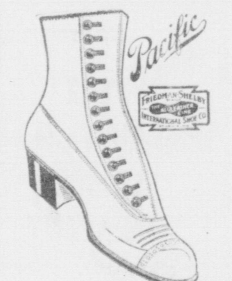
