A LOT SAID: A lot has been said recently about the celebrations honoring our military men and women returning home. Doc Blakely in his column "Pokin' Fun" in the *Livestock Weekly* makes a few excellent points. Thought you would enjoy reading something different this week. "In the Atlanta airport our designated plane was delayed two hours, stuck on the ground in Alabama because of thunderstorms. I glanced around at the crowd, all of them trying to be patient. A group of about 20 school kids, some sort of sponsored trip, probably ages 13 to 14, were seated across the row of seats from the lone soldier dressed in camouflage. He could scarcely have been five years removed from the silly acting kids on their spring fling. They were all white. He was black. The only thing that distinguished him from others waiting was his uniform and a shoulder patch that read, "Desert Storm."

There was a sadness in the young soldier's eyes and a look of experiences that gave him confidence and bearing for beyond his years. For an hour, the kids chattered. The soldier gazed afar, lost in the corridors of his mind. All of a sudden, there was a mass movement of kids, in unison, the way a school of fish moves in response to some unseen signal. My hunter's eye attracted to the sudden activity. I observed, curious, but too far away to hear more than fragments of excited questions from the youths, knees on the floor, sitting on their Reeboks.

Hands shot in the air as the soldier nodded in the direction, randomly fair, of a questioner. In a quiet way, he responded. The entire waiting area progressively grew more silent as bits of the conversation drifted my way through the static or competing noise.

"It was my job. I accepted the risk when I enlisted..."

"No, I was scared to death..."

"We all made out our wills..." An announcement came over the airport speaker that our plane was off the ground in Huntsville and would be available for boarding in another hour. The interview continued.

"Actually, I felt sorry for the Iraqis..."

"My crew had two kills. Soviet-built tanks..."

"I sold my car, gave away all my clothes. I didn't expect to come back..."

"Yes, I'd do it again...hope you don't have to...proud to be an American..."

Finally the plane arrived, unloaded, was cleaned, and the call given for immediate boarding. There was another flurry of action, a sea of blonde-haired boys and girls who encircled the sitting black soldier. As I passed by the huddled mass and peered inside the human circle, I saw a sight I'll not soon forget. Twenty hands thrusting out 20 scraps of paper. And a hero signing autographs.

Perhaps the strength of America is that even we don't understand it. But, if a scene like that doesn't set you on fire, your wood's wet.

1990 Loss From Operations \$838,761

Hospital Board Names Cleveland As New President, Audit Report Approved

The Fisher County Hospital Board accepted the 1990 audit report by the Lubbock CPA firm of Durbin & Company last Monday night and officially learned that the hospital suffered a loss from operations in 1990 of \$838,761 as compared with a similar loss in 1989 of \$868,910. The total bottom line net income figure, after taking into consideration tax revenues of \$817,180, reflected that the hospital had a net income of \$29,959 as compared to \$18,006 in 1989.

The board re-organized last Monday night and elected William Cleveland, Jr. as the new board president

replacing Frank Mitchell. Mitchell is still a member of the board. Other officers are Brenda McCall, vice president and Steve Nowlin, secretary.

Those present for the meeting last Monday night were: Brenda McCall, Horace Curlee, William Cleveland, Jr., Steve Nowlin, Arla Jeffcoat, Bobby Davis - Para-Medic, Amanda Smith - Basic EMT, Marilyn Turnbow, Brandon Durbin and Wendell Alford.

Board members approved the minutes of the April meeting.

They listened to a financial report by Administrator Arla Jeffcoat. In her

report, Jeffcoat indicated that revenue generated from April was \$102,134; she said that the hospital suffered a \$28,000 loss from operations for April but that she was encouraged, in that revenue generated from lab and x-ray services had increased each month for the last 5 months.

Marilyn Turnbow gave the board a quality assurance report.

Board members voted to purchase an ultra sound machine from Advanced Technologies Laboratory in Bothel, Washington for a total cost of \$20,950. The board is to pay \$5,000 down and the remaining balance in 30 days.

The board also voted to purchase a \$762 Midland (UHF) communication radio for the EMS department. This new radio will allow the ambulance to be in radio communication with Post and Lubbock hospitals on emergency trips.

The board accepted the audit report by Durbin & Co.

New Board President William Cleveland, Jr., complimented the EMS department on a recent CPR course they put on for the public. Cleveland encouraged the department to continue teaching the course for other public groups.

The board, after discussing the possible decertification of beds in the hospital north wing for long-term care; tabled any action until June.

Arla Jeffcoat informed the board that Kathy Summers, physical therapy department, was not going to be in the department during June, July and August.

The board took the recommendation of the Long Range Planning Committee and voted to begin forming a Fisher County Hospital based home health care program. They are in hopes of hiring a director for the program and having the program in place and operation by December.

The board, in final action, approved Dr. Wheat coming to the clinic to practice pediatry.

State Capitol Highlights

A House vote on proposed ethics legislation last week, ramrodded by House Speaker Gib Lewis, has rebel House members and members of the press upset.

Lewis' forces stripped the bill of restrictions on lobbyists, approved a surprise restriction on newspaper and television editorials, and then side-stepped an amendment aimed at the heart of the speaker's power structure.

Floor allies of Lewis, who stands charged with two ethics offenses and is the central figure of an ongoing grand jury ethics probe, termed the new bill strong.

However, government watchdog groups said pro-Lewis House members "pulled the bill's teeth" by removing restrictions which would have shut off the cash flow from lobbyists to lawmakers.

But they installed strong restrictions on press editorials about legislative issues; so strong, in fact that many media officials and lawyers interpret it as a violation of the U.S. Constitution.

List Ad Expenditures

The amendment, by Rep. Eddie

Cavazos, D-Corpus Christi, would require newspaper publishers who comment on legislative matters to reveal "conflicts of interest" with advertising clients alongside their editorials.

Lewis' advocates say this amendment will result in disclosure of any conflict of interest behind an editorial stand.

Opponents argue it merely provides the speaker and his allies with a hit list of local businesses whose own interests would come under fire in the House for opposing the speaker.

Throughout this session, Lewis has complained that the press has painted a distorted view of lawmaker-lobbyist ties as well as his own two pending indictments. Critics say he is trying to muzzle the press.

Kubiak Challenges Lewis

Controversy ignited when House members were prevented from voting on the key anti-speaker amendment because the speaker's parliamentarian said he lost the amendment.

State Rep. Dan Kubiak, D-Rockdale, has submitted an amendment to abolish the pledge card system in speaker elections.

Thus, Kubiak became the first House member to challenge the Lewis power structure since freshman Ted Kamel, R-Tyler, voted against Lewis on the first day of the session.

Kubiak said the pledge card system has evolved into a tool which forces lawmakers into two camps, friends and enemies of the speaker, exposing pressure from the speaker's floor lieutenants and lobbyist allies.

No-Pass, No-Play Rule

Observers predict education reformers in the House appear likely to block the Senate's attempt to weaken Texas' no-pass, no-play rule.

After a phone call from Dallas businessman H. Ross Perot last week, Speaker Lewis announced he opposes diluting the rule, which bars students who fail a course from participating in extracurricular activities for six weeks.

Rep. Ernestine Glossbrenner, who chairs the House Public Education Committee, said she will try to remove a Senate amendment that reduces the suspension period to three weeks.

Other Legislative Action

* A senate panel amended the House tax cut for pari-mutuel horse racing, sending pro- and anti-gambling forces scrambling to rally votes for the floor debate.

* The Senate approved without debate a bill that expands the list of crimes for which authorities can get court orders to wiretap a criminal suspect's telephone.

* The Senate approved an omnibus sunset bill submitting all state agencies to a review process.

* The Senate also approved a measure giving citizens age 21 or older the right to carry concealed handguns if they can prove a need for a permit from the DPS.

* The House voted to remove barriers which prevent filing of rape charges involving sexual assault of a spouse.

* The House also voted to establish a full state holiday honoring Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and eliminated Columbus Day

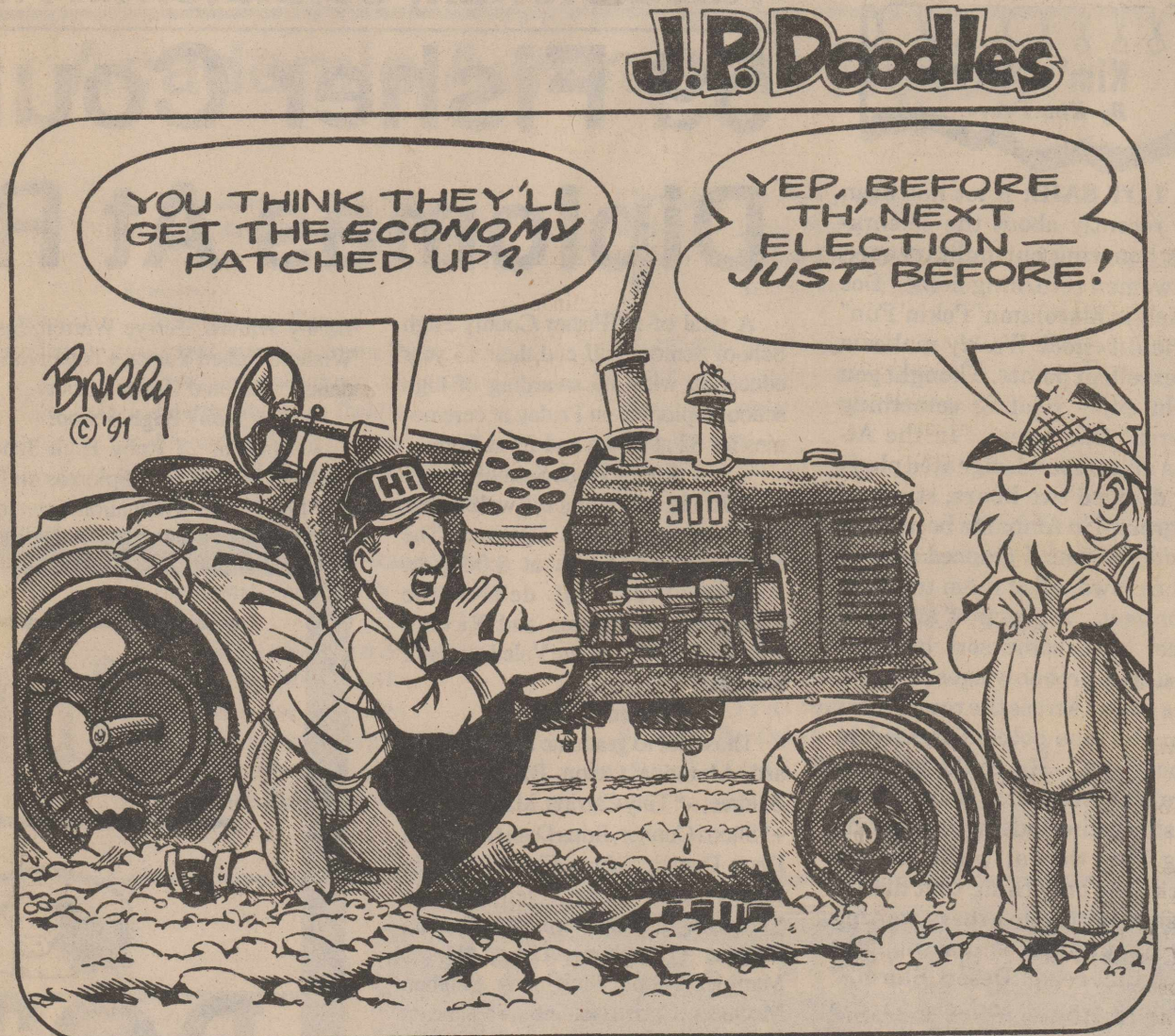
* The House advanced legislation to let non-violent felons do manual labor, such as cleaning streets, instead of prison time.

Other Highlights

* A new law signed by Gov. Ann Richards requires three state agencies to investigate whether the governor should grant clemency to battered women and juveniles which kill their abusers.

* Ron Lindsey, chief of the Texas Department of Human Services, will step down at the end of the month.

* Houston is fourth and San Antonio is fifth on the Census Bureau's list of cities with Hispanic-owned companies. In Texas, Hispanics own nine percent of all businesses, placing Texas second behind California.

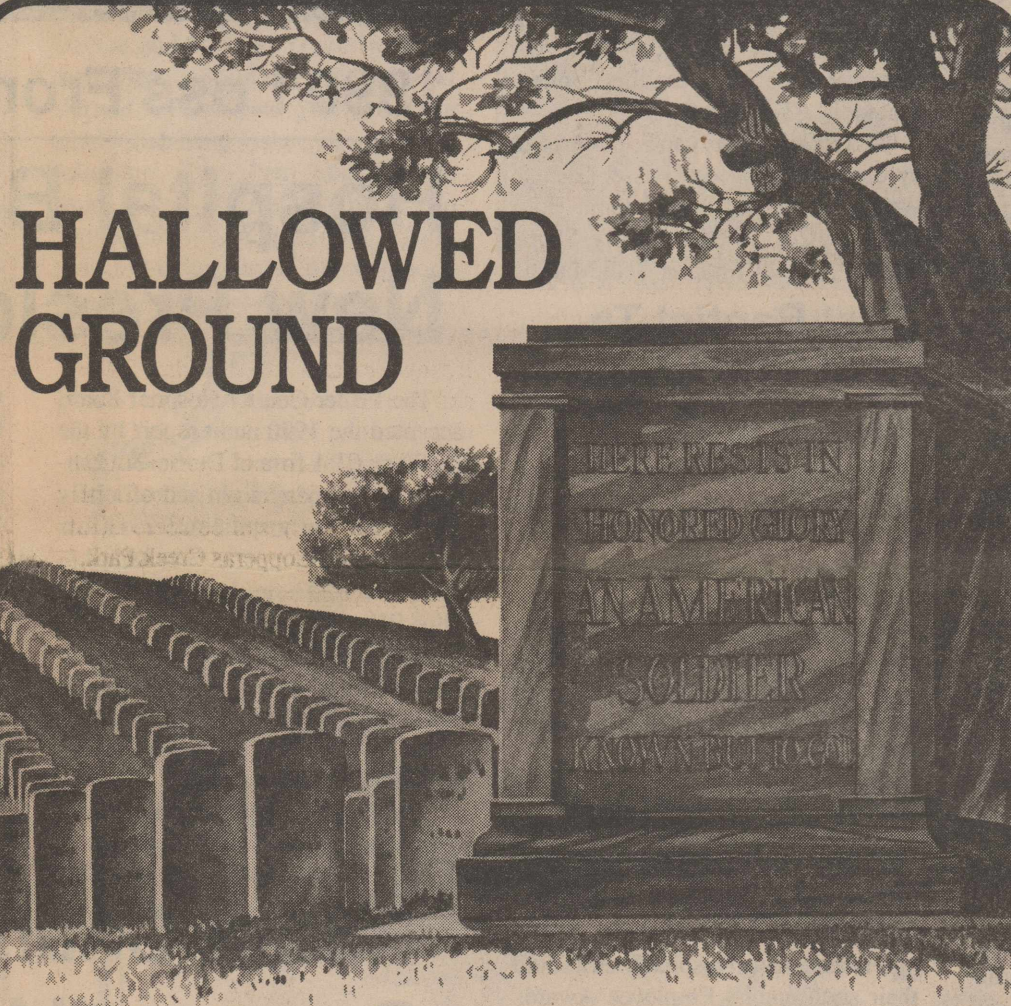

BUYING AND PREPARING FOOD FOR A HEALTHY HEART.....

The foods you eat and how you prepare them can affect your risk for heart disease.

During May, which is National High Blood Pressure Education Month, I suggest that Texans start buying and preparing heart-healthy foods.

* Choose foods lower in saturated fatty acids, total fat, cholesterol and sodium. Following these tips will help to lower your blood cholesterol level and help control high blood pressure:

* Choose fish, poultry, and lean cuts of meat; eat moderate portions (about 6 oz. a day or less). Choose fish and skinless poultry more often. They are generally lower in saturated fatty acids than meat. Lean cuts of meat include beef -- round, sirloin, chuck and loin; veal -- all trimmed cuts; pork -- tenderloin, leg (fresh) and shoulder (arm or picnic); and lamb -- leg, arm and loin.

* Buy lower-fat grades of meat. "Choice" grades are lower in fat than "prime" grades. "Select" grades of meat are lower in fat than choice.

* Choose foods containing less sodium. Most frozen dinners and combi-

nation dishes, packaged mixes, canned soups and salad dressings contain considerable levels of sodium. So do condiments such as soy and other sauces, pickles, olives, catsup and mustard.

* Trim fat from meats and remove skin from poultry before cooking and eating.

* Bake, broil, roast, or braise instead of frying to reduce the fat.

* Use salt sparingly in cooking and at the table.

* Drink skim and 1 percent milk rather than 2 percent and whole milk.

* Instead of hard cheese, choose low-fat cottage cheese, farmer cheese, or pot cheese which are lower in saturated fatty acids.

Choose low-fat cheeses that have between 2 and 6 grams of fat per ounce.

* Egg whites contain no cholesterol; substitute two whites for each whole egg in recipes.

* Use liquid vegetable oils that are highest in unsaturated fatty acids such as canola, safflower, sunflower, corn, olive, sesame and soybean oils in cooking and in salad dressings.

* Substitute low-fat or nonfat yogurt for sour cream in recipes or as toppings.

* Fruits and vegetables -- fresh, frozen or canned -- contain no cholesterol and are almost always very low in saturated fatty acids.

* Breads and most rolls are low in

saturated fatty acids; however, many other types of commercially baked goods are made with lots of fat, especially saturated fatty acids. Croissants, doughnuts, muffins, biscuits and butter rolls are examples.

* Pasta, rice and dry peas and beans can make good main dishes, casseroles or soups low in fat.

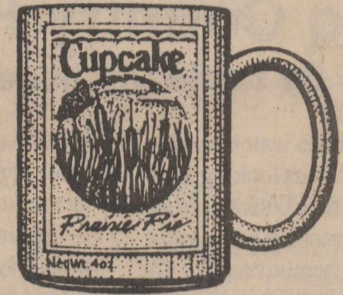
* Try angel food cake, fig bars and ginger snaps as substitutes for com-

mercial baked goods high in saturated fatty acids. Ice milk, low-fat frozen yogurt, sorbets and popsicles are good substitutes for ice cream.

* Limit salted snacks, such as chips, crackers, pretzels and nuts.

* By following these tips for taking control and buying and preparing heart-healthy foods. You can control your blood pressure for a longer, healthier life.

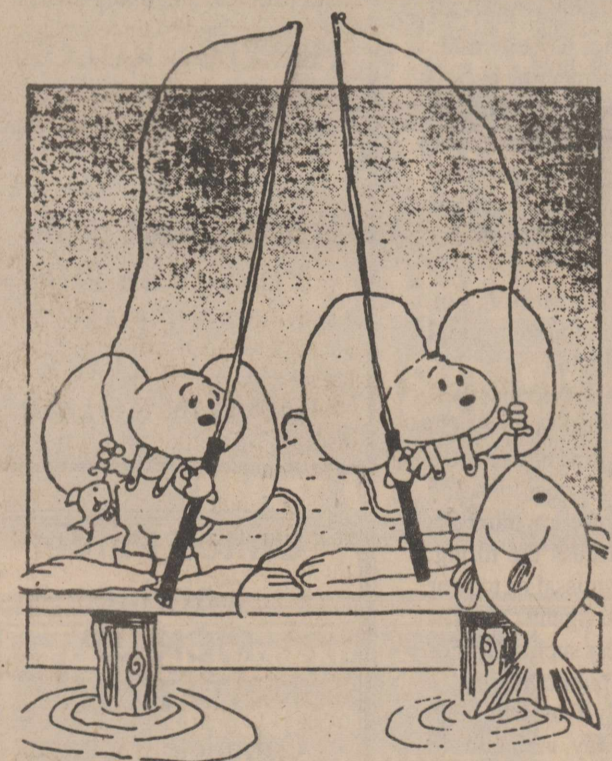

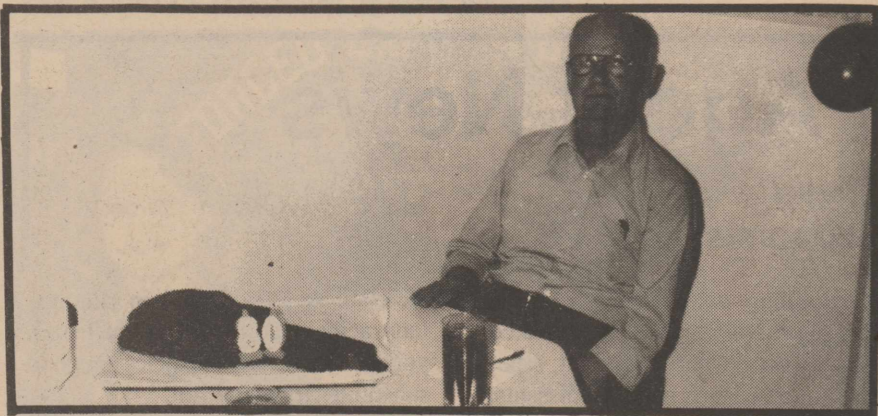

Bug Country Report

By Louis D. Chedester

It's that time again to watch out for this "little varment". Start looking at or near the tip of the nutlets between May 25 and June 2. The greenish white eggs are smaller than the head of a pin. To determine when control measures should be applied, 100 nutlet clusters should be inspected every two to three days. Flag clusters where pecan nut casebearer eggs are found. Control measures are needed about two to three days after the first eggs hatch. Insecticide applications must be applied to

control casebearer larvae before they enter the nuts. Once inside the nutlets, larvae are protected from insecticides.

To time the insecticidal application precisely to maximize the residual activity of the insecticide, make the application when the first nutlet entry in 100 clusters is found. A second application may be needed when there is an extended egg-lay. Begin inspecting nutlets about three days after the first application. Make the second application when the first new nutlet entry per 100 cluster is observed.

Insecticides that might be used for pecan nut casebearer control in the home landscape are Malathion, Sevin, Thiodan, and Lorsban. Be sure that the insecticide used is labeled for pecan nut casebearer. Read and follow label instructions. Additional information on control of the pecan nut casebearer or other pecan pests is available at the County Extension Office.

Kerrville Paper Alleges Open Meeting Violation

The Kerrville Daily Times has sued the city council alleging repeated violations of the Texas Open Meetings Act and the city charter.

The lawsuit, filed on May 8, asks a district court judge to order the council to stop violating the law. It also seeks judicial review of audio tape recordings of council sessions closed to the public that the newspaper believes violated state law.

"It is our sincere hope that the city council would join us in avoiding this action by accepting our request to voluntarily allow judicial review of one specific closed session, but they refused," publisher James R. Gray said.

If a judge rules open meetings violations did occur, the tape recordings of those portions of closed sessions can be made public, according to state law. The council's actions in such violations would be illegal under the city charter and the state law.

Under the Texas Open Meeting Act, public officials are required to hold meetings open to the public.

The act allows officials to meet privately in certain specific situations, such as when a public body wants to meet with its attorney to discuss pending litigation, settlement offers or purchase of property, or to discuss the hiring, firing, evaluation, dismissal or to hear charges or complaints against an officer or employee, unless such officer or employee requests a public hearing.

The Kerrville Daily Times, through publisher James R. Gray, maintains in the lawsuit that the council abused those specific exceptions to the Texas Open Meetings Act on numerous occasions.

"The mayor and the city council of Kerrville, Texas have misused the provisions of the Texas Open Meeting Act by holding executive sessions that are not authorized under the act," the lawsuit states.

County Agents Column

Cotton planting began in full swing Monday and barring any major problems Fisher County will be nearing completion in 7 days. Due to bad weather in the Delta area, cotton prices could be as good as last year due to production estimates being down. Of course everyone knows that anything can happen before harvest time.

Fisher County residents have been highly supportive of the county industrial effort. More than 60 pledges have been turned in of a minimum of \$1000. Several \$50,000 stock packages are

also being worked on. Progress is being made on the project; but a lot of details have to be worked out.

Contrary to what many gardeners believe, the cause of poorly flavored cantaloupes is not due to their crossing with cucumbers! Off-flavor of cantaloupes is caused by excess water from rain or irrigation near maturity of the melons. Also, to insure maximum flavor of your melons, keep the plant free of foliage diseases and harvest when they "full slip" from the vine.

Toward mid-summer gardeners often complain that their once great tast-

ing cucumbers have begun to develop a bitter flavor. Although this occurrence cannot usually be prevented, it can be delayed. Bitterness of cucumbers is most often associated with old plants, low fertility, inadequate moisture, and high temperatures. Nothing can be done about the age of the plants or the occurrence of high temperatures always associated with Texas summers. However, maintaining adequate soil moisture by frequent watering and mulching around the plants, along with an occasional light application of fertilizer, will delay or may even prevent the development of bitter fruit.

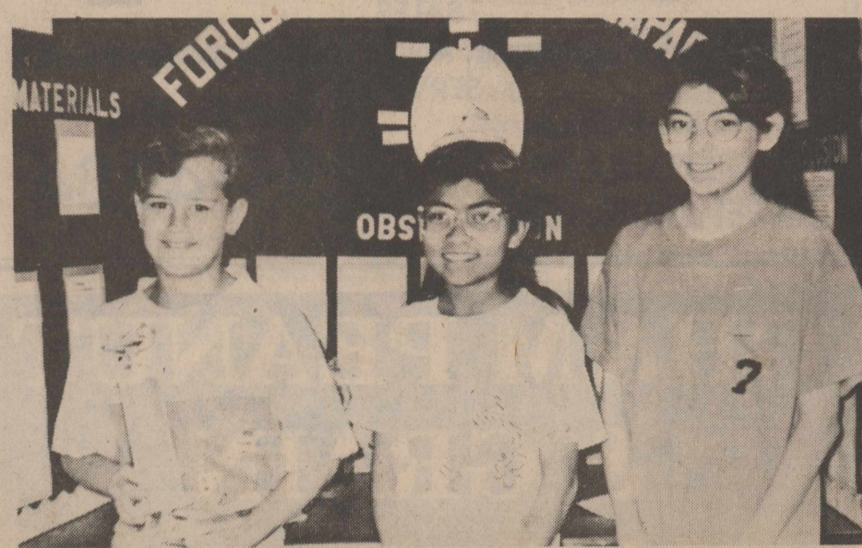

Ethics Reform Bill Passes House

The ethics reform bill passed by the Texas House of Representatives Friday, will create a strong state ethics commission and dramatically increase public disclosure of lobbying activities.

The bill, by Rep. Pete Laney, D-Hale Center, creates a seven-member, bi-partisan Texas Ethics Commission with jurisdiction over more than 42,000 public officials and candidates. Backed by audit and subpoena powers, the commission will investigate allegations of ethics violations and can issue fines up to \$5000.

Included in the bill is a long list of prohibited activities:

Makes lobby-paid pleasure trips illegal.

Prohibits state officials from being paid for speeches.

Prohibits political contributions in public buildings.

Prevents legislators from representing clients before state agencies.

Prohibits campaign payments to a business owned by a candidate.

Restricts top regulatory officials in representing clients before state agency where they served.

Prohibits hearing examiners in state agencies from accepting any gifts of food, lodging, transportation or entertainment.

Rep. David Counts, D-Knox City stated, "it is essential that we know the rules, I don't see a problem living within

the confines of this bill."

Other changes brought about by the house bill would dramatically increase the number of public officials and lobbyists required to file public reports.

New and tougher reporting requirements include names of public officials who receive lodging or transportation paid by lobbyists and reporting of all expenditures over \$50.
