Theo Herbst Found Dead In Bed

Theo Herbst living on his place 5 1/2 miles from London was found dead in bed at his home Monday morning. One of the children was sent to his room to wake him, and returned to her mother saying she could not arouse him and believed he was dead. It was found he had died only a few minutes before. Dr. Briscoe of London was summoned, and pronounced the man's death due to heart failure.

Mr. Herbst was a man of about fifty years of age. He leaves a wife and eight children. One of the daughters, Miss Annie Herbst is with the Fritz Hotel at this place. Mr. Herbst was of Catholic faith. A priest could not be secured for the funeral rites, and friends took the burial in charge; formal ceremonies will be held by a priest over the grave later. Interment was made in the London Cemetery Tuesday morning about nine o'clock.

Mr. Herbst had many friends to whom the news of his sudden death comes as great shock. He is spoken of by all who knew him as a fine character. Being of a retiring disposition only those nearest him could properly appreciate his true worth. A man of retiring energy, and faithfulness to those he loved. He was a man who would have no part with strife, but attended strictly to his own affairs, and lived his own life sincerely and honestly according to God's laws as he understood them. That he was held in high esteem was evidenced by the large crowd which attended the burial Tuesday. The Citizen joins in extending sympathy to the bereaved.
