1 arrested in drug bust

High school students turn out to support UBS

The Big Spring High School Student Council members were offering free pizza and snacks to the student population Wednesday and all they asked in return was a pint of blood. According to Linda Grace, United Blood Services senior donor recruitment representative, the agency was expecting to exceed its goal of 60 pints of blood by the end of the

student council blood drive. The drive was open to both students and the general public. "Twenty percent of all blood comes from high school blood drives," Grace said. "One of the reasons we are so short in the summer is because there is no school." Grace said the high school holds a blood drive twice a year, once in the fall and then again in the spring. Student council members Marcus Arrenondo and Courtney Myers

said the drive is an opportunity for students to give back to the community. Currently, UBS, which services surrounding hospitals, has about three days of blood supplies on hand for most blood types, Grace said. However, continuous donations of fresh supplies are always needed. Red blood cells have a 42-day shelf life, Grace said. Donated plasma

Understanding ag's impact

Students learn about importance of industry

Agriculture is one of this county's most important — and least understood — industries. To underline agriculture's importance, and perhaps clear up a few misconceptions, the Howard County Farm Bureau hosted its annual "Ag in the Classroom" event Wednesday at the Broughton Ag Complex at Howard College.

Elementary students from Big Spring, Coahoma, Forsan, and Sands were introduced to several aspects of farm and ranch life, including how cattle are branded and milked, how corn is shelled and milled, how cotton is ginned, and what kind of insects and other wildlife call this area home.

Although Howard County is considered a rural area, few youngsters realize just how much agriculture impacts their daily lives, event organizers said.

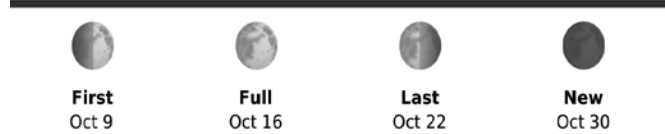

Contract Bridge

An unusual safety play

North dealer. Both sides vulnerable.
NORTH

The bidding:
North East South West
1♣ Pass 1♠ Pass
2♣ Pass 6♣
Opening lead — jack of diamonds.
Let's say, as an abstract proposition, that you have K-10-9-x-x of a suit, dummy has A-x-x-x, and your aim is to win all the tricks in that suit. This might not be possible, but suppose when you lead low to the ace, your left-hand opponent plays an honor as his partner follows low. When you continue the suit, your right-hand opponent follows low again. Mathematically, there is no doubt that you should finesse — the odds

are almost 2-1 in favor of it. However, playing for the drop might occasionally be preferable to taking the finesse because of other considerations. Here is such a case. You win West's diamond lead with the king and play a low trump to the ace, on which West produces the queen. You return a trump from dummy, East following low, and, ordinarily, you would finesse the nine. But in this deal, you should play the king, since you assure the slam by doing so, while you jeopardize the slam by finessing. In the actual deal, West's jack falls under the king, so all you lose is the king of hearts. But now let's suppose West shows out on the second trump lead, which means East has a trump trick coming. In that case, you next cash the diamond ace, lead a club to the jack and ruff dummy's last diamond. Then you run your clubs. If East refuses to ruff, you put him on lead with a trump. This forces him to return a heart to dummy's A-Q or hand you a ruff-and-discard. Either way you make the slam. Going up with the king of trumps is a guaranteed safety play that caters to the other key factors in the deal instead of only the trump distribution.

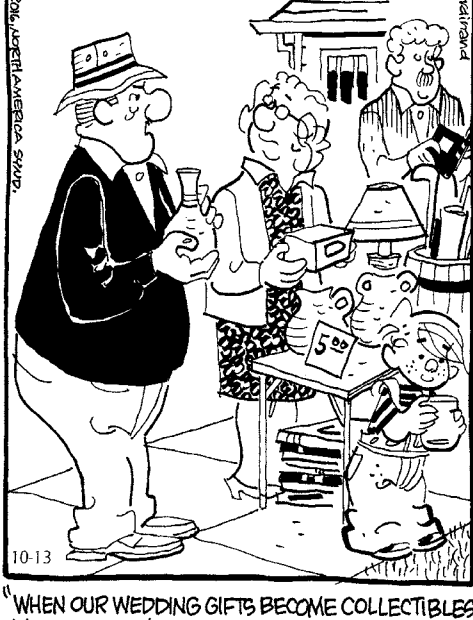

This Date In History

Today is Thursday, Oct. 13, the 287th day of 2016. There are 79 days left in the year.

Today's Highlight in History:
On Oct. 13, 1792, the cornerstone of the executive mansion, later known as the White House, was laid during a ceremony in the District of Columbia.

On this date:
In A.D. 54, Roman Emperor Claudius I died, poisoned apparently at the behest of his wife, Agrippina (ag-rih-PEE'nuh).
In 1775, the United States Navy had its origins as the Continental Congress ordered the construction of a naval fleet.
In 1843, the Jewish organization B'nai B'rith (buh-NAY' brith) was founded in New York City.
In 1932, President Herbert Hoover and Chief Justice Charles Evans Hughes laid the cornerstone for the U.S. Supreme Court building in Washington.
In 1944, during World War II, American troops entered Aachen, Germany.
In 1957, CBS-TV broadcast "The Edsel Show," a one-hour live special starring Bing Crosby designed to promote the new, ill-fated Ford automobile. (It was the first special to use videotape technology to delay the broadcast to the West Coast.)

In 1962, Edward Albee's four-character drama "Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?" opened on Broadway.
In 1966, actor-singer-dancer Clifton Webb, 76, died in Los Angeles.
In 1972, a Uruguayan chartered flight carrying 45 people crashed in the Andes; survivors resorted to feeding off the remains of some of the dead in order to stay alive until they were rescued more than two months later.
In 1981, voters in Egypt participated in a referendum to elect Vice President Hosni Mubarak (HAHS'-nee moo-BAH'-rahk) the new president, one week after the assassination of Anwar Sadat.
In 1999, the Senate rejected the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty, with 48 senators voting in favor and 51 against, far short of the 67 needed for ratification. In Boulder, Colorado, the JonBenet Ramsey grand jury was dismissed after 13 months of work with prosecutors saying there wasn't enough evidence to charge anyone in the 6-year-old beauty queen's 1996 slaying.
In 2010, rescuers in Chile using a missile-like escape cap-

High School Football In Howard County

Steers will need to stop run-heavy Bulldogs to get win

Coming off a loss in the district opener to the previously winless Snyder Tigers, the Big Spring Steers will likely have their hands full this week against the Abilene Wylie Bulldogs.

The Bulldogs beat Brownwood 35-13 in their district opener and look to be on a roll. Wylie's senior quarterback Zach Smith, who is half-

way through his first season as a starting quarterback at the varsity level, caught Big Spring head coach Clint Finley's attention on film.

"He's a heck of a football player. He's fast, makes really good decisions, he makes something out of nothing a lot, he extends plays, and he's hard to bring down," Finley said.

Smith finished with 92 yards rushing and 85 yards

passing in the Bulldogs' win over Brownwood.

Finley is also concentrated on getting his players coached on how to align themselves correctly against Wylie. The Bulldogs don't run a no-huddle offense, but they do snap the ball almost immediately after breaking the huddle.

"They play some tempo ball, but they do it out of the huddle, totally different than a lot of teams do it these days.

They come running out of the huddle, get lined up really quickly, and hit you with some unbalanced formations," Finley said. "They want to run the football; they're a run heavy team. They're around 65 percent run, and they're good at it. They're a bunch of good athletes, and they've got something like 37 seniors on their football team."

Finley also said Wylie's

experience in high pressure games makes them comfortable in any situation during the course of a game.

"They're very experienced, and they've got a lot of big game experience. So they're a good football team," he said.

Finley, who is normally determined to win the line of scrimmage week in and week out, said Wylie's ability

Coahoma off to good start in district

It was a full team effort in Coahoma's 35-8 win over Stanton to open district play Friday. Coahoma head coach Fred Dietz had his air raid offensive scheme working, and he said the defense played its best game of the season.

"Offensively, we started to throw the football better. We're running really crisp routes and throwing the ball on time. Our offensive line is continuing to allow us to get the ball downfield, those guys are doing a great job at pass protection. To me, that was what stood out the most," Dietz said. "Our defense played as good as we've played all year. We did a good job of playing team defense, playing assignments, and each kid taking care of their job. It showed in the end, we ended up really playing well and did a good job of shutting them down."

After their first win last

week against San Angelo TLCA, Coahoma enters its second district matchup on a two-game winning streak. A big part of that is quarterback Mason Moore's growth as a player. He finished Friday's game 10-of-14 passing with just under 200 yards and three touchdowns.

"He's, number one, getting pretty comfortable back there and understanding what to look for and what to see. He can see things happening before they happen now," Dietz said. "You couple that with for a couple months now, we've been repping this stuff and throwing these routes, and he understands. The kids understand, and they understand him. It's a comfortability thing and familiarity thing, and we're getting better and it's showing."

The Bulldogs, in addition to their passing ability, continue to get big games from their running backs. Braden Pearson finished with 101 yards on 20 carries and a touch-

down, and Joe Isaack had 59 yards on seven carries.

The wins and the ability to put together scoring drives have also given the Bulldogs greater confidence in themselves, according to Dietz.

"When you don't experience any success, it can be a frustrating time for everybody. Coaches, kids, fans. Not seeing your hard work pay off is hard. So to be coming off two wins and see some of our hard work pay off with victories, it's a big deal. It gets you going, and it definitely shows up week to week," he said. "It's a testament to these kids and their work ethic, showing up and going to work every day."

Next on the schedule is a team that's hard to put a finger on. The Idalou Wildcats were heavy favorites to win the district, but the early part of the schedule that saw the team finish .500 and last week's close win against a struggling Colorado City team show that they're not

unbeatable.

"With a quality football team like Idalou, I don't think you can ever get comfortable. Colorado City had them down 14-0 early in their game last week, and Idalou won 28-20. They're a football team where even if they get behind, those guys are used to being successful and winning games, so they don't really panic like some teams do. They just keep grinding and keep working," Dietz said.

The Bulldogs will need to play well up front and at the linebacker position as Idalou will try to run the ball as much as they can.

"They're an I (formation) team. They've been an I team forever. They're going to run the football, and there's no secrets about it. They put whoever they feel like is their best ball carrier back there, and they give it to him a whole bunch," Dietz said. "They're big and strong and physical. They really block well and they're going

to be well coached. Their assignments, they can do it with their eyes closed almost because they've been doing it forever."

On the offensive side of the ball, the Bulldogs might have a slight edge. Dietz coached with former Idalou head coach and defensive coordinator Don Long at Andrews before coming to Coahoma. Dietz said for the most part, Idalou still runs the same defense Long did, one he's familiar with after seeing it in practices for years.

"They run a 4-3. Coach Don Long, who I coached with at Andrews, he was the defensive coordinator at Idalou for a long time before he came to Andrews. So I'm very familiar with it. I know, for the most part, what their philosophy is," Dietz said. "We have a pretty good idea of where they're going to be and how they're going to line up. It's just a matter of execution."

With bye, Forsan has two weeks to prepare for Anson

The Forsan Buffaloes suffered a tough loss on Friday, falling to Hawley 58-14 after both teams entered the matchup at 5-1. Forsan assistant coach Dave Park said Hawley, who normally comes out in four or five wide receiver sets, used the air attack to get ahead of the Buffaloes.

"They threw the ball really

well. We knew going in they had a good quarterback. They had a whole lot more speed at the receiver positions than what we thought, and their quarterback did a good job. He put the ball on the money and made us pay," Park said.

Park also said Hawley played physical in the trenches. Forsan running back Tearell McVae, who went into the contest boasting an

impressive 14 yards per carry, finished with just 90 yards on 33 carries.

"Up front they were very good and physical. It seemed like every time Tearell was touching the ball, there were three or four guys right there. They had a good game plan and did a good job executing it," Park said.

Forsan has a bye Friday, which will give them two

weeks to prepare for a tough Anson team that is 1-0 in district play after beating Stamford 47-34 last week. Perhaps even more importantly, it will give the Buffaloes two weeks of rest following a tough stretch of games that have seen a number of Buffaloes go down to injuries.

"We got a little bit of time off with the holiday, but we can't rest too much. It's back

to work. We've got three more great opponents coming up. We do have to heal up a little bit, we've got a few people banged up. It was a physical game Friday, and we'll just try to refocus and get back on track," Park said. "Anson's kind of like Hawley was. They're going to throw the ball and they're going to

to run the football well puts pressure not only on the defensive line, but on the entire front seven as a unit.

"They do a good job of winning the line of scrimmage and coming off the football. They're really big up front, and they're strong, so it's going to be a big challenge for us. But we're up for it, we're ready for it, and we'll show up and play," he said.

The Bulldogs run primarily out of the I-formation, but have run almost every offensive formation in the books. They've lined up with two backs, one back, no backs, one tight end, multiple tight ends, and everything in between, according to Finley. "They've got a tremendous amount of formations, and they do it with a bunch of different kids. I think their favorite formation they ran seven times, so that tells you how many formations our kids are going to have to be able to get aligned to. That's something that's going to be very key," he said.

On the defensive side of the ball, they're even more varied. Finley and

Wylie head coach Hugh Sandifer named so many defensive formations the Bulldogs have run throughout the year that it would have almost been easier to name the formations they hadn't run.

"They run everything known to mankind on defense. They run an even front, 4-2, 4-1, 3-2, and they run every single coverage that can you match up with it. They're very multiple defensively and very aggressive," Finley said. "So you better know your stuff when you line up against them."

Though Big Spring lost by 20 against Snyder, once adjustments were made after the first quarter, the Steers actually outscored the Tigers 14-13 in the final three quarters of the game. Finley credited Snyder for breaking heavy tendencies in the first quarter to get a 21-0 lead. Finley also said he wants his team to be more focused on a play-by-play basis, and most importantly, eliminate critical penalties. Last Friday's game was the third straight game in which the Steers had 10 or more flags thrown against them.

"We try to use every positive that we can, but the key for us is we just can't be outcome-focused. We focus on the outcome instead of what it takes to get it done right now," Finley

said. "That's something that we've struggled with, and I think that's the big key for us to have any success. And we need to eliminate penalties. A hundred and something yards in

penalties, that's just too much to overcome."

The Steers and the Bulldogs will kick off at 7:30 p.m. Friday in Abilene.

Q&A with Abilene Wylie Bulldogs head coach Hugh Sandifer

What's the season been like for the Bulldogs so far this year?

Hopefully we're getting better each and every week, that's been the biggest thing for us. We've played limited games. We've only had four non-district games, and only had a nine game schedule before we even lost one to Argyle. There's kind of a sense of urgency with our games now that we only have eight in the regular season. We've gotten better, we're staying healthy, and the kids are starting to understand the mentality you have to have at this point in the season.

You've got a lot of upperclassmen on your roster, how have they helped get your team in position for a playoff run?

We've got a lot of seniors, but we've got a lot of new faces stepping in. We were fortunate enough to play 14 weeks last year, so we got a lot of good practice for those younger kids and they got to see the way it worked. So I think it's a combination of the seniors gaining the experience and maturity and then the younger ones following.

Is there any difference in the way your team prepares for a 6-0 team or

an 0-6 team?

Our kids, we've tried to teach them to respect the game enough and respect their opponents enough that you just play every Friday. And like I said, when you've only got eight games on your schedule, you better take advantage of every Friday night.

What do you think will be the biggest factor in determining a win or a loss Friday?

We've got to be able to tackle in space, that's for sure. They've got a lot of team speed and they get the ball

out quick to the perimeter. They do a lot of things really well, so we've just to make sure we slow them down some and make sure they don't have any big plays. And we've just got to get better at what we're doing.

What kind of offensive and defensive formations will Big Spring fans see from the Bulldogs?

We're pretty multiple. Offensively we'll do two backs, one back, no backs, whatever you see on ESPN I guess. But we're pretty multiple offensively, and the same thing defensively. With the offenses the way they are in this day and age.

More Steers to play both ways Friday

The Big Spring secondary is getting close to looking identical to its receiving corps.
A secondary that started out with one two-way player in Daniel Luna now includes only one player that doesn't play on offense in Rene Villa. Wide receivers Jeremiah Cooley and Dimas Garcia are getting more snaps in the secondary, and cornerback Leon Mathews has been getting starts as a wide receiver. Starting running back Robert Valencia has also been getting snaps in the defensive backfield.
A lot of that has to do with an undisclosed injury to cornerback CJ Harris, who will miss this Friday's game and potentially more, but Big Spring

head coach Clint Finley said it's more about an adjustment the team has made than anything related to injuries.
"I had a little bit of a different vision at the start of the season, but it didn't turn out that way so we had to make some adjustments. I think it's been beneficial, I just wish I would've made that adjustment quicker," Finley said.
Despite the increased playing time for his skill position players, Finley said the challenge isn't with conditioning, but with making in-game improvements to the game plan.
"For the most part I think they do pretty well. The hardest part about it is making adjustments during the game. Whenever most of them are on defense, offensively it's hard for us to

make the adjustments we need to make until half-time because they're out there playing defense," he said. "I don't mind them playing both ways, I want to use them both ways, and I wish we would have done that from the get-go, honestly. We'd be a little bit further along."
Mathews, who left in the fourth quarter against Snyder with a leg injury, is fine and ready to play Friday. Finley said his knee was a bit banged up, but that it was just a bruise.
The most concerning injury last week was the hit that forced Big Spring's Trusten Edmondson to be

taken on a stretcher to the hospital.
"Trusten's good. All the tests came back negative with no damage, so it's just a matter of regaining a little health, feeling good, and getting back out there," Finley said.

crucial touchdowns the past two weeks. He ignited the Coahoma offense with an 85-yard touchdown run against San Angelo TLCA in the Bulldogs' first win of the season, and got the offense going last week against Stanton with a 60-yard touchdown through the air from quarterback Mason Moore.
"Zach Holmes the last

two weeks has been as explosive as anybody we've had," Dietz said. "And defensively, Zach really runs to the football. He plays an aggressive style. A lot of times he makes plays from the other side of the field, and gets it done with effort and determination. So those two guys (Holmes and Clark) are two that have turned into really good football players that are big reasons for our two wins."
Dietz added that the speed that Holmes and Clark have is what allows them to compete at

such a high level.
"We play him (Holmes) all over the place defensively. Sometimes we play him in the secondary, sometimes we play him at our outside linebacker spot. I don't know for sure, but I would venture to say he's probably the fastest kid we have. He can really run," Dietz said. "Clark is kind of the same way. We play him mostly on the defensive line, and then he's our Y receiver, which is our big, kind of tight end receiver."
The Bulldogs are also

getting big games from two of their defensive stars that double as running backs. Joe Isaack and Justin Cuellar continue to successfully spell starting running back Braden Pearson on a consistent basis.
"We didn't get Justin mixed in there this week. He was a key part of what we were doing defensively, but I do expect to get Justin the football some this week. Braden kind of carried the load for us like he does," Dietz said. "Joe Isaack never comes off the field on defense for

us. He's a cog."
Dietz said the effort the team puts into practice, and the way the team practices, is what allows his team to have multiple two-way players.
"I think we're in good shape. We've finished games. We're able to play four quarters, and our conditioning hasn't seemed to be a problem
