Sliding Tariff Scale Movement Gains Momentum

Proposed Duty On Sugar Is Given Boost With Progress Of Chairman Smoot Of Senate Committee

WASHINGTON, July 4. (AP)—The movement for a sliding scale tariff on sugar gained momentum today on the strength of the progress made by chairman Smoot of the Senate Finance Committee in his study of the subject.

Convinced of the feasibility of what he regards as an essential preliminary step, elimination of the 30 per cent preferential reduction allowed on Cuban sugar, the Utah senator has prepared a tentative substitute for the fixed duty.

Instead of the fixed duty of 1.75 cents a pound now levied on Cuban sugar, or the 240-cent rate proposed in the house bill which the committee is considering, his plan calls for a sliding scale from one cent to 240 cents, rising as the price of sugar declines, and vice versa.

Proponents of the sliding scale idea have argued it would protect consumers as well as producers, and President Hoover has expressed himself in favor of any arrangement which would accomplish such a purpose, although he is not committed to any particular plan.

PARADE IS STAGED 20,000 Young People Are In Big Demonstration

KANSAS CITY, July 4. (AP)—An Independence day parade, in which 20,000 young people marched today, featured the program of the International Christian Endeavor convention here.

Many visiting delegations, from all states of the Union and many foreign countries, were to depict historical religious happenings. Group conferences were on the morning program.

The convention opened last night.

MARSHALL, La., July 4. (AP)—William Atterberry, Jr., 30, son of W. H. Atterberry, took a chance to save a dog's life and it cost him his own.

Atterberry, who was running a mowing machine on his father's farm two miles west of town, stopped his machine to get a dog out from in front of the sickle when the horses suddenly started, the sickle striking his leg above the ankle, injuring it so badly amputation was necessary. His death resulted.

FOURTEEN KILLED Mexican Rebels Reported Slain By Federals

MEXICO CITY, July 4. (AP)—Newspaper dispatches from Aguas Calientes today said fourteen rebels were killed in a 4-hour fight with federal troops near the town of Tepic, Jalisco, the dead including Manuel Rodriguez, rebel leader.

It was stated the rebels tried to ambush an army paymaster enroute from Aguas Calientes to the town of Tepic, but the paymaster's escort held off the two hundred rebels until reinforcements arrived.

Explosion Shakes Residential Area

SHREVEPORT, La., July 4. (AP)—A gas explosion in a residential street, which shook houses within a radius of a quarter of a mile, resulted when two unidentified boys celebrating the Fourth tossed a lighted firecracker into a manhole.

No one was injured but the blast was of such proportions the manhole cover was blown 200 feet, and a hole 20 feet in diameter was torn in the ground. Gases accumulated in the hole were ignited by the cracker.

First Attacks On Ministry Is From The Party Itself

Speech of Premier MacDonald Is Received Favorably By Both Conservative and Liberal Camps

LONDON, July 4. (AP)—The first real attack on the labor ministry of Premier MacDonald has developed not from conservative and liberal camps but from the left wing of the party itself.

So much in line with traditional British governmental programs was the Premier's speech from the throne Tuesday it has received fairly general approbation from leaders of both opposition parties. Winston Churchill, speaking apparently for his conservative chief, Stanley Baldwin, yesterday even indicated the laborites would be free to follow its policies until the spring of 1930.

Schemes Presented

This was so also with schemes presented in parliament for relief of unemployment by J. H. Thomas, Lord Privy Seal, and Minister in charge of that perennial problem. Opposition papers today patted the unemployment Minister's back for his ideas, although not without admulatory warnings.

The extreme socialists, however, the left wing of Mr. MacDonald's party are badly disappointed. Its spokesmen have not concealed their feelings and are now asking, "how about the socialism preached before the elections?" Mr. Thomas, they say, instead of industrial nationalization projects, merely has adopted the ideas of his conservative predecessors.

Their demand is for a policy insuring either work or full maintenance for everybody. Their claim is "that ideas affording employment to a system of increased public works will be insufficient and abortive."

Free Publicity Is Attacked In Talk

ASHEVILLE, N. C., July 4. (AP)—Free publicity that has "no earmarks of legitimate news" was criticized by John A. Park, Raleigh, N. C., publisher and chairman of the Southern Newspaper Publishers' Association Board, in his report to the Annual Convention here today.

"Can we reasonably extend our efforts to develop new readers and create new buying power for legitimate information secretaries," as persons the door for the gate crashers?" he asked after describing "press agents," "public relations men," or "information secretaries" as persons "who get easy pickings" at the expense of the newspapers.

TEMPLE, WACO WIN Drum Corps Compete At Lampasas On Thursday

LAMPASAS, July 4. (AP)—Temple and Waco bugle and drum corps won contests in their divisions at a Fourth of July celebration here today. For corps of less than one year a training Temple was first and Taylor second; Waco was first for corps of more than one year.

NEW YORK, July 4. (AP)—Hubert J. Fugazy, boxing promoter, faced further questioning today in connection with the slaying of Frank Marlow, night club owner.

Fugazy already has told police commissioner Whelan he saw Marlow answer a telephone call in the West 52nd street restaurant where he dined less than an hour before he was shot to death in Flushing, Queens, June 24.

Whelan said he had been told Fugazy was warned not to enter the restaurant that night "because there might be a shooting there." The police commissioner said he wished to question Fugazy about the warning. The boxing promoter has denied receiving any such warning.

Detectives were sent out to bring in two unnamed suspects.

MAY BE ENGAGED

Love Affair Of Princess Ileana Is Rumored

BUCHAREST, Roumania, July 4. (AP)—There were reports in court circles today that Princess Ileana was about to become engaged to a German Prince whose name has not yet been disclosed. It was said Queen Marie, now at the Acoacouement of her daughter, the Queen of Yugoslavia, shortly will go to Salzburg for a few days where the young people will meet.

NEW YORK—The cage of Uncle Sam, an American eagle in Central Park, was decorated with flags today. The bird was captured near Palm Beach in April and presented to Mayor Walker. The flight that ended in a forced landing in Florida has astonished naturalists.

To Start Canada Flight Saturday

BROWNSVILLE, July 4. (AP)—Barney Zimmerman, 30-year-old Marshall, Mo., aviator, announced today he would start at 2 o'clock Saturday morning on an attempted non-stop flight from Brownsville to Winnipeg, Canada.

The flier, holder of altitude records for light planes, was checking the little low-wing monoplane against its 60-horsepower motor in preparation for the effort. The machine performed "beautifully" on the flight here from Missouri, Zimmerman said.

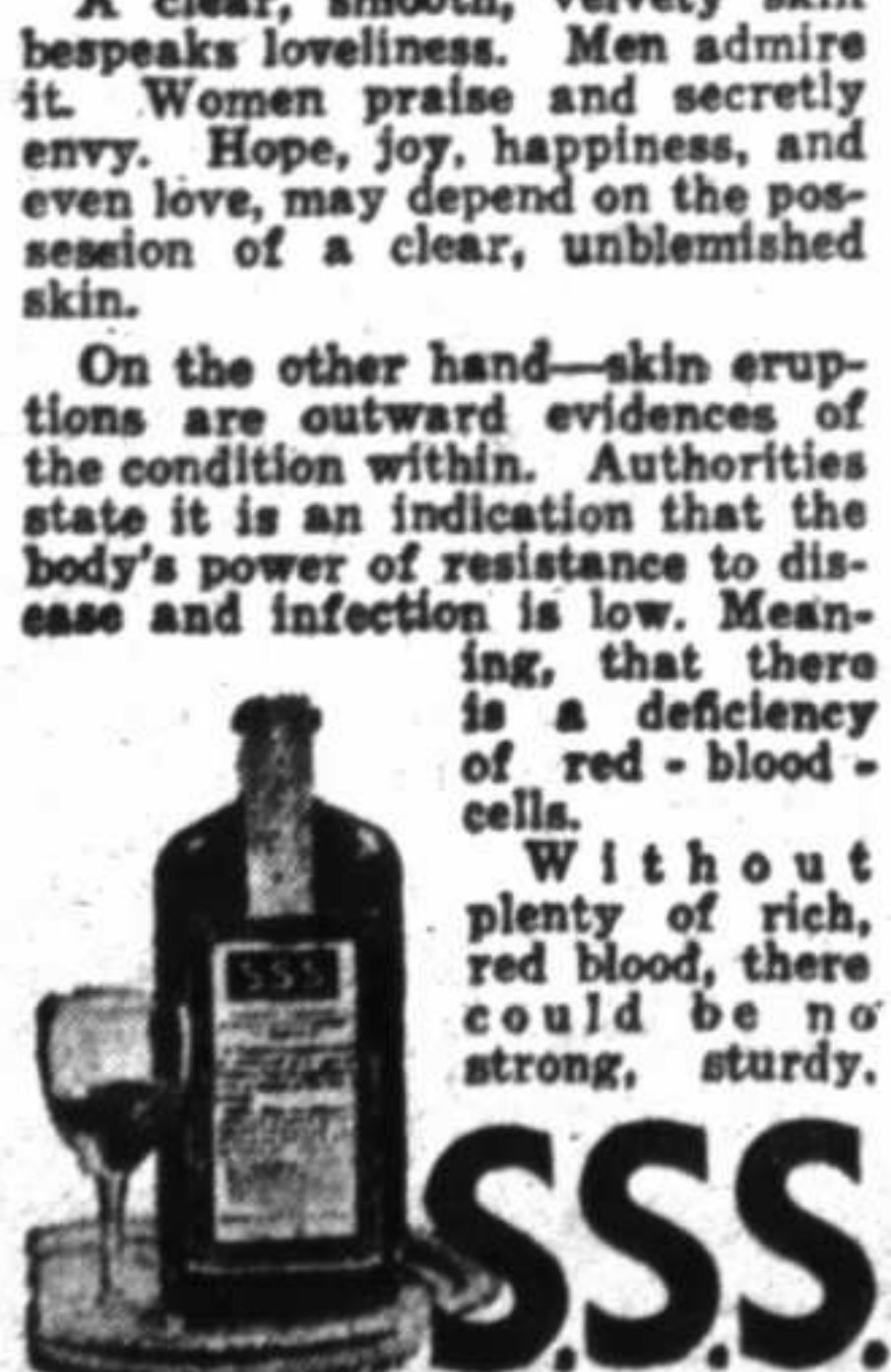
