Crane played the first game against Wink at five o'clock in the morning. This was a very close and exciting game with the score coming out 2 to 1 1-2 in Crane's favor.

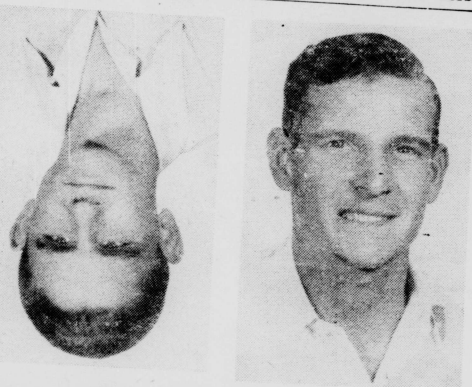

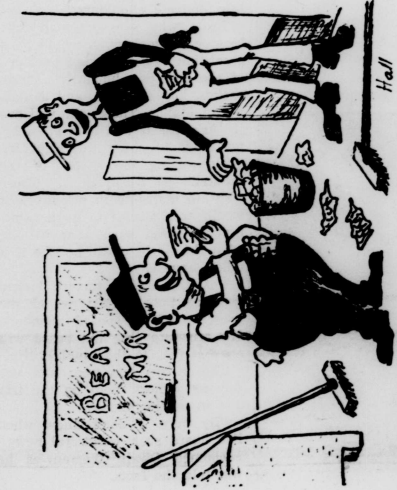

Also, any student with a 90 or above average in all subjects will be excused from classes to work at the snack bar and will be paid a reasonable salary.



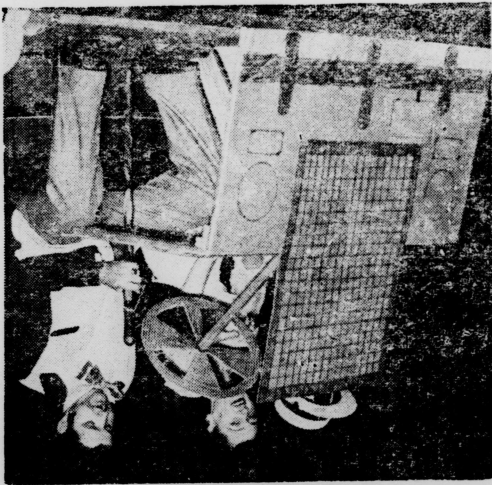
