Burial followed in Wheeler Cemetery, Wheeler, TX.

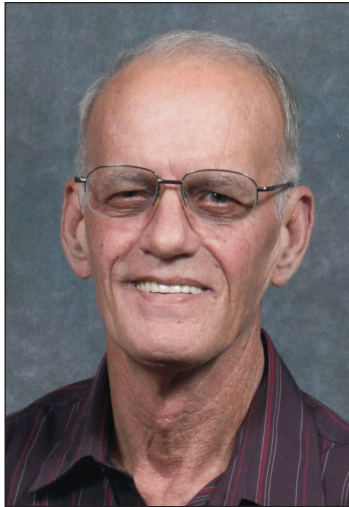
Visitation was from 4:00-6:00 PM Thursday, February 14, 2019 at the funeral home.

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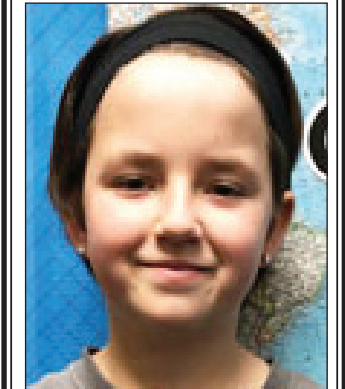

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February Sales Tax Revenue

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar today said state sales tax revenue totaled \$2.796 billion in February, 7 percent more than in February 2018. "Growth in sales tax revenue was led by remittances from the construction, manufacturing and services sectors," Hegar said. "Receipts from information services and restaurants also grew significantly. Receipts from oil- and gas-mining firms remained about the same as a year ago." Total sales tax revenue for the three months ending in February 2019 was up 5.9 percent compared to the same period a year ago. Sales tax is the largest source of state funding for the state budget, accounting for 57 percent of all tax collections.

In February 2019, Texas collected the following revenue from other major taxes:

Senate Bill Three, Teacher Pay Raise

Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick: Statement on the Unanimous Passage of Senate Bill 3

School Finance Reform Starts with Increasing Teacher Pay

Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick issued this statement today following the passage of Senate Bill 3 — the across-the-board pay raise for teachers:

"I congratulate Sen. Jane Nelson, R-Flower Mound, and the Texas Senate for unanimously passing this critical legislation to provide a \$5,000 across-the-board pay raise for Texas teachers. Our productive economy has given us a once-in-a-generation opportunity to accomplish school finance reform and the nearly \$4 billion investment to increase teacher pay across-the-board is the first step in accomplishing that goal. Senate Bill 3, along with Senate Bill 4, school finance reform and Senate Bill 12, the Retired Teachers' Security Act, will help us recruit and retain the best teachers in our public schools, which is key to improving student outcomes. "During my years on the Senate Education Committee, including as chairman in the 2013 session, before I became lieutenant governor, I reviewed a great deal of research on how to improve student outcomes in public schools. All the data points to the same thing — aside from a parent, nothing has more impact on the future success of a child than a teacher. I am very proud that Senate Bill 3 is the first bill the Texas Senate has passed this legislative session."

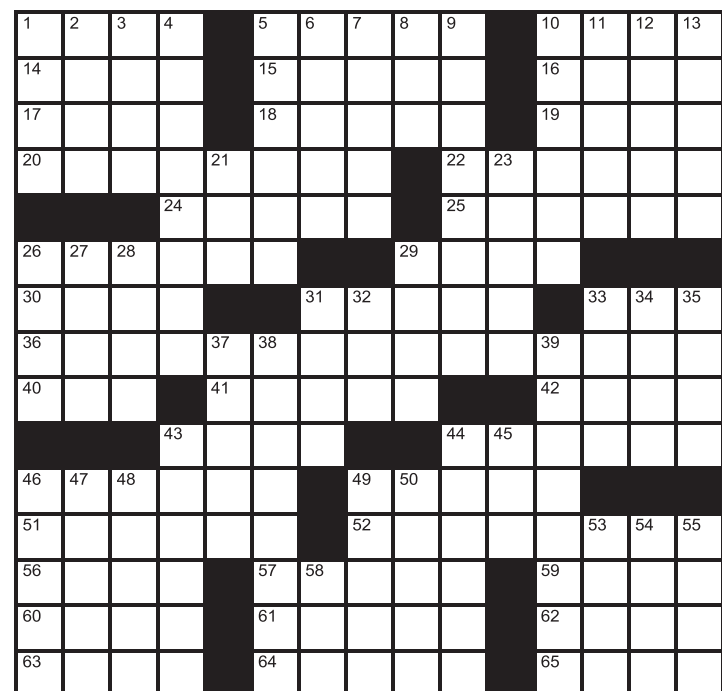

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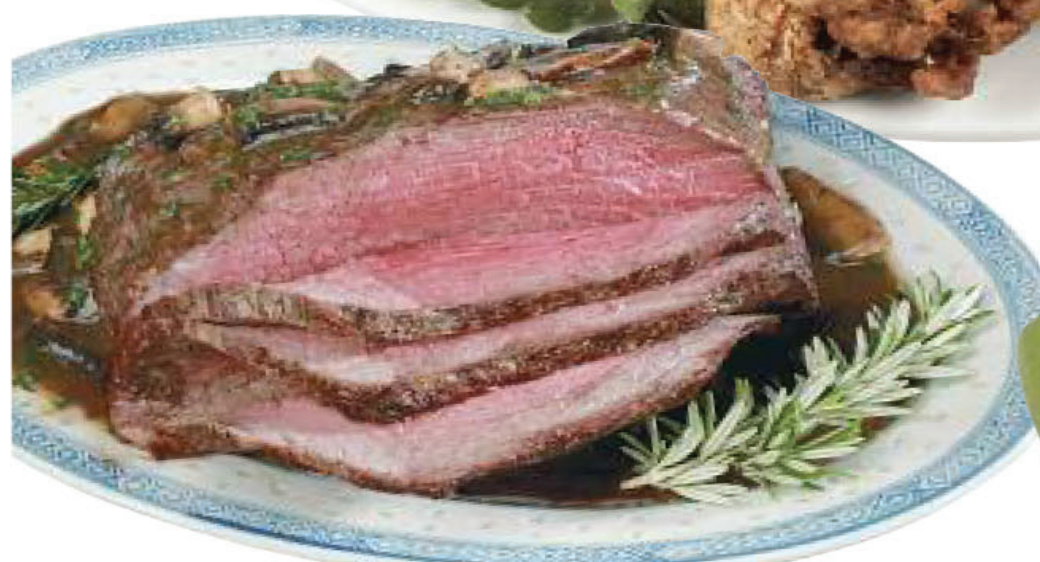

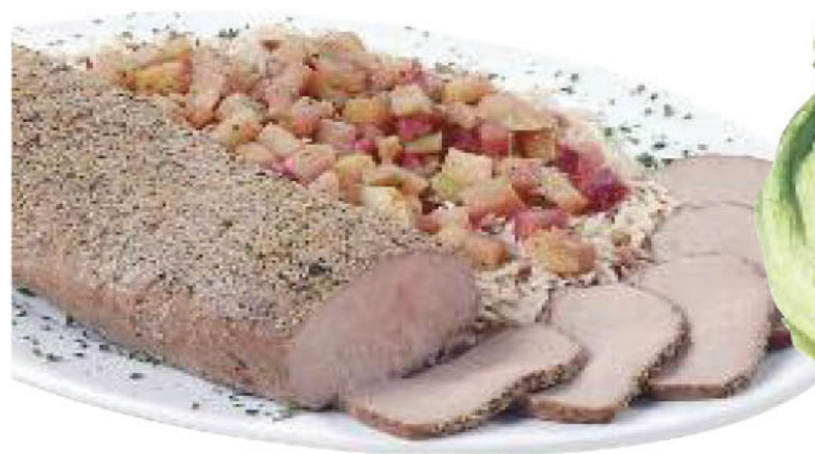
