## School Term Opens Sept. 3

Abernathy schools will open the 1963-1964 term Tuesday morning, Sept. 3. Buses will run the regular schedule and routes, and lunch will be served in the cafeteria that day.

High school students will assemble in the auditorium that morning at 8:45.

The local school will begin the term with a new superintendent and a new high school principal.

The superintendent is Robert Delwin Webb, who follows Noel Johnson in that post. Mr. Webb came here from Brownfield, where he had been with the school system since 1950. He had served as assistant superintendent and curriculum director since 1955.

New in his position, but not in the local system, Curtis Davenport is the high school principal. He succeeds Ralph Stevenson, who resigned to take a similar position at Muleshoe. Davenport had been head football coach here since 1959. That post was filled by Richard Eddleman, who had been assistant football coach here.

**Elementary School**  
Jerry Moorhead, principal of Abernathy Elementary School, issued a reminder to parents of

children entering school for the first time this year. "All students enrolling in the first grade must have a smallpox vaccination, and a birth certificate," he stated.

Mr. Moorhead gave the following information for elementary school students when they enroll on opening day of the new term, Tuesday, Sept. 3.

First grade students (Anglo) will meet in the all-purpose room, west end of the elementary school building; 1st grade (Latin) meet in Room 24; 2nd grade, Rooms 15 and 16; 3rd grade, Rooms 10 and 11; 4th grade, Room 8; 5th grade, Room 3.

**Junior High School**  
Registration for Junior High students will be held September 3, 1963. All students should report to the east entrance of Junior High School at 8:45 where they will be given homeroom assignments. Upon receiving these homeroom assignments, students should go immediately to their homerooms where they will be given class schedules and instructions to follow throughout the day. All students should bring pencil and paper since there will be a full day of school. After books have been issued and covered in each class, the remainder of the period will be devoted to regular classroom work. School will be dismissed at 3:45.

Auditorium doors will be opened at 8:30 and orientation will begin promptly at 8:45. Students should bring the necessary supplies to attend classes, as this will be a full school day. Student pictures for the annual will be made this day, also.

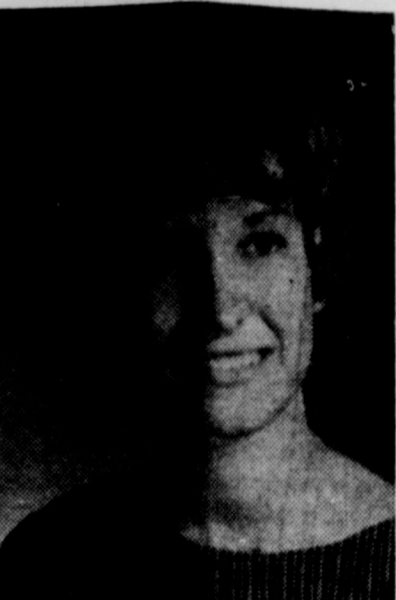

**To Arizona Band Meet**

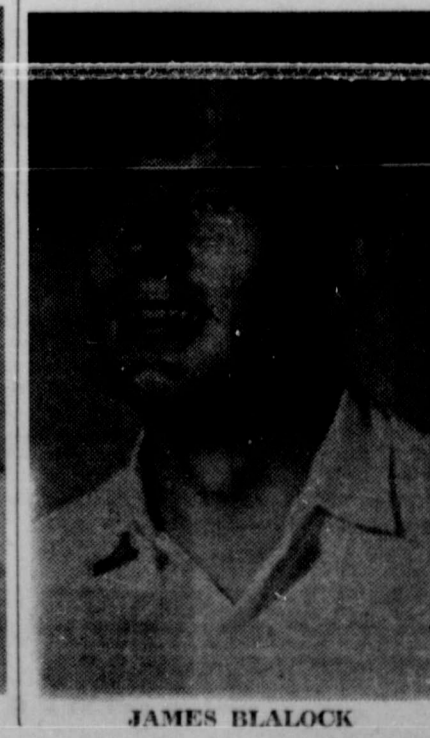
