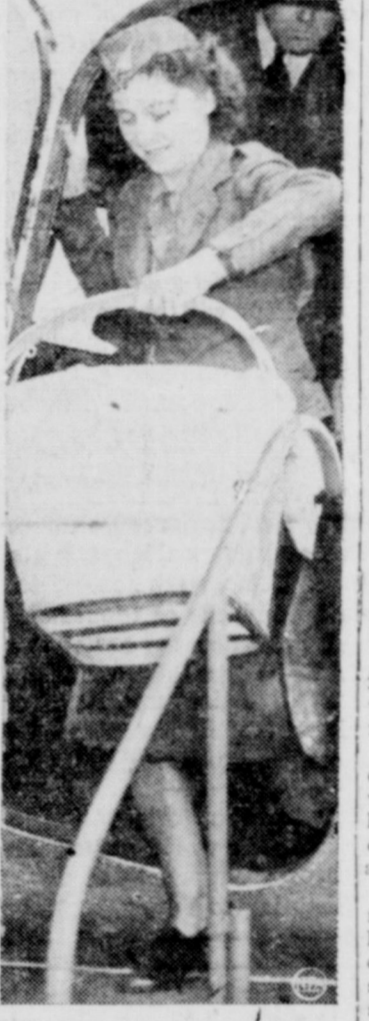

Our 'Service' Civilization

Service is the hallmark of our civilization. Everybody knows how accustomed we all are to getting service. We want our one-pound, fifty-cent purchases delivered. We want the milk on the back porch promptly at six. We want those photographs delivered and printed this afternoon—tomorrow morning at latest. We want service, not only with a capital "S" but in boldface type.

Perhaps when we back off and take a look at this, it may become the most distinctive fact of our time. Never before has so great a proportion of human energy gone into service.

The result? We all know in a vague way that this is costly, and that it has meant an increasing number of jobs in that field. But it has remained for the Twentieth Century Fund to study how far this trend has gone, and what it means.

The fund's economists have made such a study, and they have reached the rather startling conclusion that "it costs considerably more on the average to distribute goods than it does to make them."

Further, "about 59 cents out of the consumer's dollar goes to the services involved in distribution, and only 41 cents for the services in production."

The result is a constantly higher percentage of workers employed in distribution as compared with production. In 1870, about 75 per cent of all gainfully-employed workers were in farming, manufacturing or other actual productive activities. Only 25 per cent were occupied with distribution and service. By 1930 it had become 50-50.

As productivity per worker gets higher, what with more and better machinery and greater skill and specialization, it is clear that a smaller and smaller percentage of all workers will be actually producing basic goods. A larger and larger percentage of all workers will be engaged in service and distribution. And the lower costs of producing goods which follow greater mechanization and efficiency, are at least in part offset by the greater costs of distributing them.

This is not a standoff, however.

Take automobiles. When they first appeared, they cost \$3000 or \$500, and the service and gas station, the elaborate distribution and financing systems, were non-existent.

Today the industry supports hundreds of thousands in the distributive and service end, and yet a far better car is to be had for \$1000 than could be had in 1905 for \$5000.

The expansion of this distributive field and its effects is well worth the further study which the Twentieth Century Fund economists and others are preparing to give it.

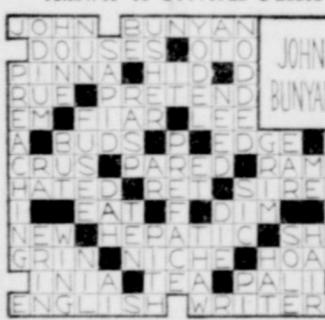

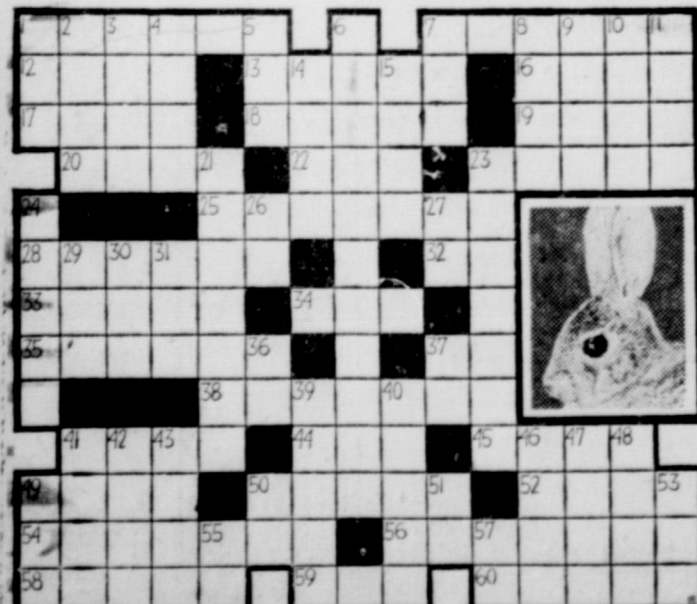

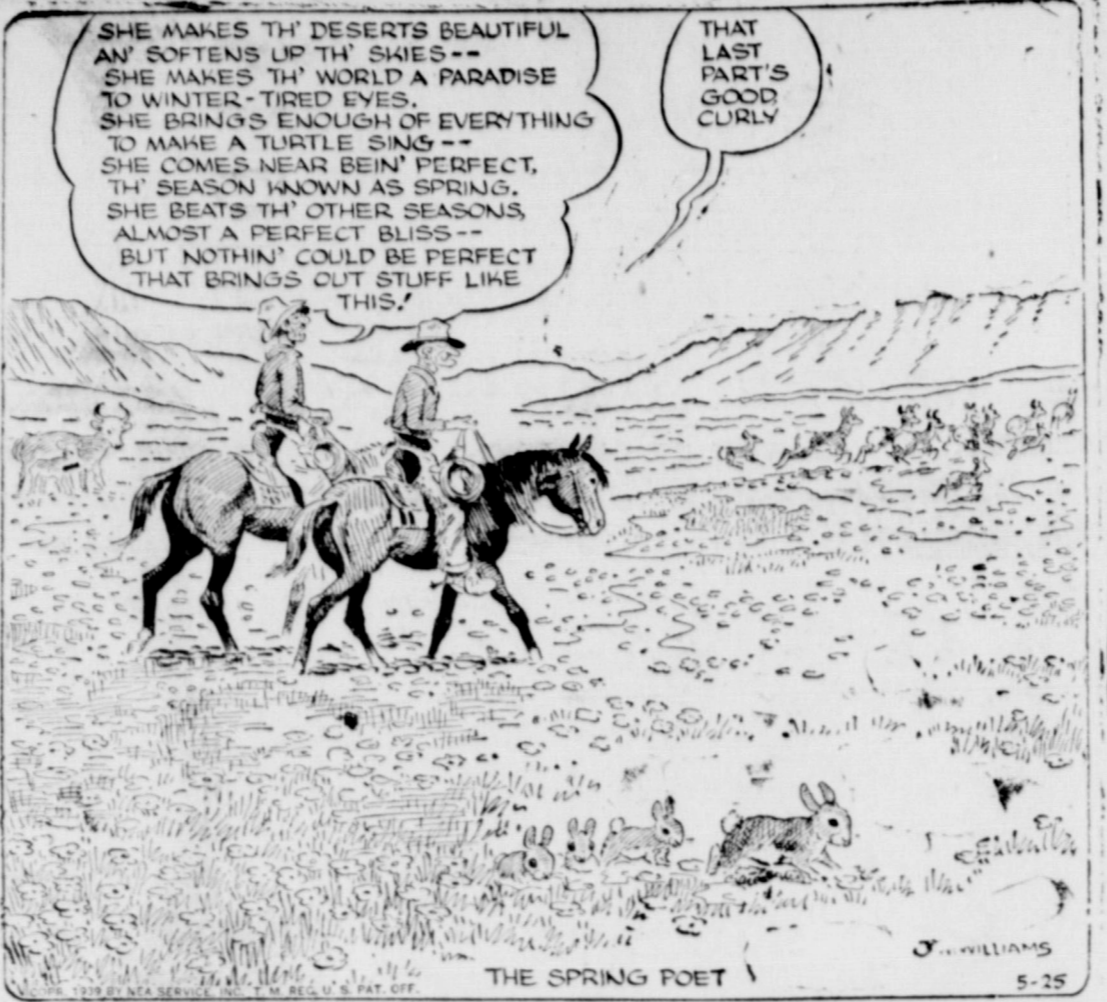

SISTER MARY'S KITCHEN

VEAL shoulder can be gentle on the budget and a can of corn will round out your food dollar. But add a note of interest to your thrift meals, then no one will know the difference.

Veal Fricassee

(Serves 4 to 6)
Two pounds neck, breast or shoulder of veal, flour, salt, pepper, 3 tablespoons fat, 1 quart water, 1 small onion, 1 tablespoon chopped parsley.

Remove meat from bones and cut in pieces. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Roll in flour. Brown in fat in skillet or heavy kettle. Add water and chopped onion and simmer for two hours or until meat is tender. If the gravy is not thick enough, add a little flour, mixed to a smooth paste with cold water. Just before serving add the chopped parsley.

Corn Fritters

(Serves 4 to 6)
One No. 2 can of corn, 2 eggs, 1-3 cup flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 3-4 teaspoon salt, 1-8 teaspoon pepper.

Mix corn and beaten eggs together. Fold in dry ingredients. Drop by spoonfuls into hot greased skillet. (Bacon or sausage fat is particularly good.) Fry until golden brown on both sides. Serve with bacon strips.

Tomorrow's Menu

BREAKFAST: Cantaloupe, green pepper omelet, warmed crisp rolls, strawberry jam, coffee, milk.

LUNCHEON: Corn fritters, chopped green salad, applesauce cake, tea, milk.

DINNER: Veal fricassee, hot biscuits, green beans, open-faced applesauce pie, whipped cream, cheese, coffee, milk.

One and one-half pounds round steak, 2 small onions, salt, pepper, paprika, flour, 1-2 cup sour cream, 1-2 cup water.

Cut the meat in pieces for serving. Season with salt, pepper and paprika and dredge with flour. Brown the meat on both sides in a small amount of fat. Add the cream and water, cover and simmer for about 2 1/2 hours or until the meat is very tender. If the liquid is not thick enough to serve as gravy, add a little flour mixed to a paste with cold water.

Harvard Calls To A Blind Student

BERKLEY, Cal.—When Jacobus tenBroek, 27, brilliant, blind law graduate of the University of California, goes to Harvard this fall on one of the much-coveted Brandeis research fellowships, he will take with him "his eyes."

These eyes are those of his wife. He has never seen a law book, except through Braille transcriptions, but has become an authority on constitutional law. He was accorded the Brandeis fellowship by invitation and not by application in a nationwide competition.

The 1939-40 fellowship at Harvard carries with it a stipend of \$2,300 in addition to tuition and it will advance the young Berkeley family one step toward the goal set by the husband.

TenBroek was blinded at the age of 7 when an arrow shot by a playmate penetrated his eye. The accident did not deter him from a scholastic and legal career in which he has won high honors. Two years ago he married Ha-

zel Feldhelm of Oakland, a former student of the University of California and who became "his eyes."

The latest honor which the blind scholar attained was the publication in the California Law Review of a series of articles on Constitutional law. In his younger days, tenBroek had been student editor of this publication.

He was graduated from the University of California in 1934 with highest honors in political science. He received a Master's degree the next year and his Jurisprudence degree the following year.

For the past two years he has been a teaching assistant in the department of political science at the university. During his educational career, tenBroek won membership in Phi Beta Kappa; Delta Sigma Rho, debating honor society; Phi Sigma Alpha, political science honor society; Order of the Coif, legal honor body, and the Golden Bear and Winged Helmet honor societies.

Eleven Cooperate In Demonstration On Soil Building

Eleven farmers and ranchers of Eastland county who are cooperating with County Agent Cook in demonstrating re-building of soils have received more than twenty tons of superphosphate fertilizer to use on their demonstrations.

Fertilizer used on the pasture land demonstrations will be used on land that has been terraced or contour furrowed to hold the rainfall. Where there is not a good turf of native grasses, grass and legume seed will be sown on the land when it is fertilized.

It has been pointed out to the crop land demonstrators by the County Agent that when legumes are fertilized with phosphate fertilizer, and the resulting growth is turned under green, three very essential things have been done to the soil: the legume makes a greater growth as a result of the fertilizer, thus insuring a greater amount of humus being added to the soil when turned under.

These soil building demonstrations are being observed with much interest by many Eastland County landowners who are concerned with re-building their soils.

Farmers and ranchers of Eastland county who are having or who anticipate having trouble with grasshoppers are requested to report to Elmo V. Cook, County Agent, who is making a survey to determine the needs of poison materials for grasshopper control in the county this year.

A county committee for grasshopper control which was recently set up by the County Commissioners' Court is composed of W. L. (Roy) Pippen, Chairman, K. E. Mittson, C. C. McFadden, W. R. Laird, and Ray Norris.

Arrangements are being made to have all materials for mixing the grasshopper poison at the station so that farmers or ranchers who wish to poison can call at the station and request an allotment bringing empty sacks, help mix the poison, carry the mixed bait away with them.

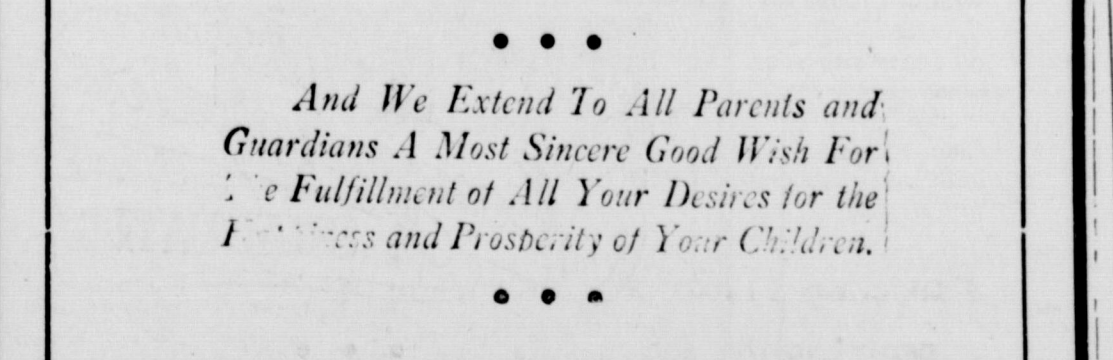

Expansion Of Oil Industry Benefits Economic Progress

DALLAS, Tex.—Statewide expansion of the Texas petroleum industry during the past eight years is shown to have had a marked beneficial effect upon the States' economic progress and welfare, according to a survey recently completed by the Texas Mid-Continent Oil and Gas Association.

Fifty-eight per cent of all the oil produced in Texas to date was produced within the past eight years. During this eight-year period Texas experienced phenomenal increases in population of many of its cities, accompanied by increased employment and payrolls, paved highway mileage, new buildings, bank deposits, export tonnage, automobile registrations, State gasoline tax collections, tele-

phones, electric light meters, taxable values and State and local tax revenue.

Facts developed by the survey show that during this eight-year period the Texas Petroleum industry drilled 81,000 wells all over the State, at a cost of \$1,600,000,000. Additional millions of dollars of new capital was brought into the State during this period and expended in acquiring oil leases, building pipe lines, oil refineries, natural gasoline plants, shipping terminals and other facilities necessary to the production, processing and distribution of Texas crude and its many refined products.

Last year Texas produced about 475 million barrels of oil, which is shown to represent an increase over 1930 of 74 per cent. At the same time, home processing of Texas crude oil by refineries showed a gain over 1930
