CITY COUNCIL MEETS IN REGULAR SESSION AND TWO SPECIAL SESSIONS

CITY DUMP CLOSED UNTIL AUGUST 15th

The July meeting of City Council was held Monday, July 22 in the City Office. Bynum Smith, Superintendent of Schools, met with the council to get help in maintaining First Street and the parking area behind the school. The area is to be used by the buses. The city agreed to provide grader service when needed. The council voted to hire two people to read meters 2-3 days a month. This would free city employees to continue with maintenance work.

The Council passed a resolution that rental property not connected to city water will be the responsibility of property owner for sewer and sanitation charges.

An ordinance was passed increasing sewer charges. In an effort to balance maintenance cost and income, the rates for sewer will be increased as follows: Residences and Commercial from \$2.00 to \$2.50; Service Stations from \$3.50 to \$5.00; Courthouse from \$4.50 to \$6.00; Motels and Trailer Parks will be charged \$2.50 for each 4 units; the new rates will go into effect on the July billings.

Rick Markham and Raymond Martin met with the council. The young men are working toward their Eagle Scout Award.

SPECIAL MEETING
The city council met in special session Friday, July 26.

The meeting opened with the discussion of commercial dog kennels in the city limits. An ordinance prohibiting commercial dog kennels in the City of Wheeler was passed. Notice is to be served that existing kennel is to be moved within 15 days. Sheldon and Harry Ellis with Customized Service Co., Inc. of Amarillo met with the council to discuss the dump ground situation. A letter was received from the State Health department concerning the condition of the City Dump. (A copy of the letter appears in this edition of the "Times").

The dump will be cleaned up to meet state requirements. A fence will be erected and the gate is to be locked. The dump is leased and maintained by Customized Service, Inc. (The dump was locked Monday, July 29, and will remain closed until August 15. Anyone caught dumping trash outside the fence will be prosecuted.)

SPECIAL MEETING
A special meeting of the council was held Monday, July 29.

The council passed a resolution for the City to join the Chamber of Commerce in giving a welcoming Coffee for new staff members at the school on Tues. August 13, at 8:00 P.M. at the school cafeteria.

The Council resolved to contact the State Highway Commission to prevent the phasing out of the state highway barn in Wheeler. Realizing the need for stricter law enforcement in Wheeler, the Council has hired Keith Miller to run the police department. Miller is presently employed by the Amarillo Police Department and has been in this line of work since 1969. Miller will be employed by the city beginning August 15.

Miller and his wife, Mary met with the council at the special meeting.

The bride chose for the wedding trip a blue steel length dress and a corsage of a white lily which was lifted from the bouquet.

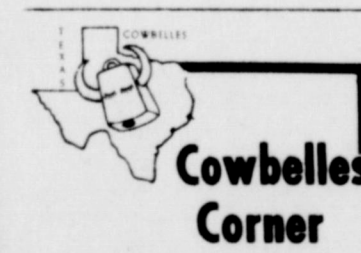
The couple are both graduates of Briscoe High School of 1974 and are making their home in Mobeetie, where he is employed by his father.

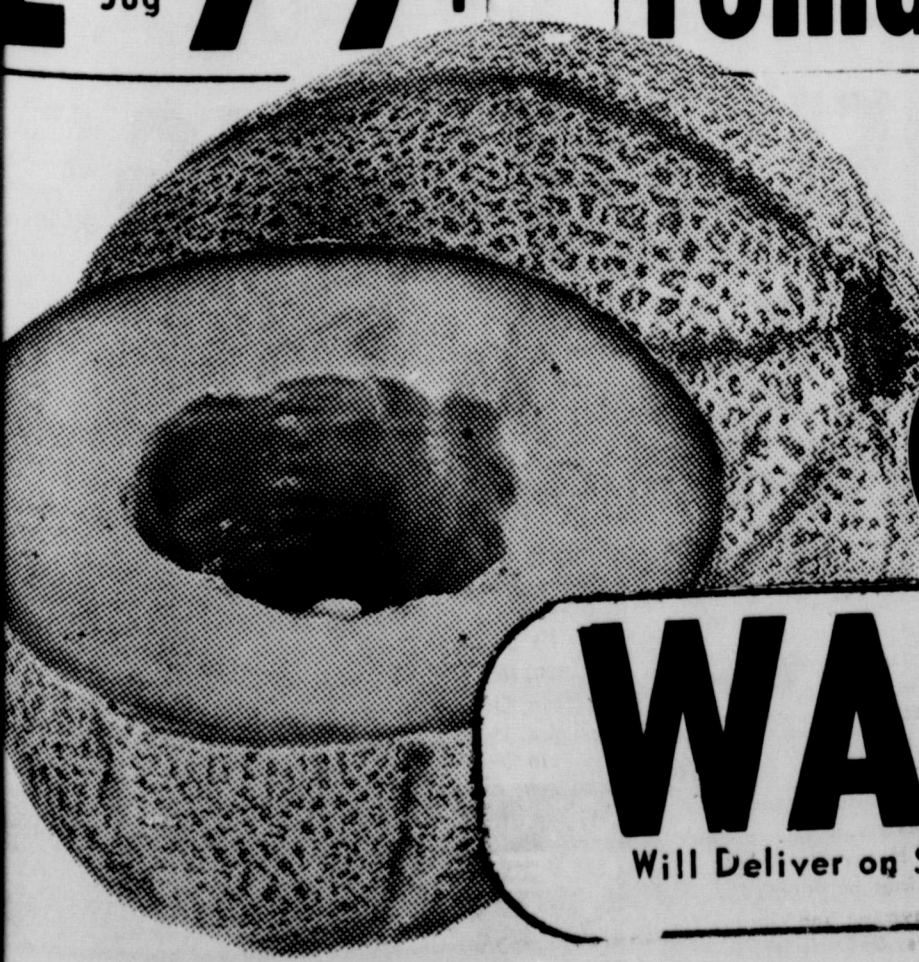
