Totals; Killed, 260,000, injured, 412,000; homeless, 9,200,000.

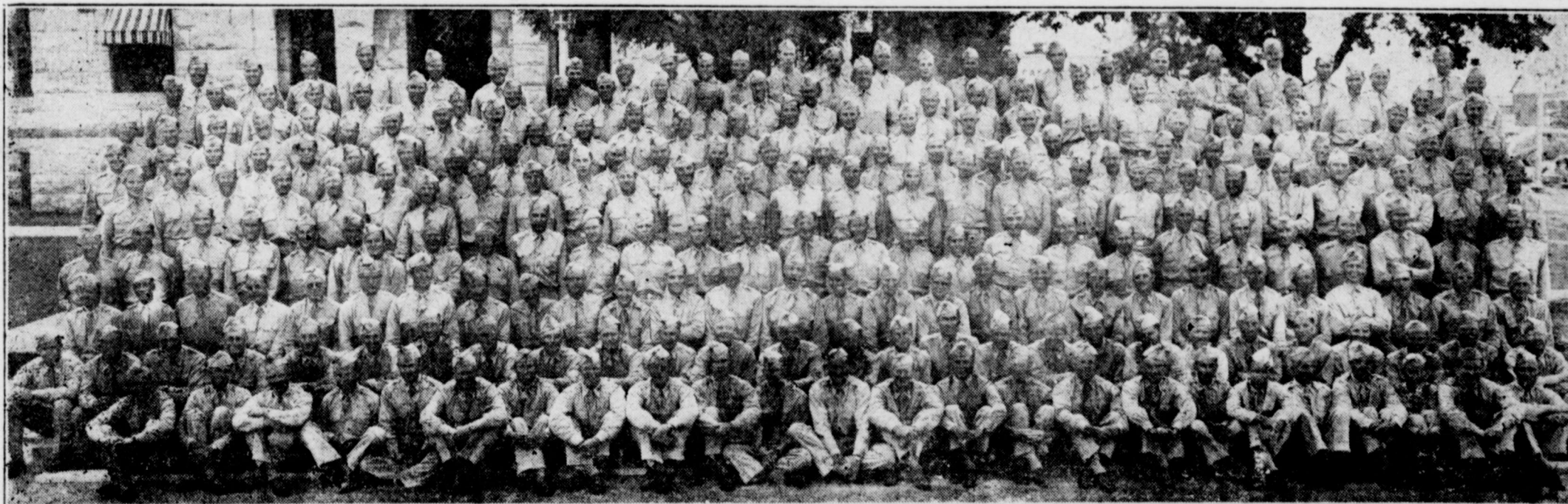

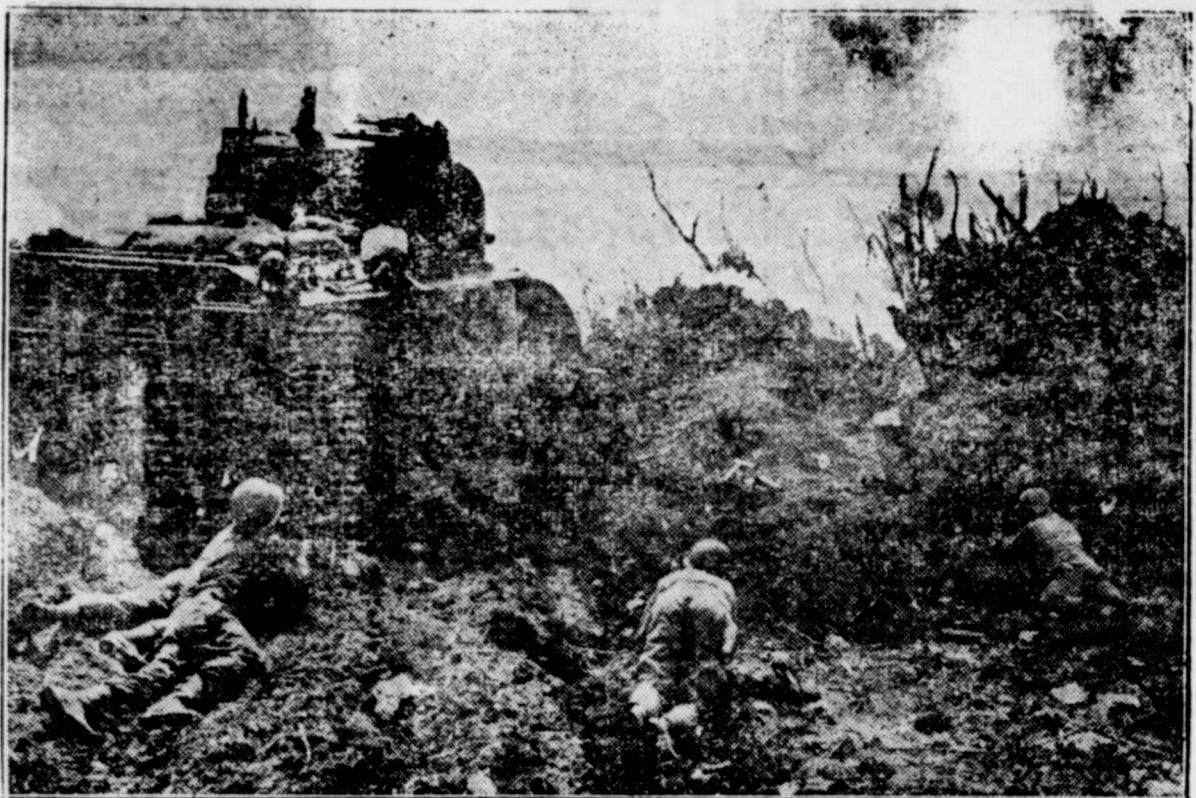

TANK-MOUNTED FLAMETHROWER IN ACTION ON OKINAWA—This spectacular U. S. Signal Corps photo shows American infantrymen in position to attack a Jap fortified bunker. Using jellied gasoline, the flamethrowing tank spread searing fire over and inside the fortification at a safe distance. A CWS flamethrower replaces the 75-mm. cannon on the tank and hurls gallons of the fuel at least 100 yards. It burns at a temperature of 2,000 degrees Fahrenheit. CWS also furnished a periscope flamethrower for tank use.

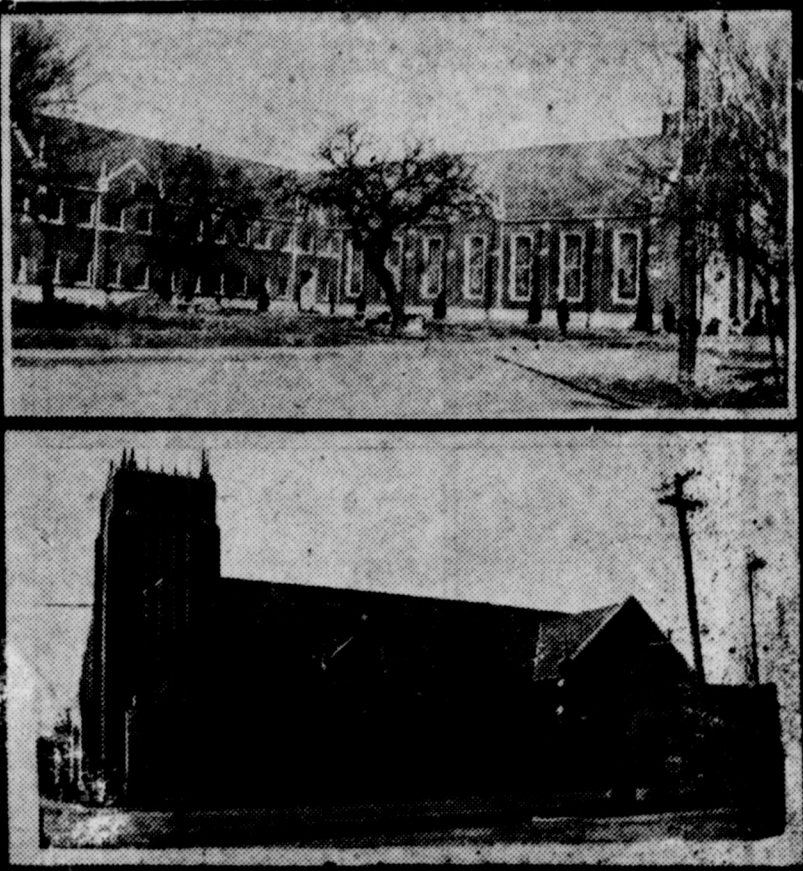

5 Good Country Tricks for Saving More Used Fats

THIS year our domestic supply of fats and oils will be approximately one and one-half billion pounds less than last year. Right now, we are facing our worst fat shortage since the war began. To make up for this staggering loss, the government is depending on the women of America—and particularly women on farms and in smaller cities.

Every spoonful, every drop of fat is needed to help make battlefield and homefront essentials. So roll up your sleeves and do an all-out job, won't you? Clip this checklist and pin it up in your kitchen as a reminder.



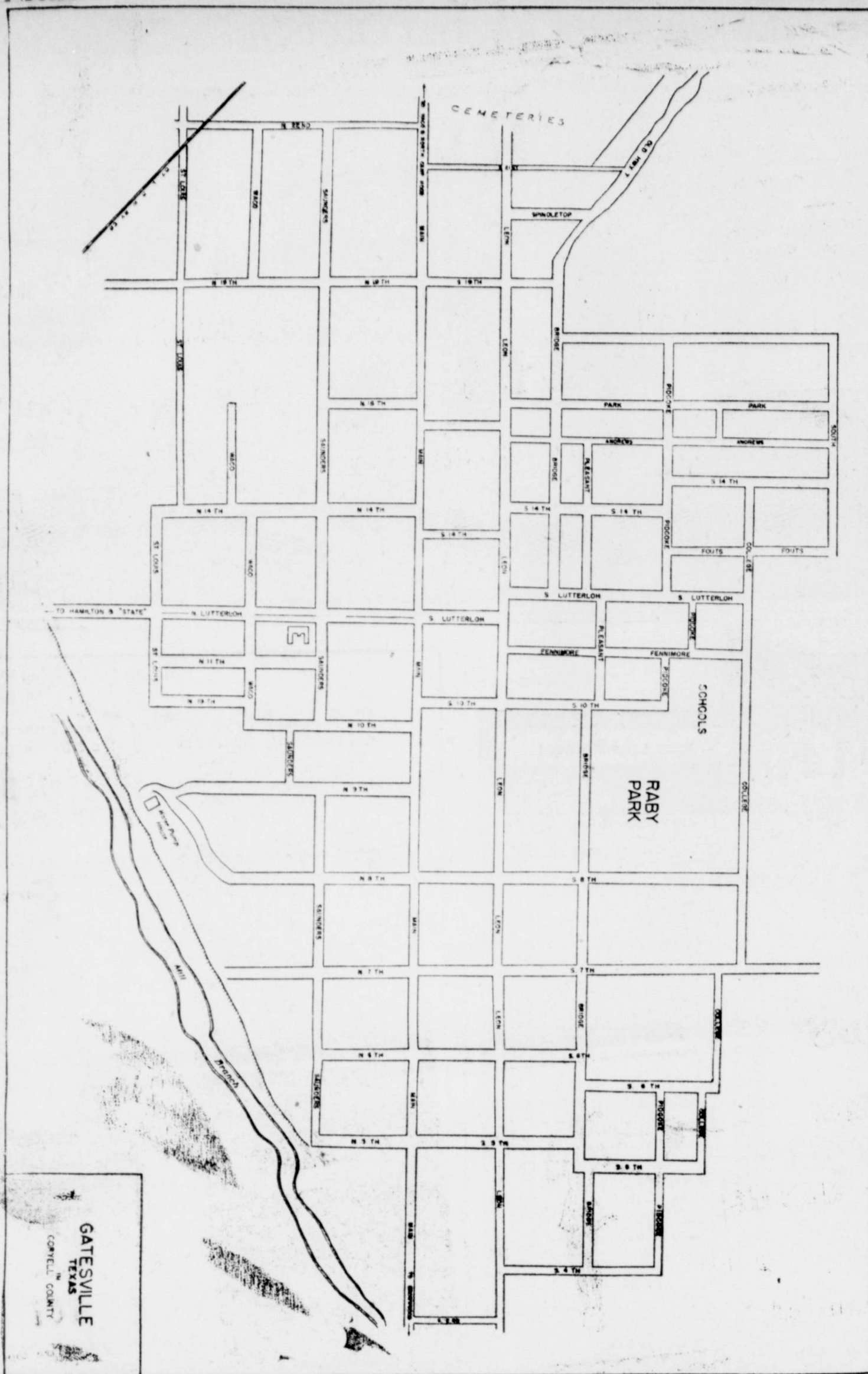
1. **FRIED SALT PORK**—with milk gravy. Salt pork yields so much grease, you won't need it all for gravy. Pour the rest into the salvage can.
2. **DEEP FAT FRYING**—use the fat over and over, but when it's too dark and smelly to use any more, don't forget Uncle Sam wants it!
3. **ROASTS AND CHOPS**—save all trimmings (scraps from plates, too.) Keep them in a small bowl; once a week melt them down.
4. **SAUSAGES**—they're better if you parboil them first. Skim the fat off the cooking water—scrape the fat from the frying pan.
5. **CHICKEN SOUP**—chill it before you use it. Scoop off the hardened grease (soup tastes better, too!)

When the salvage can is full, take it to your butcher promptly. He will give you 2 red points and up to 4c for every pound of used fat you turn in.

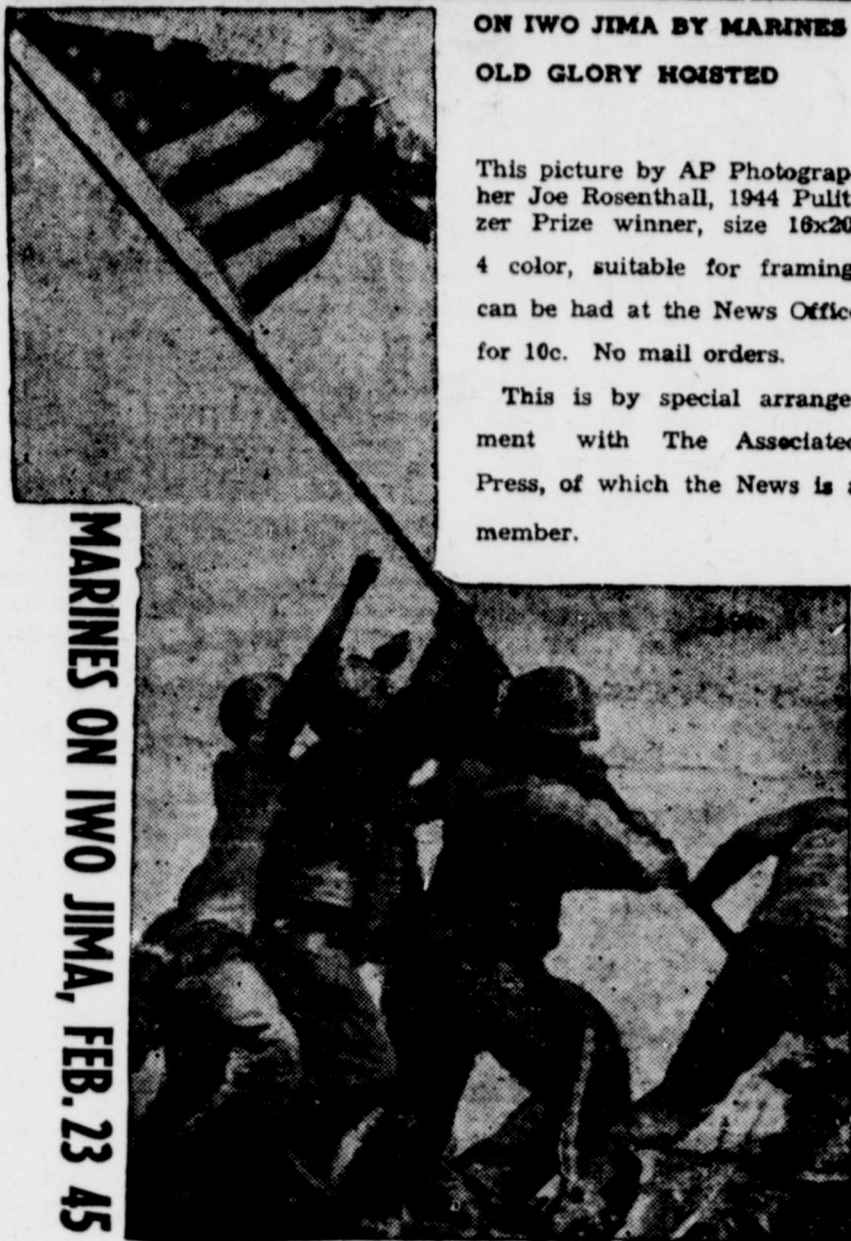

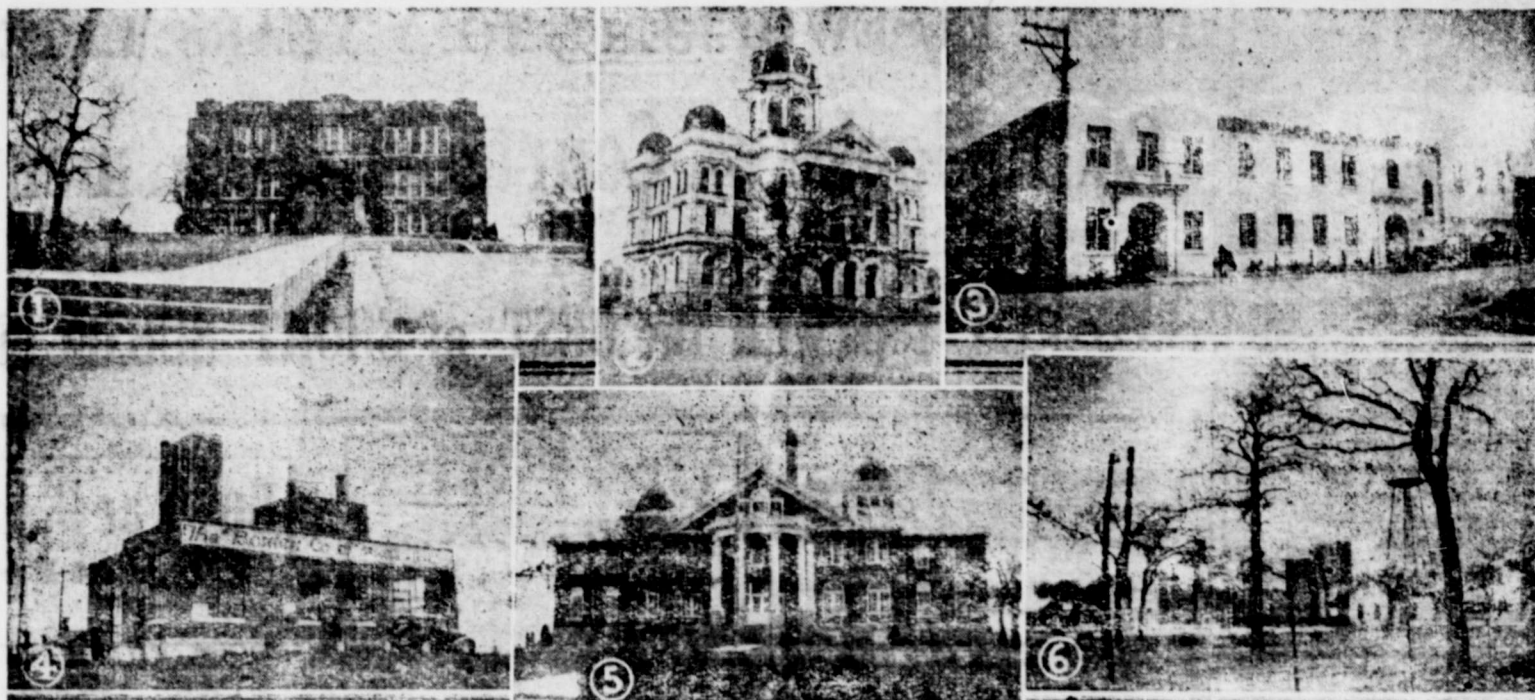

SUGAR — Book four stamp 36 good for five pounds through Aug. 31. Next stamp valid Sept. 1.

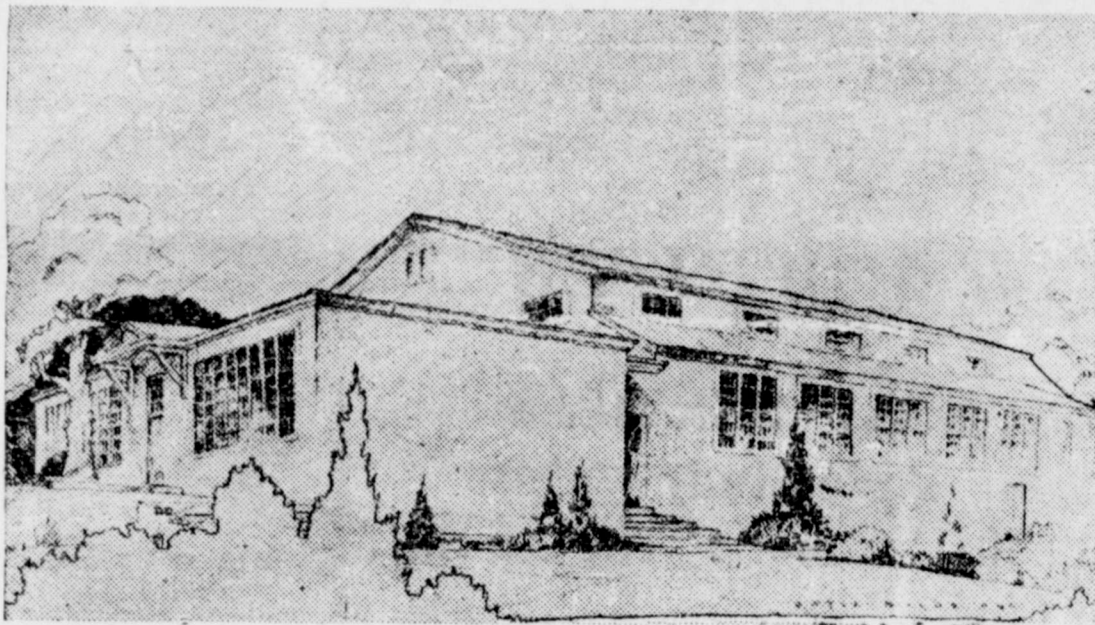

Your electric refrigerator may have enough years of faithful service behind it to rate a "discharge," but it will have to stay on the job until replacements are available an indefinite number of months from now. Initial production of new refrigerators is reserved for hospitals, blood banks, the Army, Navy and other high priority users, so continued good care of your present refrigerator is a "must" for some time to come.

FOLLOW THESE TIPS ON REFRIGERATOR CARE:

- Defrost whenever frost on freezing unit reaches thickness of 1/4-inch. Excessive frost retards cold-making.
- Do not store hot foods. Let them cool first.
- Keep liquids in covered containers. Moisture drawn to freezer speeds formation of frost.
- Do not maintain food compartment temperature below 40 degrees. Use fast freezing sparingly.
- Do not crowd shelves. Allow room for cold to circulate.
- Do not open door oftener than necessary and always close it quickly.
- Keep unit compartment clean; condenser coils dust-free.
- Place refrigerator so that air can circulate freely under, behind and above it.
- Oil open unit models periodically per manufacturer's directions. Sealed units need no oiling.
- Have your refrigerator checked by a competent servicemen at the first hint of trouble.
