Triggs Receives SMU Distinguished Alumni Award

Charles H. and Mary Katharine Hughes Trigg are among seven recipients of Southern Methodist University's 1994 Distinguished Alumni Awards, presented annually by the SMU Alumni Association.

Charles (Charlie) Trigg met Katharine (Kitty) Hughes at a bonfire and pep rally at SMU in 1927. Since that time, the Triggs, who married in 1933, have worked tirelessly behind the scenes to promote and support their alma mater. Their greatest gift to SMU is the \$10 million Hughes-Trigg Student Center, built near the site where they met.

Charles studied pre-law and graduated from SMU with a bachelor's degree in 1929. After he and Katharine married, he became football coach at Highland Park High School. He returned to SMU in 1935 as assistant football coach to Matty Bell, who led the Mustangs to the national championship and the 1936 Rose Bowl.

Katharine was a member of Delta Gamma, Alpha Zeta Pi, Mu Phi Epsilon, Mortar Board, Decima, and Panhellenic. She graduated in 1931 with a Bachelor of Music degree. She returned to work at SMU as an

assistant to the dean of women and later the assistant to the registrar while Charles served in the Navy during World War II.

In 1947 the couple moved to Eldorado, where Charles established a car dealership. Charles' interest in football continued, and for 20 year she was an intercollegiate football official. In 1954 Charlie retired and the Triggs began managing the ranch and oil interests left to them by Katharine's parents. The couple remain strong supporters of SMU athletics through the Diamond M Club and the Mustang Club.

The other SMU award recipients are geological scientist Richard A. Arnett of Dallas, interior designer Allison Allen Holland of Honolulu, U.S. Congressman Sam Johnson of Plano, Dallas lawyer John Lopez III, and Houston Judge Ewing Werlein Jr.

The recipients will be honored at an awards banquet at 6:30 p.m. March 12th, in the Promenade Ballroom of the Hughes-Trigg Student Center. Tickets for the event are \$45. For reservations, call the Office of Alumni Relations at (214) 768-4744.

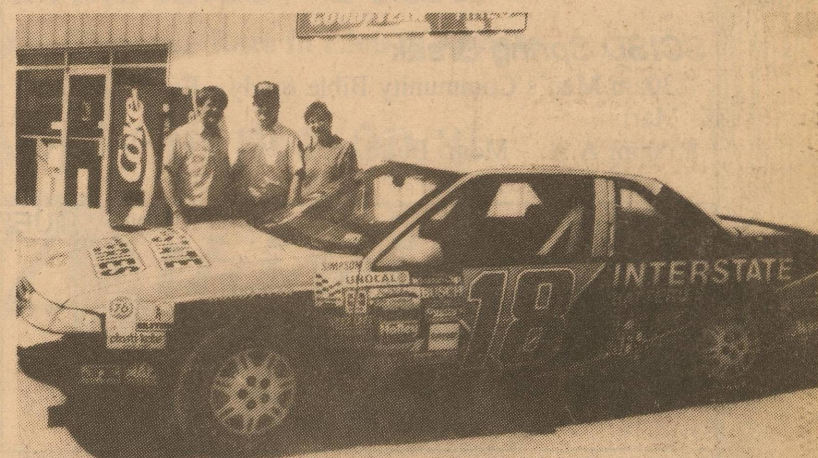
Joining our fellow Texans, we will again have a city-wide clean-up on Saturday, April 9th. Mark your calendars and make plans to do your part!

Regional Staff Ombudsman Speaks To Health Occupations Students

Stephanie Salyards, Regional Staff Ombudsman for the Concho Valley Area Agency on Aging presented a program on February 24th to the Eldorado High School Health Occupations students. Vernell McCalla, who is the ombudsman assigned to Schleicher County Medical Center Nursing Home, helped with the presentation.

An ombudsman is a specially trained individual who works with the elderly, families, health care providers, and other concerned individuals to improve quality of care and quality of life.

Ms. Salyards is responsible for 13 counties which takes in 21 long-term care facilities and covers 16,000 square miles. She is presently providing ombudsman training in several communities. In the past, people had to travel to Austin for the same training.

The Ombudsman Program does three things: 1) it provides information on long-term care facilities; 2) it investigates and resolves complaints; 3) it provides community education and nursing home education regarding long term care.

Ms. McCalla shared with the class some of her experiences as the ombudsman for Schleicher County Nursing Home.

The Concho Valley Area Agency on Aging has four additional programs/projects besides the Ombudsman Program. The agency provides transportation means for senior citizens, works with the senior citizens centers, has a Senior Companion Program for people 60 years of age and older, and the Elder Individual Program.
