5000 CATTLE ARE NOW FACING FIRING SQUAD

(By Associated Press)
HOUSTON, Oct. 8.—The slaughter of 5,000 cattle in addition to those which have already been killed in Harris county, because of the foot and mouth disease, began today. The cattle being destroyed today have been grazing within a radius of about twenty miles of the original infected area, and while they have not shown signs of developing the disease it is feared that they may be carrying the infection.

This brings the total number of cattle destroyed as a result of the disease up to about 9,000. Effort are being made by the Texas Livestock Sanitary Commission to obtain a modification of the embargoes established by fourteen states against Texas.

DROPS ELECTION CONTEST CASE

Sheriff J. P. Flynt announced this week that he would not push the election contest suit against Sheriff-elect R. E. McWilliams, filed at the last hour before the present term of district court, and that he had requested the court to dismiss the case when it was reached on the docket.

In order to get service at the present term of court the case was filed at the last moment and before all information necessary to try the case had been obtained. After giving the matter further consideration and after advising with his attorneys and friends, Mr. Flynt decided to drop the contest.

The suit was filed on the grounds of alleged irregular, or illegal voting. There were only twenty-eight votes difference between the two candidates in the sheriff's race and Sheriff Flynt expected to prove, had the case gone to trial, that more than that number of votes were cast by persons who were not qualified under the laws of Texas to participate in elections.

It was strictly a matter of speculation as for whom the illegal votes were cast, and a recount would have been necessary to determine that question, had the court held the grounds for contest valid and ordered a recount.

The case has been stricken from the docket and the matter dropped, on motion of the plaintiff.

MINE OPERATOR IS SHOT DOWN

ELKINS, West Virginia, Oct. 8.—Lee Sandridge, one of the best known coal operators in West Virginia, and a prominent leader in the Democratic party of the state, was shot near Phillips today.

Sandridge was en route to the Meridian mines to reopen operations of the mine on a non-union basis, after strike trouble. Three other men who were accompanying Sandridge were also wounded by the assassins who fired from ambush, and then made their escape. Sandridge is in a serious condition.

C. B. McKinney returned home Tuesday at noon from Pharr, where he has been during the cotton season in the Rio Grande valley. He reports that most of the cotton in the valley has been picked, gins now operating only on certain days in the week.

CROP REPORT SENDS COTTON DOWN \$7.50

(By Associated Press)
NEW ORLEANS, Oct. 8.—Cotton dropped one cent and a half a pound today within a few minutes after the government production forecast was announced. It had been expected that the forecast would show a reduction of at least 200,000 bales, and instead the forecast showed a falling off of only 97,000 bales.

WASHINGTON, October 8.—The cotton crop declined to the extent of 97,000 bales in two weeks, from September 16th to October 1st, the Department of Agricultural indicated today in its forecast.

WIDEST FREEDOM FOR AIR CONTROL FERGUSON CASE BEING RUSHED

WASHINGTON, October 8.—President Coolidge, in a talk to the delegates to the third National Radio Conference, who called at the White House today, said that government control of the air must be maintained with the widest degree of freedom.

The delegates were thanked by President Coolidge for their cooperation with the administration in developing and controlling the radio. He said that it was fresh evidence that the genius for progress has not left the American people, and that our citizens can be relied upon to conduct their own business in a way best calculated to promote public welfare.

SHENENDOAH ON WAY TO FT. WORTH

GREENVILLE, Miss., Oct. 8.—The naval dirigible Shenendoah, on its way to the Pacific coast, passed over here at 11:45 this morning.

Radio messages picked up at Ballinger at 3:00 o'clock Wednesday afternoon said that the naval dirigible Shenendoah passed over Paris, Texas, at that hour. The big Zeppelin is beating its time by many hours, as it was not due to arrive at Fort Worth until Thursday morning, and the radio report said that it would reach Fort Worth this afternoon.

GASOLINE DROPS 3 CENTS GALLON

(By Associated Press)
HOUSTON, Oct. 8.—The Gulf Production Company yesterday announced a reduction of three cents a gallon on gasoline in Texas, and similar cuts were also announced by the Humble and Texas companies. This brings the retail price of gasoline in the city of Houston down to fifteen cents.

One wholesale oil station in Ballinger received notice Tuesday announcing a reduction of three cents a gallon in gasoline, and other dealers were expecting hourly to receive notice of a similar reduction.

The three cent wholesale reduction also brings a three cent cut in the retail price of gas, and it was announced that gas would sell here for sixteen cents as soon as the new price went into effect. This is the lowest quotation on gas in Ballinger since the war.

CHARGES G.O.P. WITH RAISING A SLUSH FUND

HOBOKEN, N. J., Oct. 8.—Upon arriving here today for a campaign address, Senator LaFollette, independent candidate for president, reiterated his determination for a Senate investigation to establish whether a "slush fund" is being collected to buy the election for President Coolidge in the doubtful states.

"I intend," LaFollette said, "to follow up vigorously my demand for an investigation into a special fund which is being collected under the direction of W. T. Mellon, of Pittsburgh, a brother of Secretary of the Treasury Andrew W. Mellon; and Edward Stotesbury, of Philadelphia, a partner of J. Pierpont Morgan, for the alleged purposes of buying the election of Coolidge in the doubtful states."

WASHINGTON, Oct. 8.—C. Bascom Slem, secretary to President Coolidge, branded as "a pure fabrication" today the statement by Senator LaFollette that he, Slem, would have charge of a campaign to raise a "slush fund" for the republican party. The charge was made by LaFollette last night.

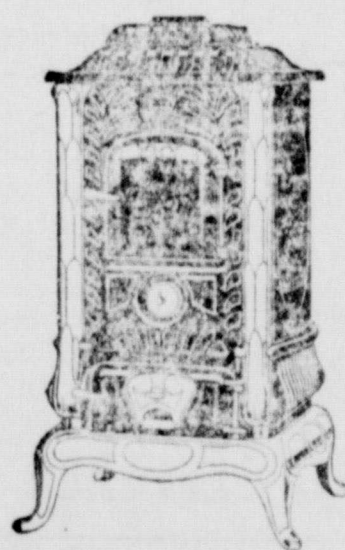

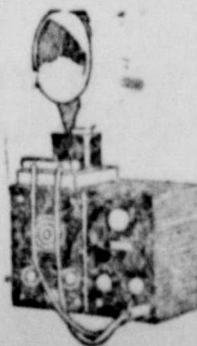
