THE Waco Reporter takes up the assertion of the Galveston News to the effect that Texas has raised more wheat than she needs and proves that the reverse is the fact, that we have raised a splendid crop but it will be 2,000,000 bushels short instead of that amount surplus.

The Jockey Club grounds the Place for the Next Fair.

After due and careful deliberation, the Fair managers have decided to hold the next fair of the "Agricultural, Industrial and Stock-raising Association for Western Texas," at the grounds formerly owned by the San Antonio Jockey Club, but now the property of the Fair Association.

In coming to this decision the managers have duly considered all the disadvantages as well as advantages, and they ask the impartial judgment of the public, particularly as a large number of our citizens want the fair to be held at the San Pedro Springs.

MUST OWN THE GROUNDS.

In order to make the annual fair a success it was necessary that the Association own their fair ground, so that they could control it, improve it and make it particularly suitable for the purpose. The fair held at San Pedro Springs were very pleasant, but the open square or main street would be no more open and free to the public than the Springs, and one of the chief sources of revenue looked to by the association to enable them to defray expenses is to be derived from the entrance fees and stall rents. Another thing, the association could not make improvements upon the ground or rather public property, such as were actually needed to enable a good display to be made.

SAN PEDRO SPRINGS.

It became necessary for the association to secure its own fair grounds or cease to exist. The San Pedro Park is one of the loveliest spots on God's footstool, a perfect gem of natural loveliness, and it is the property of all the people of San Antonio, and no person or association can close its gates and prevent any person young, old, rich, poor, black, white or yellow from entering and enjoying the shade, the clear waters, or the cool retreats. It is a public park and not the place for an agricultural fair. It should be planted out with trees, shrubs and grass plots, and paths and walks laid out to furnish a quiet, delightful retreat for the thousands of weary citizens who will seek it as a breathing spot. And it should not be turned into an arena for the display of cows, bulls, goats, sheep, pigs and poultry.

Let us cultivate the idea of having things done at the right time and in the right place.

FAIR GROUNDS SHOULD BE ATTRACTIVE.

The fair grounds should also be made attractive, but it is not always possible to secure a spot where nature has performed all the necessary work, such as bright springs, sparkling fountains, arching columns of trees, and delightful walks. A fair ground is also a place of real earnest business, where the producers of the country come in sharp competition, and the arrangements must also be made with this idea in view.

To secure a suitable fair ground our association has made all the exertion in their power.

The San Pedro Springs were out of the question, and property situated on the river could not be obtained upon terms at all reasonable. At last a proposition was made to consolidate the stock of the San Antonio Jockey Club with that of the Agricultural Association by which the Jockey Club grounds, could be secured as the property of the association. This proposition was accepted.

THE NEW FAIR GROUNDS ARE splendidly situated, about two miles from the Main Plaza, on a high piece of land South of the San Pedro Creek, and within one fourth of a mile of that stream.

The soil is deep and rich, and capable of growing trees and shrubbery and in a few years, by proper care and enterprise it can be made the loveliest fair ground in the State.

The situation is breezy and free from all miasmatic influences. The property embraces 200 acres of land.

THE RACE COURSE

is pronounced the finest in the State.

THE IMPROVEMENTS now on the grounds are ample for all purposes of the turf, such as stables, stands and Club House, and the Association intend to immediately erect ample buildings for the fair, embracing a large arena modelled after the most approved fair buildings.

WATER.

There is a large cistern on the premises, and the association expect to have water conducted in pipes to the grounds either from the San Pedro or from the ditch on Flores street.

THE WEATHER during the season of holding the fair will be cool and pleasant and every effort will be made to secure the comfort of the people.

THE ROADS

to the fair grounds will be put in excellent repair affording a delightful drive or walk, while the back and bus charges will be put down to at least 10 cents, so that visitors can reach the fair grounds as easily and cheaply as they could San Pedro Springs.

A COMPARISON

of our fair grounds with those of other places we will find very satisfactory. The State fair grounds at Houston are situated in an open flat swamp, full of mosquitoes and bullfrogs, but by the expenditure of large sums of money these grounds have been made very pleasant and attractive. The swamp has been drained, trees planted, walks laid out, buildings and sheds and arbors erected, so that the original, unsightly flat is entirely changed in appearance.

The Galveston race track and grounds, at which it is intended to hold fair, is situated on a treeless expanse, but with the well-known enterprise of the Galvestonians they are making it the finest fair grounds in the State.

At Austin the fair grounds are as open and exposed as our own without the advantage of being able to introduce running water to any portion of it, as at our fair grounds.

FINALLY the fair grounds afford ample scope for the exercise of the horticultural and artistic genius of our Fair Association, as well as their energy and enterprise. They have the opportunity of converting the property, now covered with chaparral, into the loveliest fair grounds in the State, and they will do it.

APPEAL TO OUR CITIZENS.

It now remains for our citizens, all of whom have an interest in the success of the Fair, to give it their individual support. It should be a matter of pride to make our fair a credit to our city. We are a community of merchants and consumers, we depend on the farmers and stock-raisers and industrial class for all our trade and business, and every effort should be made to make the Fair a season of delightful holidays to all the thousands of visitors, who will come from the distant frontier, as well as to the hundreds of strangers who will visit us to the judge of our resources. The association should be backed with ample means to put their grounds in good condition, and that there shall be no parsimony in any department and our city judged as a stingy and a poor spirited people.

TO THE COUNTRY PEOPLE AND SISTERS.

While San Antonio has apparently more interest than outside towns, it really has not so great an interest as our country friends and our sister Western towns. They are as much interested in the success of the Fair as we are if not more so, as it will be deemed a display of their industry and enterprise; it is for their special benefit as well as for the benefit of the section at large. The San Antonians have the burden of the expense to bear and receive some return in the presence of the visitors, but our farmers and stock raisers are particularly favored. Every farmer and stock raiser should be a

competitor and contributor to the success of the fair, the value of the prizes should not be taken into consideration, but every competitor should strive for excellence.

FINALLY

there is no enterprise that will so promote the welfare and prosperity of the country equal to our Fair. Let all opposition be dropped and every energy strained to make our next fair a grand success.
