INTERNATIONAL SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON FOR JUNE 8, 1930

General Topic: Jesus in the Shadow of the Cross. Scripture Lesson: Matt. 26:1-46.

1. Then saith Jesus unto them, All ye shall be offended in me this night: for it is written, I will smite the shepherd, and the sheep that are scattered shall be scattered abroad.

2. Then saith he unto them, My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death: abide ye here, and watch with me.

3. And he went forward a little, and fell on his face, and prayed, saying, My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass away from me: nevertheless, not as I will, but as thou wilt.

4. And he cometh unto the disciples, and findeth them sleeping, and saith unto Peter, What sleepest thou, watch with me one hour?

5. Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.

6. Again a second time he went away, and prayed, saying, My Father, if this cannot pass away, except I drink it, thy will be done.

7. And the same again found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy.

8. And he left them again, and went away, and prayed a third time, saying again the same words.

GETHSEMANE The traditional site of Gethsemane may be regarded as the actual one. It was across the brook Cedron from Jerusalem (John 18:1), on the western slope of Mount Olivet (Luke 22:39). It was a "garden" (John 18:1) and the name would accord with the opinion that that meant an olive orchard.

FLOTTING AGAINST JESUS It had become clear to the Jewish leaders, members of the Sanhedrin or Council, the senate of the Jews, that such influence as they had over the people was gone, unless they could see Jesus out of the way by killing him.

JESUS' LAST VISIT IN BETHANY Our Lord during the week before the passover spent the night in retirement outside the city, usually at Bethany, doubtless in the hospitable home of Lazarus, whom Christ had brought back from the dead, though probably also he spent much time in prayer in the garden of Gethsemane.

THE WARNING TO JUDAS, Vv. 20-25. John tells us most fully about Christ's solemn warning to Judas (John 13:27-30): After announcing explicitly that one of his enemies would betray him to his enemies, Jesus indicated Judas as the traitor by dipping a piece of the unleavened bread of the passover into the sauce made of fruits and vinegar and giving it to Judas.

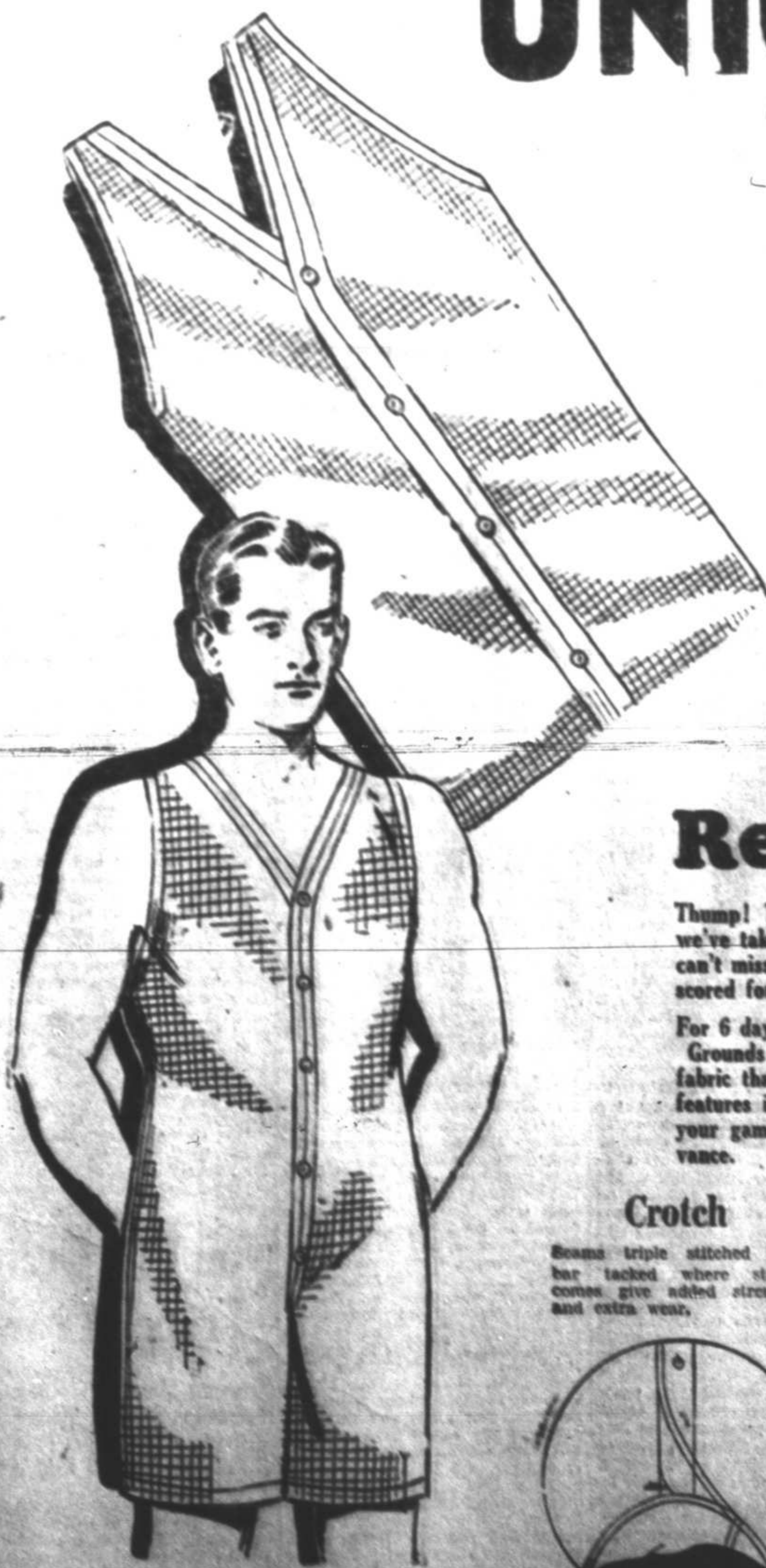

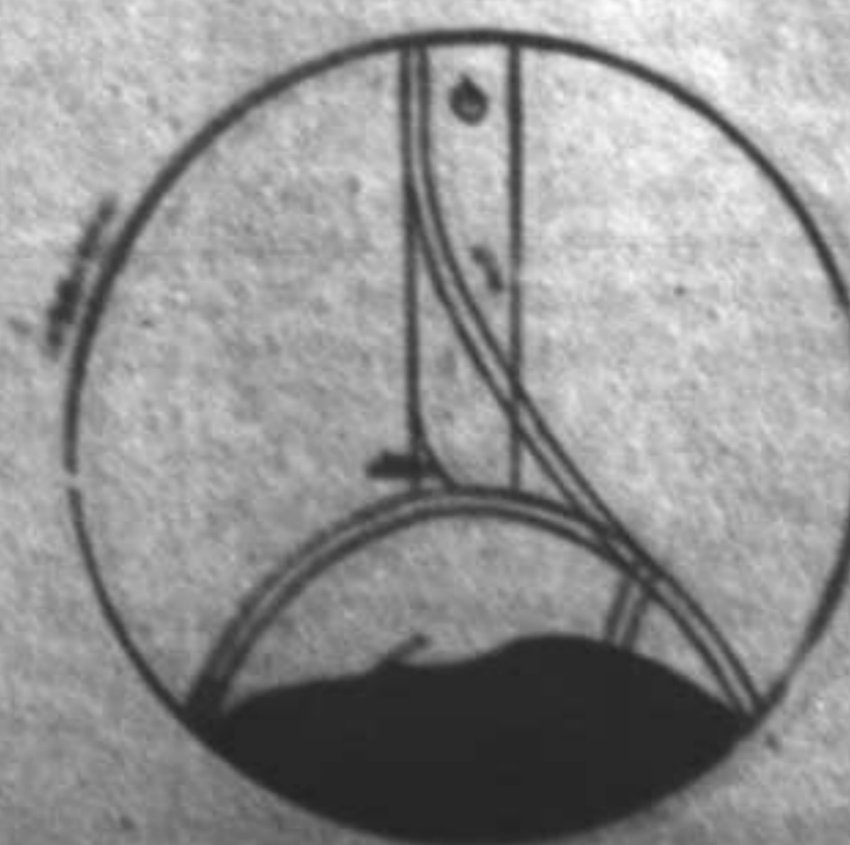

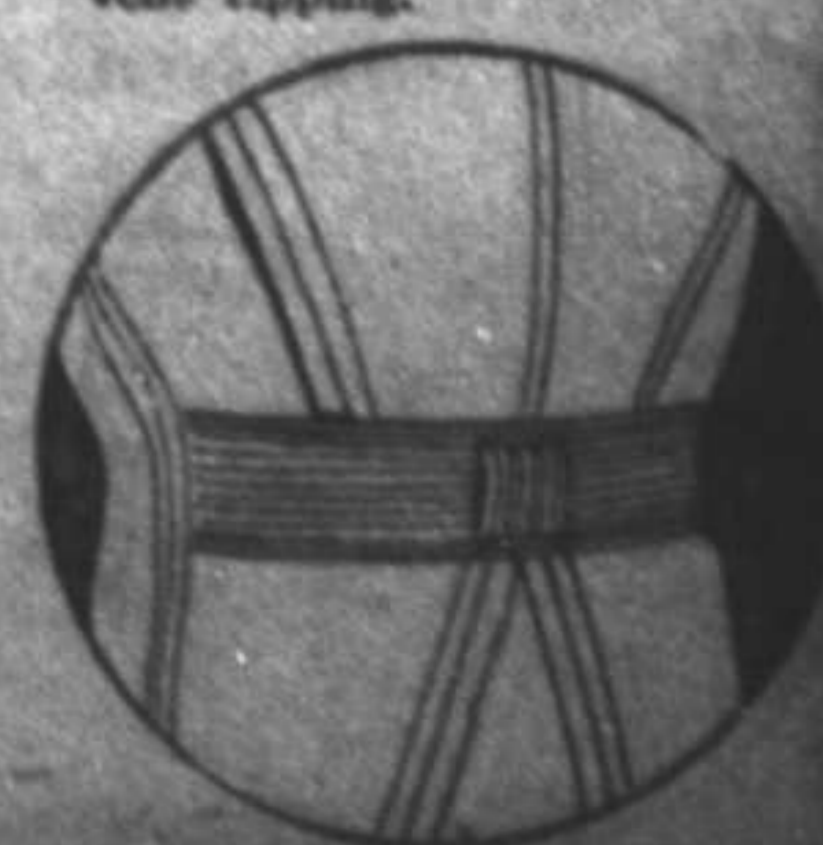

Hits the Bullseye of Value

Ford Declares U. S. Business Is On Uptrend

Present Trend Setting Faster Pace Than Slump Few Months Ago, According to Statement of Auto Head

PHILADELPHIA, June 6. (AP)—The Philadelphia Inquirer today quotes Henry Ford as saying that American business is on the upswing and that the trend upward setting a faster pace than did a slump a few months ago. Mr. and Mrs. Ford came to Philadelphia yesterday from Washington, where they had been ever-guests of President and Mrs. Hoover. They were guests at a dinner given by E. T. Spotsbury at his mansion, "Whitemarsh Hall," last night and spent the night at the home of Cyrus H. K. Curtis, Philadelphia publisher.

The Inquirer quotes Ford as saying: "You see, the automobile manufacturer, a lot of these fellows were fooling around with the stock market, and they got caught—badly caught. They had to work again. Now, they've been working, and they're beginning to enjoy it. That is always the reason for good business. In itself, it means there are more people busily engaged in working hard and productively than there are idling. And it also means they are enjoying it."

Red River Is At High Peak

Worst Of Flood Situation Is Thought To Have Passed In Louisiana; Relief Expected Within Few Days

ALEXANDRIA, La., June 6.—Barring heavy rains and the remote possibility of substantially higher water, the worst of the Red river flood situation today seemed to have been weathered, with relief from a falling river looked for within the next few days.

Announcement was made by the United States weather bureau at New Orleans that the Red river at Alexandria had reached substantially the apex of its flood with a mark of 41.2 feet.

From the lines of levee workers came the encouraging news that dikes reported weak were holding satisfactorily.

The levee at Saline Bayou, on Bayou Rapides, which broke yesterday, was believed effectually closed with the crevasse under control. News from Barbin's Landing, in Avoyelles parish was that the weak spot there was holding, and would continue to hold unless heavy rains should set in and the river should rise considerably.

A slight rise of one tenth of a foot had been recorded at Barbin's Landing.

GOLF PRO DIES
SAN ANTONIO, June 6. (AP)—J. Cliff Kupper, golfing professional at the Hillcrest Country club, died at a hospital today shortly after he had been found unconscious and bleeding in his wrecked automobile eight miles northwest of town. Officers believe he lost control of his car on a curve.

BELTON, June 6. (AP)—Earle B. Mayfield last night gave Bell County residents their first opportunity to "war up" to the present gubernatorial race.

Mayfield said that from his "wishy-washy way Moody" has been making up his mind, he isn't possibly decide by July 26 whether to run.

Indian Loses His Chance of Liberty

OKLAHOMA CITY, June 6. (AP)—Frank Ware, 24-year-old Osage Indian, the first man convicted for murder in Oklahoma in connection with a motor car accident, resulting from driving while drunk, today lost his fight to escape a life sentence in the state prison.

The criminal court of appeals, having affirmed his sentence two months ago, had denied Ware a rehearing. Ware was convicted in Kay county for the death October 1928 of Carl Snodgrass, riding a motorcycle along the Kaw City-Ponca City highway about midnight. Snodgrass was run down by Ware who said he had borrowed the car and bought a quart of whiskey before leaving Pawhuska for a drive with a man and women friends.

Girl Certain that Pruitt Was Slayer

DALLAS, June 6. (AP)—Miss Mildred Drennan, the young woman who accompanied William Mann on the night he was killed, is still certain that William "Dagger" Pruitt was the slayer, her mother said today.

"There is no doubt in her mind," her mother said, "Mildred and William Mann were driving that night and had stopped to wait for a signal to change when Pruitt jumped on the car. They were under a bright light and Mildred thought it was some friend of William's. Naturally she looked at him closely to see if she recognized him."

"Mildred delayed her identification until Pruitt was dressed and she could see him just as she had seen him as he jumped on the running board."

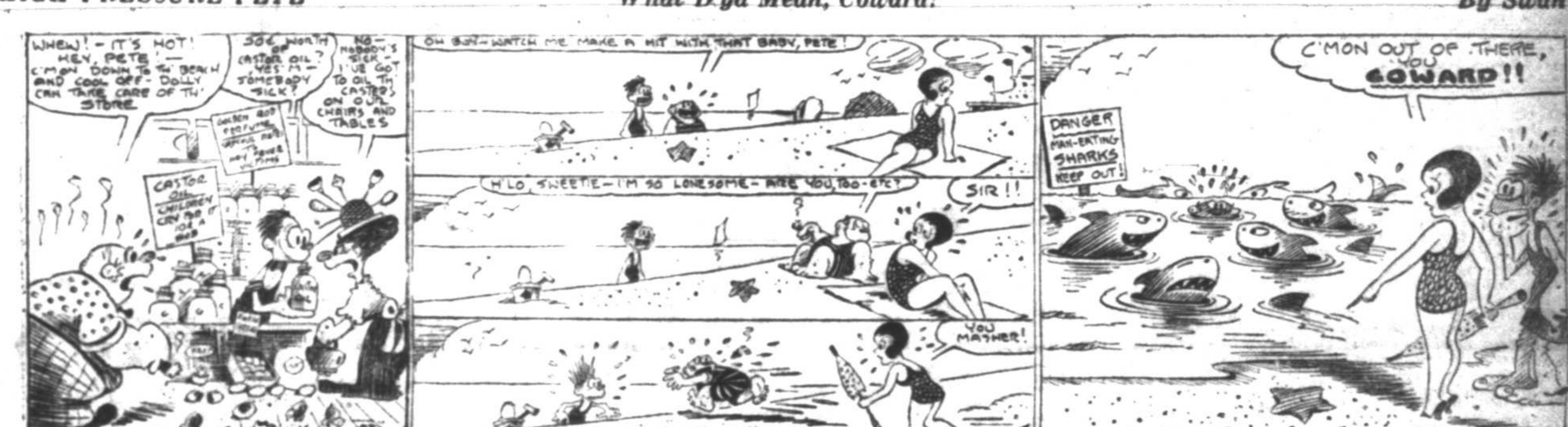

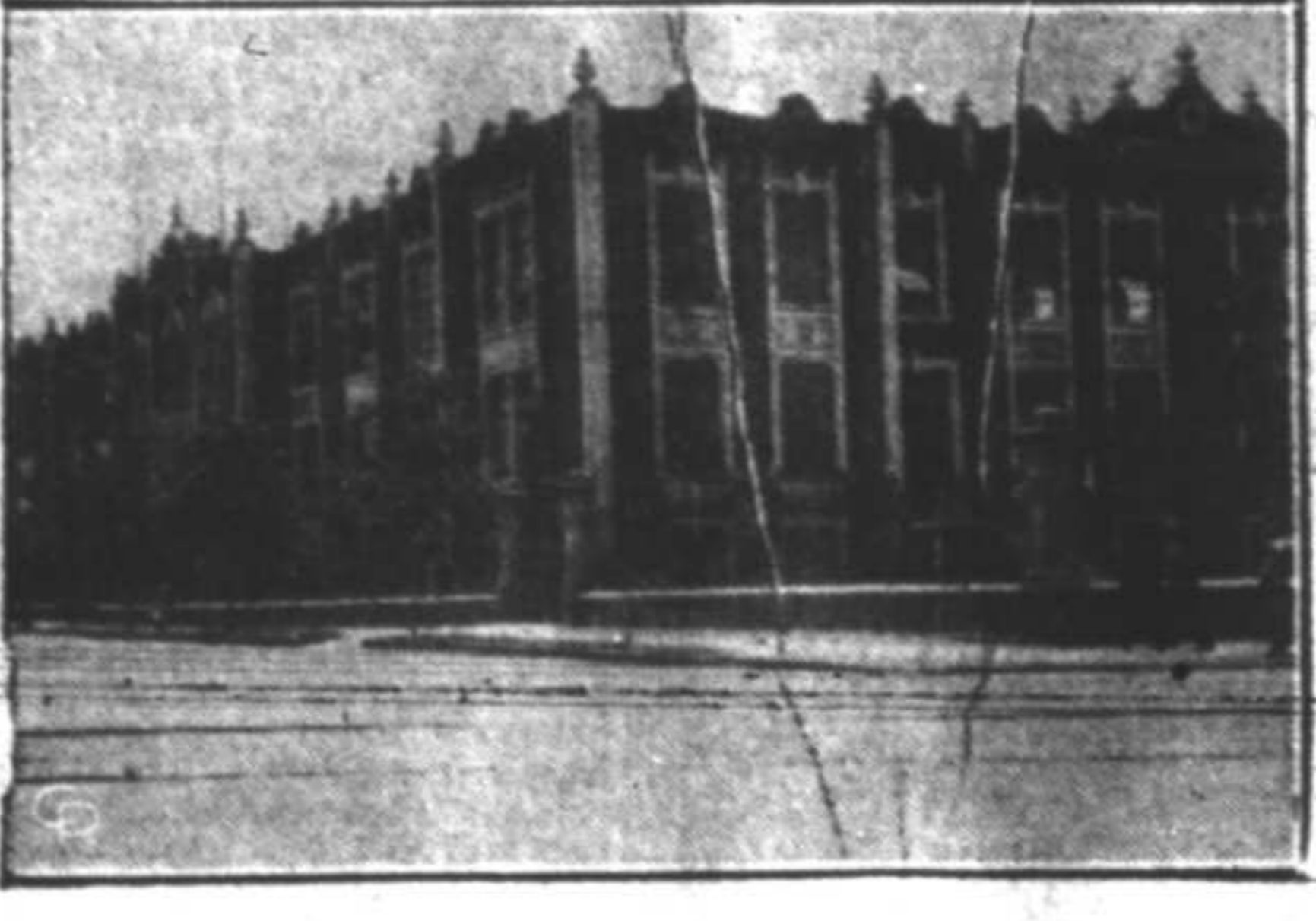
