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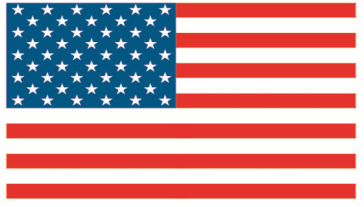

# Healing America's Heroes offers outdoor therapy programs for veterans

Many veterans deal with pain and suffering caused by Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, also known as PTSD, on a daily basis. Now, a non-profit is offering therapy and counseling for veterans suffering from PTSD in an outdoor setting, including horseback riding and fly fishing.

"The therapy that we do is horses and fishing and outdoors," said Robert Crain of Big Spring. Crain's father, Vietnam veteran Eddie Crain, is president of the New Mexico-based non-profit organization Healing America's Heroes. "It's a five-day program. You get a horse assigned to you at the beginning of the week, and then that's your horse for the rest of the week. Some people go in there and they'll be talking to their horses. These horses are gentle. They sit there and just brush the tail or brush the mane or rub them down.

Some people want to go on a trail ride."

Crain said the camp is located at Lincoln Pines, which is actually a refurbished youth correctional facility near Fort Stanton, N.M.

"Fort Stanton is right outside of Ruidoso, Capitan, Lincoln...it's all in that area. Southeast New Mexico," Crain said.

The organization's goal is to help heal combat veterans and active duty service members who suffer from PTSD, Military Sexual Trauma, and Traumatic Brain Injury, and to reduce the suicide rate of veterans and service members. The program is staffed by experienced horsemen and fly fishermen, a fly-tying expert, and life skills counselors and therapists. The services are provided free of charge to eligible applicants.

What do horses and fishing have to do with trauma suffered in combat?

Horses are an integral part of the therapy offered by Healing America's Heroes, a New Mexico-based therapy program for veterans suffering from PTSD and other trauma-related issues.

"Through the interaction with horses, the veterans experience a calming of their mind and body," according to promotional material provided by the organization. "They also develop a close and harmonious relationship with another living being. They often find it easy to talk with

# Gonzales, Woellert, compete in State Speech and Debate events

The duo competed at the UIL Academic State meet held recently on the campus of the University of Texas.

Gonzalez placed third in Persuasive Extemporaneous Speaking.

"Considering how I have been doing all year in extemp, I'm excited to be bringing home the bronze," Gonzalez stated.

The BSHS Senior also qualified for the Speech and Debate State Meet in Lincoln-Douglas Debate for a second year.

"I was fifth at state last year," Gonzalez said, "And I was hoping to place higher this year, but my only loss was to the eventual state champion, so..."

Earlier in the semester, Gonzalez also qualified for the UIL State Congressional Debate Tournament.

Also receiving accolades at the Speech and Debate State Meet was Woellert, who placed sixth in Informative Extemporaneous Speaking.

"I was hoping for a better result," Woellert stated "But at the end of the day, there are a lot of people that can't ever say that they were in finals at the State meet."

Woellert had success earlier in the semester, placing in the Top 10 at the UIL Cross-Examination State meet with his partner, Harper Duran; as well as

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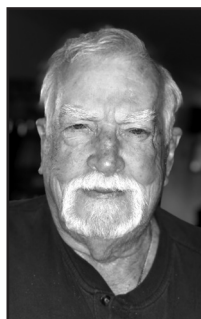

their horse while grooming, hand grazing or just walking or riding around together. Walking/riding around in the natural environment encourages the release of trauma that's been stored in the body. These experiences transfer over to their everyday life, help re-establish relationships, control anger through self-calming, and restore confidence.”

The fishing activities are a big part of the program as well.

“Fly fishing teaches focus, patience and perseverance,” Healing America's Heroes material says. “Being in nature on the water allows the client to experience calmness and peace of mind. Fly fishing, healing the whole person, one cast at a time. Fly-tying is a well-developed art of making an intricate fly with feathers and hair of fascinating colors and textures. It requires concentration and mindfulness, paying attention to details, and coordination of the mind and body (hands) to produce a beautiful fly that gives the fly-tier a sense of accomplishment. Tying flies is like a meditation and these skills carry over into other aspects of their life.

making the finals in Congressional Debate in January.

The placings, along with those earned earlier in the semester marks the 27th State finalist in Speech and Debate in the 22 years for students under the mentorship of coaches Jennifer and Clint Adams.

“In today’s society, with so many other things for students to do, it takes dedication to be successful” Adams stated “We are blessed to have dedicated students.”

While the two seniors have graduated, the duo’s speech and debate career is far from over as they both qualified for the National Speech and Debate As-

Gloria Gutierrez, past secretary of Women Veterans of New Mexico, said she's a United States Air Force veteran and has gone through Crain's program.

“As a woman veteran, I found that Mr. Eddie Crain and his organization, HAH, have treated women with respect and understanding. I attended a one-week session in September 2019 and can say that it was enlightening and more important, it helped me begin to change and be willing to try things I was unfamiliar with or afraid of,” Gutierrez said in a testimonial letter on the Healing Americas Heroes website.

Gutierrez goes on to say that she initially felt uncomfortable with the horse therapy due to her fear of heights.

“Eventually I was able to feel comfortable on the horse while being led and holding on to the pomel with one hand,” she wrote in the testimonial. “Ultimately, it gave me the opportunity to think about what I can accomplish if I decide I can.”

Gutierrez said her fears returned when, a year after her program experience, Crain asked her to represent Healing America's Heroes by riding on horseback in the New Mexico State Fair Parade.

“Fear immediately popped into my mind! I explained that I didn't think I could because I hadn't

gotten on a horse since I had been to the program the year before (I was still thinking about how high I would be on that horse),” she wrote. “Well, a few days later, Mr. Crain called again and asked me to reconsider. He explained that he would walk leading the horse and all I had to do was sit. It was still a very scary scenario, riding on a horse, lots of people watching and lots of noise that could spook the horse!”

Gutierrez said she decided to try, and discovered that after five minutes, she relaxed and enjoyed the whole experience.

“Mr. Crain's confidence in me helped immensely and in return, I was glad that I could help support and encourage women veterans to participate in the HAH program,” she said.

sociation National Tournament to be held in Louisville, Kentucky.

Debate is the UIL’s longest-running contest, dating back to 1910. A small group of debate coaches met in Abilene and enthusiastically began an interscholastic forensic program to motivate their students and provide them with a practical application for the skills they were developing. It was then that UIL was born. Ten teams representing ten divisions of the state competed in the first state tournament. Over one hundred years later, the UIL Speech and Debate State Meet is celebrated as the largest high school Speech & Debate tournament in the nation.

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# McCormick late HR, Astros bullpen crisp in 3-1 win over A's

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — Chas McCormick hit a tiebreaking home run off Frankie Montas to begin the eighth inning and the Houston Astros got a scoreless effort from their bullpen, beating the Oakland Athletics 3-1 on Tuesday night.

The A's have lost 12 of 17 to fall 12 games under .500 for the first time since finishing the 2017 season at 75-87.

McCormick was in a 2 for 23 funk but snapped out of it with his second three-hit game of the season. He also had an RBI single in the fifth.

"I faced him a couple times last year so I kind of knew what his ball does," said McCormick, who was 3 for 6 lifetime against Montas before his big night. "I felt pretty comfortable. I just missed a couple pitches before then I kind of made an adjustment. Wanted to be a little shorter to the ball and then he threw me a fastball and I put a good swing on it."

That was enough on a night when five Houston relievers combined for five scoreless innings of four-hit ball after starter Cristian Javier departed after throwing 85 pitches in four innings.

Phil Maton, Ryne Stanek, Rafael Montero (3-0) and Héctor Neris retired three batters each. Ryan Pressly pitched the ninth for his ninth save.

ERA, the Astros entered the night with a 2.48 bullpen ERA, lowest in the majors.

Houston had a deep bullpen after Framber Valdez pitched a two-hitter in the series opener Monday.

"They have to be fresh, that's the secret," Astros manager Dusty Baker said. "A fresh arm is a good arm. Last night, Framber put us in a position to have a fresh bullpen today."

After McCormick hit a 2-2 pitch from Montas to deep center to put Houston ahead 2-1, the Astros drew four consecutive walks off Zach Jackson to force in another run.

Montas (2-5) struck out five in seven innings but remained winless since April 18. He allowed seven hits and two runs.

The A's have scored one run or fewer in six of Montas' last eight starts.

"We're still continuing to identify how we're going to score runs," A's manager Mark Kotsay said.

Javier gave up four hits in four innings in his sixth start, allowing Cristian Pache's RBI single.

WHAT'S THE COUNT

Umpires were forced to call for a replay review on the count in the first inning following the fourth pitch to Houston No. 2 hitter Michael Brantley. Confusion apparently arose around the second pitch of the game, a 96 mph sinker on the outside which home plate umpire Manny González called a ball before using his right hand to slightly adjust his facemask, which some mistook for a strike call. When the count got to 3-1, A's manager Mark Kotsay came out and questioned González. After a brief conversation with crew chief CB Bucknor, the New York replay center was notified and the 3-1 count was confirmed.

Astros: Jose Altuve went 0 for 3 with a walk after coming out of Monday's game following a collision with Oakland 1B Christian Bethancourt.

Athletics: 3B Kevin Smith was held out with a knee contusion.

UP NEXT

# Pérez keeps rolling after liner off leg, Rangers beat Rays

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — Martín Pérez made up his mind pretty quickly that he wasn't coming out of the game after taking a 97 mph liner off his right shin.

The Texas left-hander didn't want to interrupt the best stretch of his career. Pérez retired all 16 batters after shaking off the shot to his shin, lowering his majors-leading ERA with seven scoreless innings in the Rangers' 3-0 victory over the Tampa Bay Rays on Tuesday night.

"That ball put me on a different level with these guys, and I said, 'I've got to do this,'" Perez said. "It's my time. It's time to show up and do it for the guys."

Corey Seager homered for Texas' first hit in the fourth inning, with Adolis García adding a two-run shot two batters later as the Rangers won for the first sixth time in seven games and reached .500 (24-24) for the first time this season.

Pérez needed a few minutes to recover after Taylor Walls' scorching infield single in the second. He stayed in, got Vidal Bruján to fly out on the next pitch with two runners on and pitched five perfect innings from there.

John King pitched a perfect eighth inning, and Joe Barlow did the same in the ninth for his ninth save as the Rangers retired the final 22 batters.

The 31-year-old Pérez is in his second stint with the team that signed him as a teenager out of Venezuela. He extended the longest active streak in the majors without allowing a homer to 66 1/3 innings.

Garrett Richards got up in the Texas bullpen after Pérez was struck, and Pérez went down the tunnel at the end of the inning. He told the training staff he was fine. Manager Chris Woodward had already gotten that drift.

"As soon as he pulled his pants up to check his shin, he's like, 'OK, that set me off. They woke me up,'" Woodward said. "I was like, 'Oh, boy. Watch out.'"

With his eighth consecutive start allowing no more than one earned run, Pérez dropped his ERA to 1.42. He has allowed a total of four earned runs over 55 1/3 innings since giving up three in each of his first two starts, both of his losses.

"He just knows how to read swings and read how people are doing," Seager said. "His control has just been impressive. I don't how you explain it. It's really fun to be behind and really fun to watch."

Pérez (4-2) struck out five with no walks in his first start against the Rays since they homered off him three times when he was with Boston last season in a 7-3 Tampa Bay win.

Randy Arozarena, Yandy Díaz and Mike Zunino went deep in that game last

July in Florida. Those three managed just a single from Díaz in eight at-bats against Pérez, and Zunino had two of his three strikeouts.

"He had a lot of late life, a lot of late action in the zone," Rays manager Kevin Cash said. "Add the fact that he was pitching to the edges it felt like all night with every batter, you're going to have a quiet offensive night."

Ryan Yarbrough (0-2) gave up six hits and three runs in 6 2/3 innings. He hit Josh Smith with a pitch twice a day after Smith had three hits in his major league debut.

WHAT A MAY

The Rangers had their winning first winning month since June 2019, finishing May at 17-10. Pérez finished the month with a 0.64 ERA, the best in any month for any American League pitcher with at least 40 innings thrown since Minnesota's Johan Santana finished at 0.45 in September 2004. It was the second-best ERA in any month for a Texas pitcher (Yovani Gallardo, 0.54, June 2015).

TRAINER'S ROOM

Rays: SS Wander Franco was placed on the 10-day injured list with a right quadriceps strain. Franco aggravated the injury running the bases in the ninth inning of Monday's 9-5 loss in the series opener. The right quad has been bothering the 21-year-old Franco for a couple of weeks. He's now sidelined along with second baseman Brandon Lowe, who has lower back tightness.

Rangers: Former closer José Leclerc, who hasn't pitched in the majors since the first week of the shortened 2020 season in July of that year because of shoulder and elbow surgeries, is moving to Triple-A Round Rock to continue a rehab assignment. The right-hander is eligible to come off the 60-day IL on Monday.

UP NEXT

Rays: LHP Jeffrey Springs (2-2, 1.62 ERA), who made his big league debut with the Rangers in 2018 and made 43 appearances for them over his first two seasons, is coming off the longest outing of his career. Springs pitched six innings in a 2-0 loss to the Yankees, allowing both runs on solo homers.

Rangers: Opening day starter Jon Gray (1-2, 5.56) is set for his eighth start in his first season with Texas. Tampa Bay is one of six teams the right-hander has never faced. His only win came in his only other start at home, 7-4 over the Los Angeles Angels on May 16 when he gave up four runs in 5 2/3 innings.

# Arizona State to face Texas in NCAA championship match

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. (AP) — Texas' current seniors lost the 2019 NCAA title after predictions of severe weather pushed up the championship match tee times to just after dawn.

The Longhorns are back in the title match, and this time they don't have to worry about tornadoes. This year's tournament is in the desert, not Arkansas.

Texas beat Vanderbilt 3 1/2-1 1/2 on Tuesday to earn a spot in the championship match against Arizona State, giving its seniors a second shot at winning a national title.

Pierceson Coody and Travis Vick closed out their matches seconds apart at Grayhawk Golf Club, sending the Longhorns to the championship match for the third time in six years. Arizona State beat reigning national champion Pepperdine 4-1 when Preston Summerhays birdied the 18th hole to close out his match 2 up.

"It's debatable whether weather decided the 2019 national championship," Texas coach John Fields said. "Whether it did or didn't doesn't matter because we've got a chance to play. This is what these guys dream of. This is where they want to be."

It's been a long wait.

Texas lost the 2019 title match to Stanford in Fayetteville, Arkansas, where tee times were moved up to avoid potential tornadoes in the afternoon. The 2020 tournament was wiped out due to the pandemic and the Longhorns never seemed to find their footing in 2021.

Led by seniors Cole Hammer and twins Pierceson and Parker Moody, Texas was one of the nation's best teams all season, but felt pressure along the way — from regionals to top 15 and top eight at the NCAA championships.

Reaching the quarterfinals seemed to take away some of that weight.

Texas beat Oklahoma State 3-2 in the quarterfinals and had four close matches against Vander-

bilt heading to the back nine at Grayhawk's Raptor Course.

Cole Hammer beat Vandy freshman Gordon Sargent, who won the NCAA individual title on Monday, 4 and 3 to give Texas the first point in the second semifinal.

Vandy's William Moll then closed out his match 1 up with a bogey on No. 18 when Parker Coody couldn't get up and down from a greenside bunker.

Vick opened with birdies to win the first two holes against Reid Davenport and was 3 up after a birdie on the par-4 12th. He finished off the match 4 and 3 with a birdie on the par-4 15th.

Coody took a 2 up lead on Cole Sherwood with a birdie on the par-4 14th and won 4 and 3 with a par on the short par-3 16th.

"What I've noticed is they've freed up, they're enjoying what they're doing here," Fields said. "I'm particularly proud of the fact that they worked so hard to get here, but at the same time they're enjoying it."

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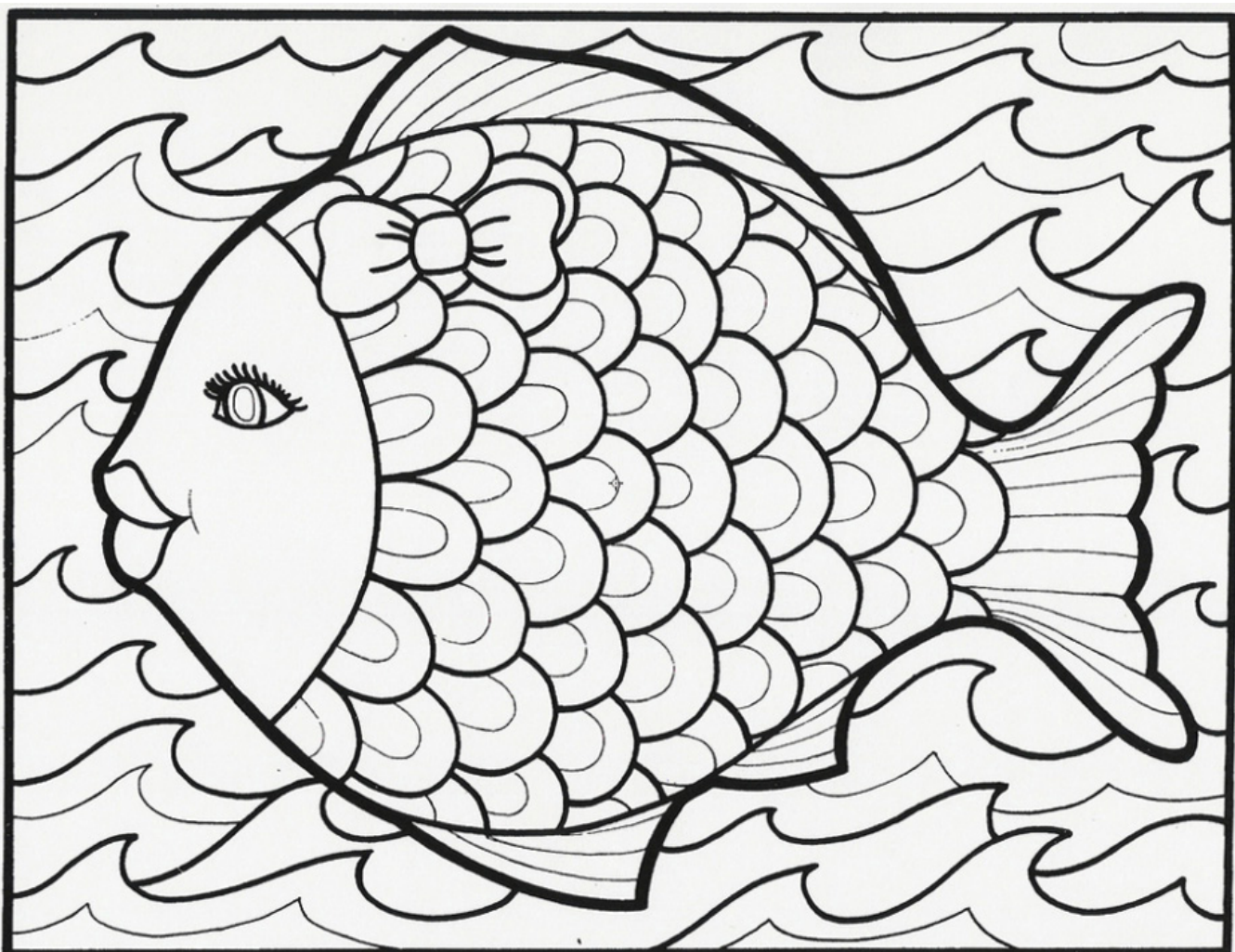
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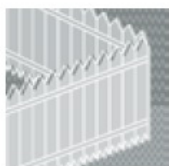

In 1961, playwright and director George S. Kaufman, 71, died in New York.

In 1962, Soviet forces opened fire on striking workers in the Russian city of Novocherkassk; a retired general in 1989 put the death toll at 22 to 24.

In 1966, U.S. space probe Surveyor 1 landed on the moon and began transmitting detailed photographs of the lunar surface.

In 1979, Pope John Paul II arrived in his native Poland on the

In 1999, South Africans went to the polls in their second post-apartheid election, giving the African National Congress a decisive victory; retiring president Nelson Mandela was succeeded by Thabo Mbeki (TAH'-boh um-BEH'-kee).

In 2011, a judge in Placerville, California, sentenced serial sex offender Phillip Garrido to life in prison for kidnapping and raping Jaycee Dugard; Garrido's wife, Nancy, received a decades-long sentence.

In 2016, autopsy results showed superstar musician Prince died of an accidental overdose of fentanyl, a powerful opioid painkiller.

In 2020, defying curfews, protesters streamed back into the nation's streets, hours after President Donald Trump urged governors to put down the violence set off by the death of George Floyd. sentenced to life in prison after a court convicted him on charges of complicity in the killing of protesters during the 2011 uprising that forced him from power (Mubarak was later acquitted and freed in March 2017; he died in February 2020). Richard Dawson, 79, a British-born entertainer who made his mark in the 1960s television sitcom “Hogan's Heroes” and later became a popular TV game show host, died in Los Angeles.

Five years ago: Environmental campaigners protested President Donald Trump's decision to pull the United States out of the Paris climate accord, while nations around the world pledged to double down on their efforts to curb global warming. Three former Penn State administrators were handed jail and house-arrest sentences ranging up to nearly two years for burying child sexual abuse allegations against Jerry Sandusky.

One year ago: Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's opponents announced that they had reached a deal to form a new governing coalition, paving the way for the ouster of the longtime Israeli leader. The NFL pledged to stop the use of “race-norming” in a \$1 billion settlement of brain injury claims; the practice had made it harder for Black players to show a deficit and qualify for an award. Trainer Bob Baffert was suspended for two years by the Churchill Downs racetrack in Louisville, Kentucky, after an additional drug test of Kentucky Derby winner Medina Spirit confirmed the presence of a steroid. (Medina Spirit was later disqualified from his Derby victory; the colt collapsed and died in December 2021 following a training run at Santa Anita.) Duke University basketball coach Mike Krzyzewski (shuh-SHEF'-skee) announced that the next season would be his last with the Blue Devils.
